Camp Mead Near Richmond Sept 18th 1862

Dear Margery

I Recd your letter yesterday
By James Duncan which gave me grate
Satisfaction to hear from home and to hear from
you and the Children. I have got now few letters
from home since I have been here that it is
a Considerable treat to me to get one and
Much More to hear from you and the Children
we are all tolerable well at this time
and I think my health is Considerable better
I have been trying to get a furlough to come
home but have not as yet been able to
get one it is a very hard matter to get a furlough
but I think times will change and there will
be a better chance after a while I think
I will be able to get off some time this fall
I have nothing of any importance to write to you
I will send you some money if I can't get off
soon the first chance I can get I want you to
have the same socks and one pair pants and
that will be as much clothes as I will want
The boy will want about the same the
Children all for me and accept the best love
of your husband
