Dr. Eunkyung Son, cello, is a Visiting Assistant Professor and Director of String Project at the University of Nebraska Kearney for the 2017-18 academic year. Son has served as faculty members at Music Academy at Central College, the Five Seasons Chamber Music Festival in Iowa, and Cello Summer Camp, Wesleyan University in Bloomington, IL. Son also taught at Illinois State University and the University of Iowa as Teaching Assistants, and Marion Music Academy as a Cello Instructor. Son is a found member and director of the Music Sharing Project since 2016.

She has performed recitals, chamber concerts, and orchestra concerts in Korea, Japan, and the United States including Illinois, Kentucky, New-York (Carnegie Hall), Minnesota, Ohio, Wisconsin, Indiana, and Iowa.

Son holds Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) in Cello Performance and Pedagogy and Orchestral Conducting (secondary area) at the University of Iowa. She received MM from Illinois State University, and BM from Chung-Ang University in Korea.



Korean-Born pianist Minji Kwon is an insightful collaborator and solo musician. Minji was granted the Ambassadorial Scholarship from the Rotary Foundation to study in the US. She was the recipient of the Iowa Performance Fellowship while she worked on her Doctor of Musical Arts degree with Dr. Uriel Tsachor at the University of Iowa. As a winner of the University of Iowa Concerto Competition, she performed with UI Chamber Orchestra. Minji has appeared in numerous concert venues in Iowa, Chicago, New York, London, Prague, and Seoul.

Minji taught as an Adjunct Faculty member at New York University, where she earned her master's degree in Collaborative Piano. In New York, Minji actively performed in numerous venues such as Piano@ Poly series, Black Box Theatre, Provincetown Play House, Tenri Cultural Center, Columbia University, NYU Steinhardt at Saklad Concert Series, Music with a "Vue" Concert Series at Bellevue Hospital, The DiMenna Center, d Weill Recital Hall in Carnegie Hall.

Recent concert highlights include collaborate concerts with oboist Dr. Courtney Miller at the University of Iowa, as well as piano duo concerts with pianist Jimin Yun in the Chicago area. Currently, Minji serves as a staff pianist for the University of Iowa.
