
Accessing Complex Systems: An Introduction to Agent-Based Models

Agent-based and computational models can help us account for the complexity and dynamics of interactions among individuals. This seminar will include an introduction to agent-based models, explore some prominent examples, and provide a brief primer on how to approach these models.

Her research interests focus on American Political Institutions with a particular emphasis on the United States Judiciary.
