My dear Mr. Varney:

I note I am on the program to speak at your Conference on the night of the 17th. I am writing to ascertain whether the meeting will be held. I note that all public institutions have been closed and public assemblages called off in Kentucky. The epidemic of Influenza is very bad in Bowling Green -- the worst seige of sickness this community has ever had. We have had many deaths. More than two-thirds of our students have had it or have it now. It is going to be very difficult for me to get away, though I am hoping to do so, but it is extremely doubtful at this time. I am thinking it is more than likely the order calling off public meetings will not be withdrawn in time for you to hold your meeting. I am writing for further instruction and information as to your purpose. Unless the condition improves at this place, it will be utterly impossible for me to leave as we have a number of students who are desperately ill at this time and I must stay right on the hill, doing all I can. I am sure you understand the situation thoroughly. It may be, however, that everything will clear up before many days.

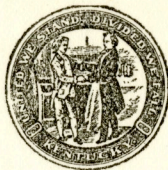
