Memphis Jan'y 26 1867

Kind Sir;

We have some
Flour & Flour on board the steamer "Mary
E. Horsyth" from St Louis, which boat,
we are informed, passed the Bend on Thurs-
day last, offering to deliver the freight at
both Bank & Ursino Landings, but finding
no one at either place prepared to receive it
she carried it by and probably to
New Orleans. The river is quite low &
not safely navigable for any large boats.
You will confer a favor by telegraphing
to Messrs Payne Huntington & Co, immediately to have
the same boat ("Mary E. Horsyth") to bring the
freight up and deliver it at Ursino Landing,
Wood's Plantation, where arrangements will be
made for its reception.

We hope you can get the telegraph to operate for
you on Sunday as our ignorance of the condi-
tion of the freight prevented us from sending

earlier.
