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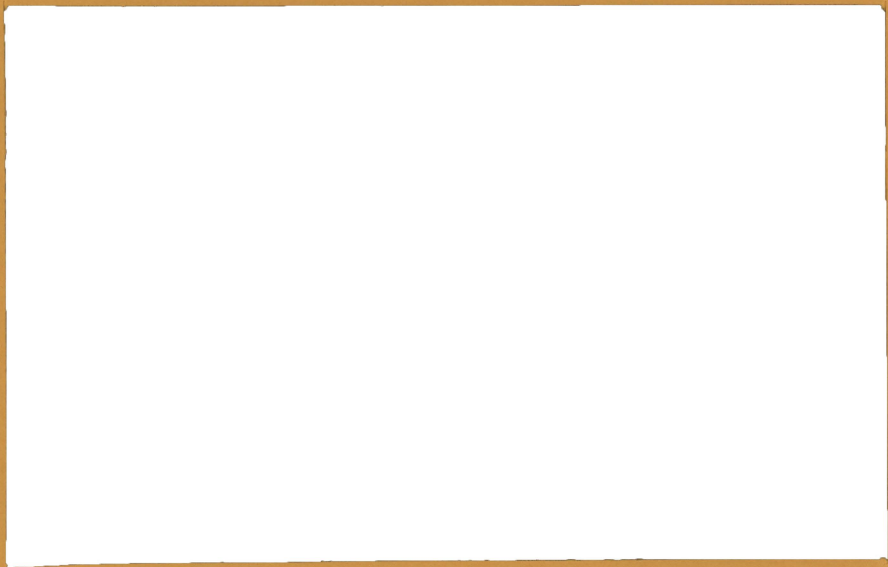

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### Missouri Farm Operators by Race

This table shows the change in number of farm operators for each Agriculture Census since racial information was first collected in 1900. The table shows a steady decline in the number of both white and black farm operators. Except for the Depression years, there has been a pattern of continuous decline. The 1978 census registered an increase in black farmers due to improved data collection techniques. Thus, the 1978 census is not strictly comparable to other censuses. In addition, before the 1978 census operators of Spanish origin were included as "white".

The general decline in the number of farm operators was much greater among black farmers than among white. Indeed, in 1974 there were 51 percent as many white farmers as there had been in 1950, or 115,314 compared to 226,813 in 1950. However, for black farmers there were only 8 percent as many as there had been in 1950, or 253 compared to 3,214 in 1950. The 1978 census showed a 5 percent increase for white farmers, and a 10 percent increase for black farmers. This greater increase for blacks may be due to their lower participation in the 1974 census. A field enumeration of the 1978



census found that 9 percent of minority farm operators had not been on the 1974 census mailing list. This contrasts with 5 percent of white farm operators.

Another increase between the 1974 and 1978 censuses is in the number of American Indian farmers. In 1974 there were 70 reported in Missouri, while in 1978 this number increased to 229 - a 227 percent increase. Again, part of this increase is due probably to low minority participation in 1974.

#### Operators--Tenure, Type of Organization, and Characteristics

An interesting aspect of this table is the item "percent of tenancy." This figure shows that tenancy is more prevalent among minority farmers than white. The table also shows that the percentage minority operators are of total operators is consistently greater than the percentage acreage under minority operation is of total acreage.

Minority farmers did not live on the farm they operated as often as did whites. Also, they reported more off-farm work than did whites. In fact, just 38 percent reported farming as their principal occupation, while 52 percent of white farmers reported farming as the principal occupation.

#### Operators by Type of Organization With Sales of \$2,500 or More

Minority-operated farms with sales of \$2,500 or more accounted for 73 percent of all minority-operated farms.

For white-operated farms, the comparable figure was 80 percent. Organization of these farms varied little by race. For example, 87 percent of white-operated farms were individual or family owned, and 88 percent of minority-operated farms were individual or family owned.

#### Summary by Tenure of Operator

White farmers are full owners in about two-thirds of the cases, while minority farmers are full owners in 57 percent of the cases. For both white- and minority-operated farms, those with full ownership have the highest chance of being small operations with sales of less than \$2,500; 25 percent of white owners and 39 percent of minority owners have such operations.

#### Summary by Age and Principal Occupation of Operator

Of those who reported farming as their principal occupation, minority farmers tended to be older than white farmers. In this category, about 51 percent of white farmers were age 55 or older, while 56 percent of minority farmers were in this age group. Of those farmers reporting primary occupations other than farming, minority farmers were largely clustered in the 25 to 34 age group. About one-third of minority farmers were in this group.

### Summary by Size of Farm

Minority farmers have smaller farms than do white farmers. Farms of less than 100 acres account for 54 percent of all minority-operated farms, but 36 percent of white-operated farms. The category which serves as a fulcrum for the table is that for farms of 100 to 139 acres. Farms of this size account for an equal percentage of both white- and minority-operated farms.

### Summary by Value of Agricultural Products Sold

Minority-operated farms have a lower value of products sold than do white-operated farms. Farms with sales of less than \$5,000 accounted for 58 percent of minority-operated farms, but 35 percent of white-operated farms. Conversely, farms with sales of \$100,000 or more accounted for 6 percent of white-operated farms, but 3 percent of minority-operated farms.

### Farms Operated by Black and Other Races
