Camp near Goldsboro Nc July 13<sup>th</sup> 1863

Dear Margery

I embrace the present opportunity  
of Dropping you a few lines to let you know that  
we are all well at this time and hope these  
lines may find you and the children all  
well Isaac landed here this morning safe and  
sound. and James Sherman Elijah Swanks and  
George Brutton I am much obliged to you  
for the Pants and socks you sent me and  
to Mother for the Comfort sent by Isaac  
I was very glad to see her for I had feared that  
she had you off to some other Company but  
I am at a loss to know what to do with her  
for I am afraid that he will not be able  
to stand the Service and when a man quits  
the Army it is a very hard matter to get  
out again and more particular out of  
this Regt for Col Millers acts as Col and  
Sergt both and he had rather see a  
man die any time than see him dis-  
charged now I do not know what I will do  
with him but will do what ever I think  
best after I have had time to decide  
I am Expecting to start home in a  
few days if there is now fighting at the  
place but it is not certain yet that I will  
come but I will now in a few days and  
if I do not get off I will write again  
in a few days and will write them  
full I want to come very much and will  
if I can get off My love to all my  
friends and accept my best love for you
