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TRUMP DEADLOCKED WITH BUTTIGIEG, SANDERS & BIDEN IN NH ELECTION MATCHUPS

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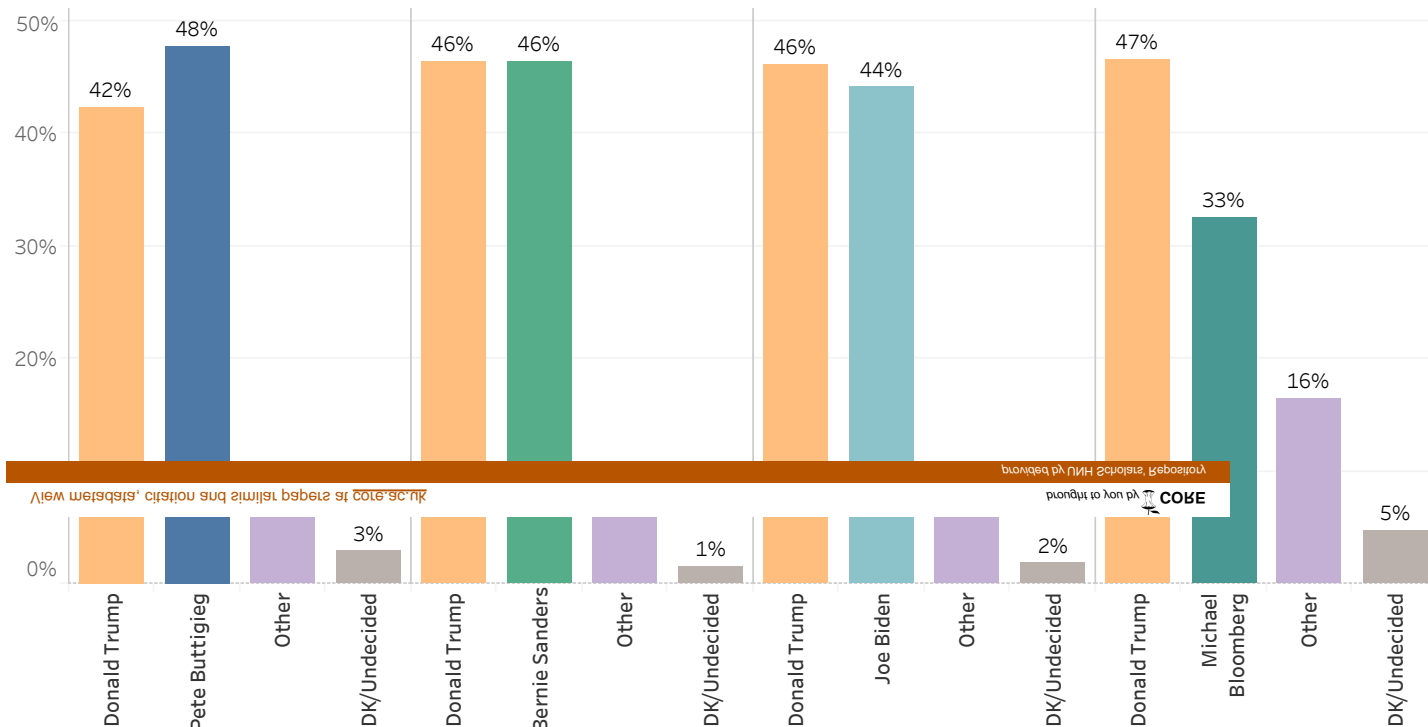
DURHAM, NH – Former South Bend (IN) Mayor Pete Buttigieg, Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders, and Former Vice President Joe Biden are all statistically tied with President Donald Trump in early matchups for the November election, while former New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg struggles in a matchup with Trump. President Trump enjoys the highest approval of any point of his presidency on his handling of the economy but his overall approval is largely unchanged since the same point last year.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred eleven (611) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between February 19 and February 25, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the sample were 576 likely general election voters (MSE +/- 4.1%).

General Election Matchups

Nine months before the November election for President, Donald Trump is statistically tied with three leading Democrats. In a hypothetical general election contest between Buttigieg and President Trump, 48% of Granite State likely voters support Buttigieg, 42% support Trump, 7% would vote for another candidate, and 3% don't know or are undecided. In a contest between Trump and Sanders, 46% support Trump, 46% support Sanders, 6% would vote for someone else, and 1% don't know or are unsure. In a contest between Trump and Biden, 46% would vote for Trump, 44% would vote for Biden, 8% would vote for someone else, and 2% don't know or are unsure. By contrast, Bloomberg struggles in a hypothetical matchup against President Trump. In such a matchup, 47% support Trump, 33% vote for Bloomberg, 16% would vote for another candidate, and 5% don't know or are unsure.

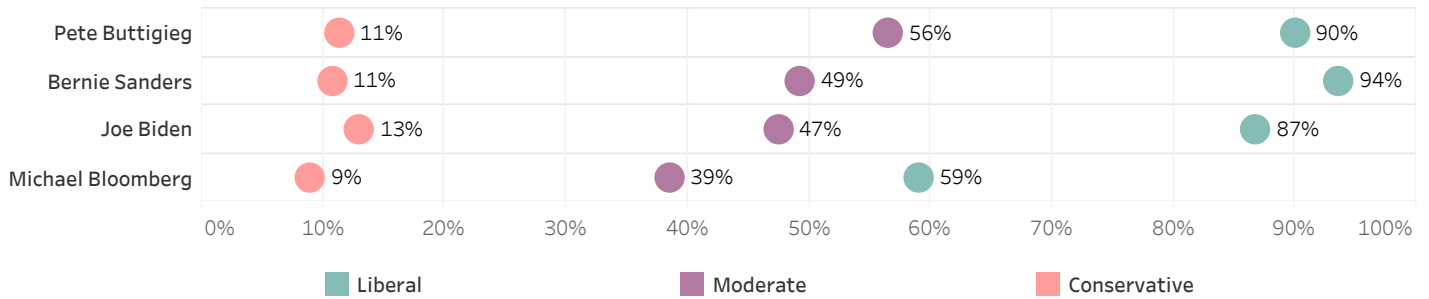
Trump vs. Potential Democratic Opponents

The vast majority of self-described liberals say they would vote for Sanders (94%), Buttigieg (90%), and Biden (87%) in a general election matchup with President Trump but only 59% of liberals say they would vote for Bloomberg in a matchup with Trump. Buttigieg (56%) garners the largest share of the vote among moderates in hypothetical matchups with Trump, while just under half of moderates say they would vote for Sanders (49%) or Biden (47%). Bloomberg (39%) trails his rivals among this group as well in a matchup against Trump, though by a far smaller margin than among liberals.

Potential Democratic Candidate Vote Share - By Ideology

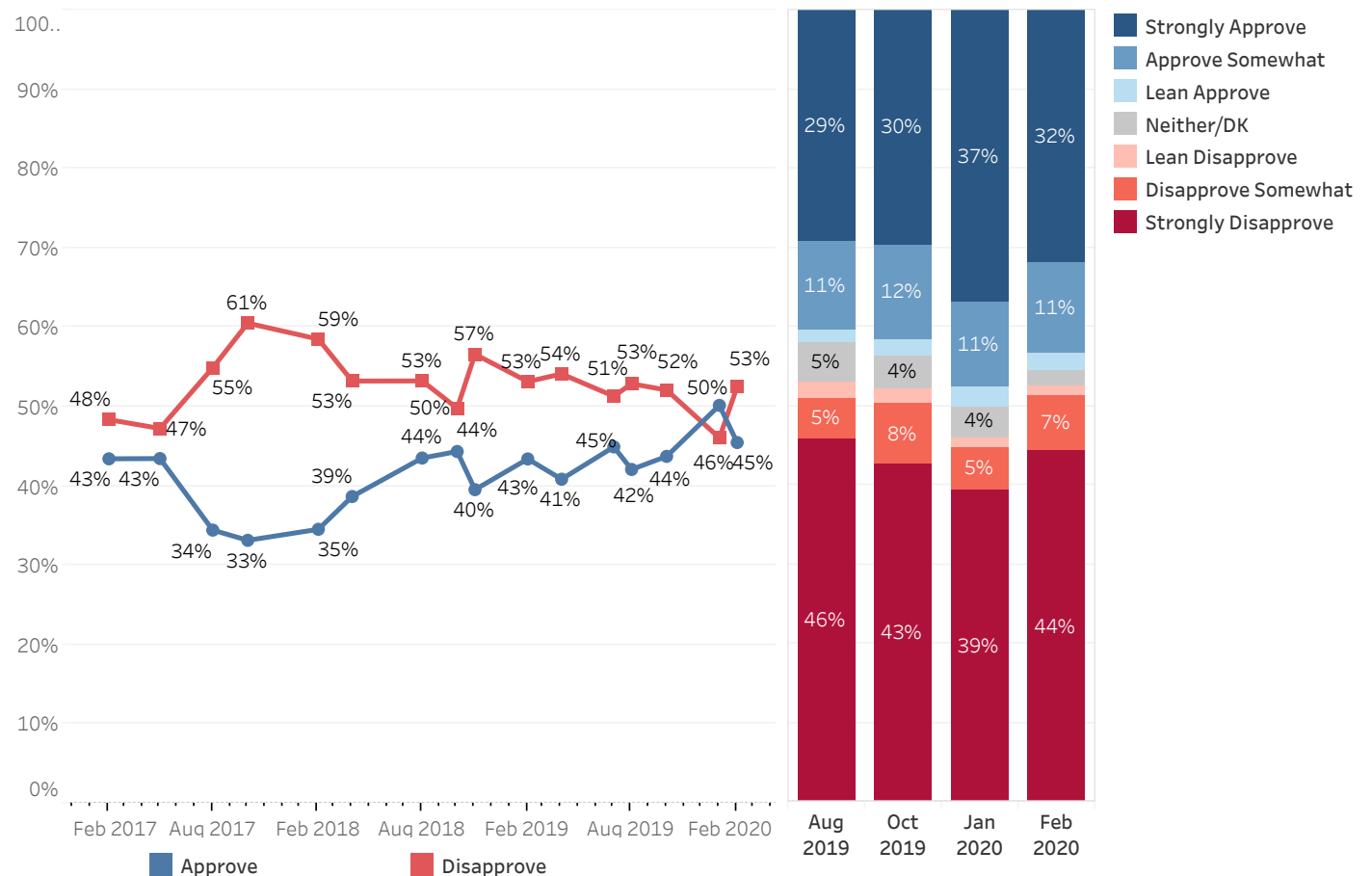


Presidential Approval

Forty-five percent of New Hampshire residents approve of Donald Trump's performance as President, 53% disapprove, and 2% don't know or are unsure. Trump's net approval rating among Granite Staters (-8%) has declined since January (+4%) but is largely unchanged compared to a year ago.

"Presidents are typically reelected when their approval rating at the time of the election is 46% or higher," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. "Trump's current approval rating is further evidence that New Hampshire is again a battleground state."

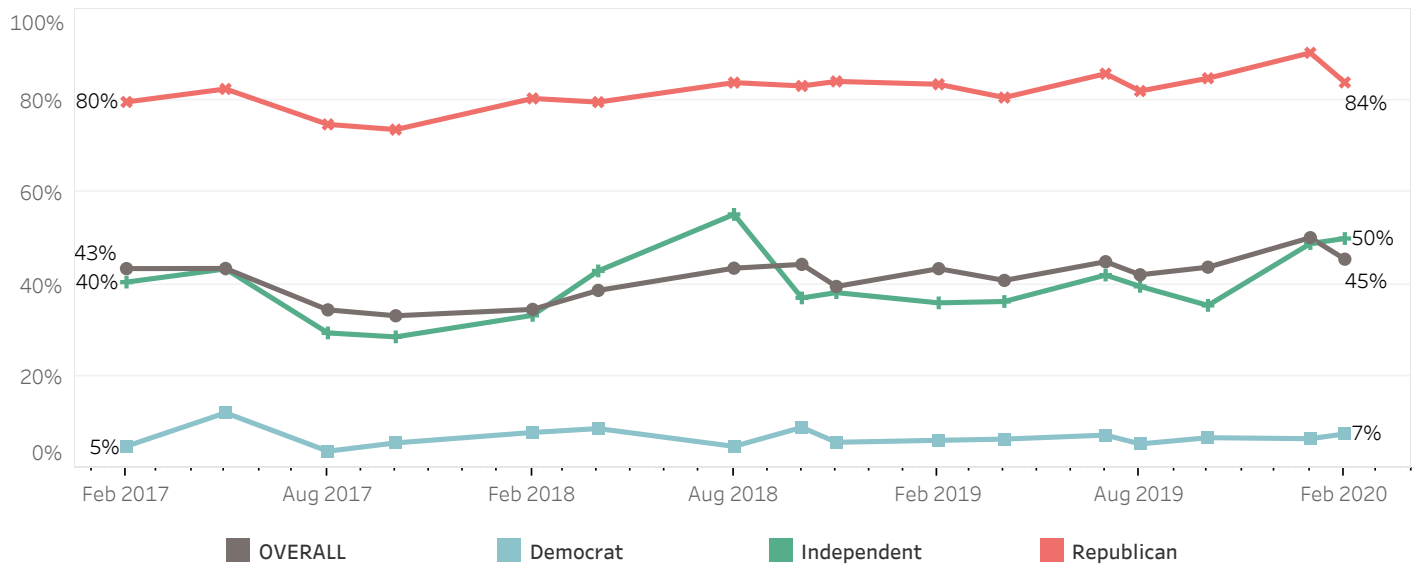
Presidential Approval - Donald Trump



Approval of President Trump remains closely tied to partisanship. Eighty-four percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, 50% of Independents approve, and just 7% of Democrats approve. Support for Trump among Republicans and Democrats is largely unchanged since August 2019, while support among Independents has increased markedly (35% in August 2019, 50% in February 2020).

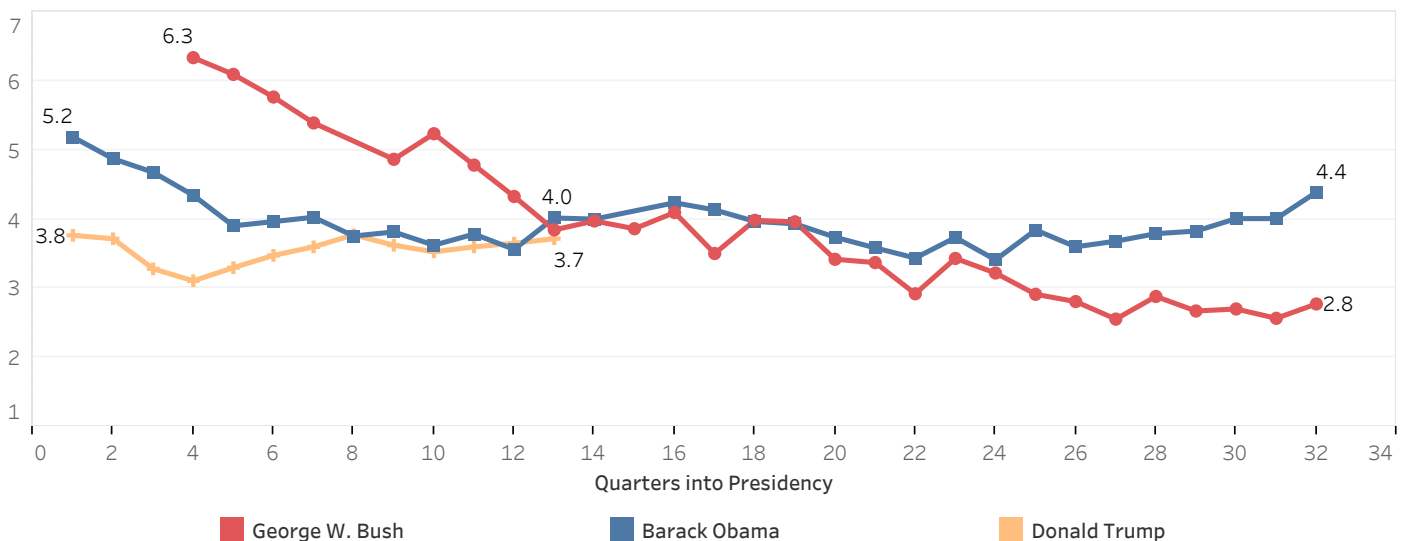
Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, those who attend religious services once a week or more often, gun owners, and *Union Leader* readers are most likely to approve of Trump's performance. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 or did not vote, self-described liberals, those who have completed postgraduate work, those who never attend religious services, NHPR listeners, and Connecticut Valley residents are least likely to approve of Trump's performance. Over the past year, approval of Trump's performance has increased most among self-identified Independents, those with one or more children in their household, and Seacoast residents, while approval has fallen most among North Country residents and those who never attend religious services.

On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's average approval rating (3.7) is unchanged since the previous quarter but is slightly lower than his predecessor, Barack Obama's (4.0), in the thirteenth quarter of his presidency and nearly matches that of George W. Bush (3.8) at that point in his presidency.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)

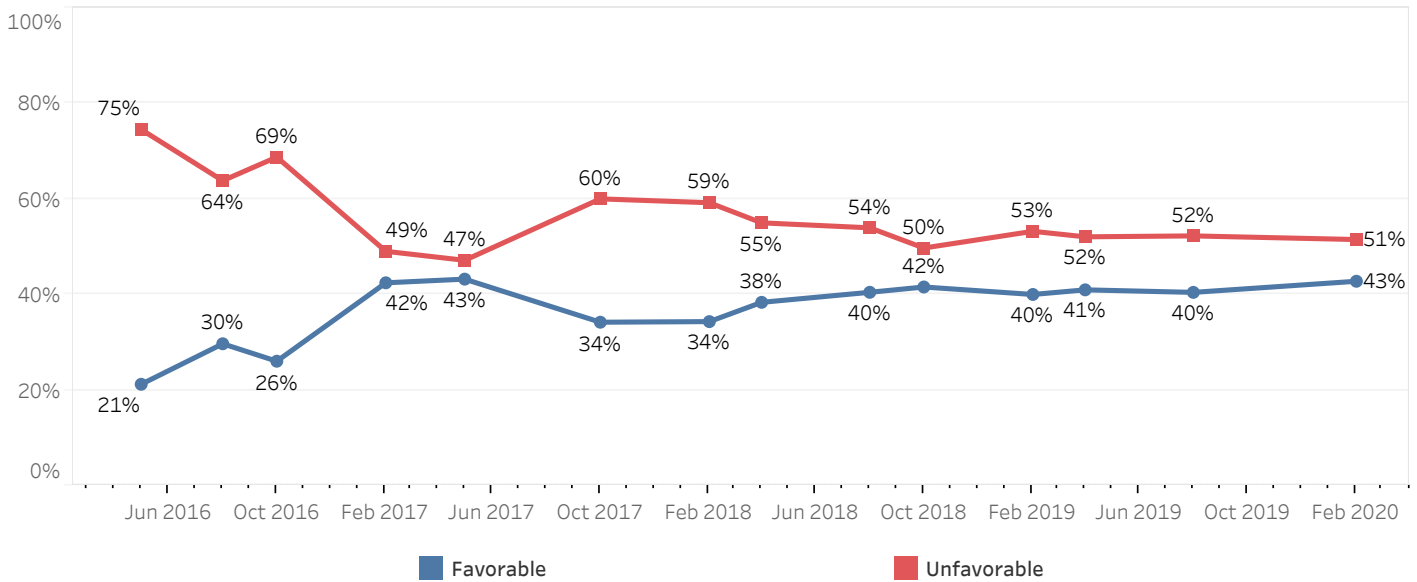


Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

Trump's personal favorability rating among New Hampshire adults is largely unchanged over the past year; Trump is currently viewed favorably by 43% of Granite Staters, 51% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Just over half of New Hampshire residents (51%) both have an unfavorable view of Trump personally and disapprove of his job performance while 41% both have a favorable view of him and approve of his job performance. Only 1% say they have a favorable opinion of Trump but disapprove of his performance while another 1% have an unfavorable opinion of him but approve of his performance.

Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, those who attend religious services once a week or more often, and gun owners are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Self-described liberals, those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 or did not vote, NHPR listeners, those who have completed postgraduate work, those who never attend religious services, and those aged 18 to 34 are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump.

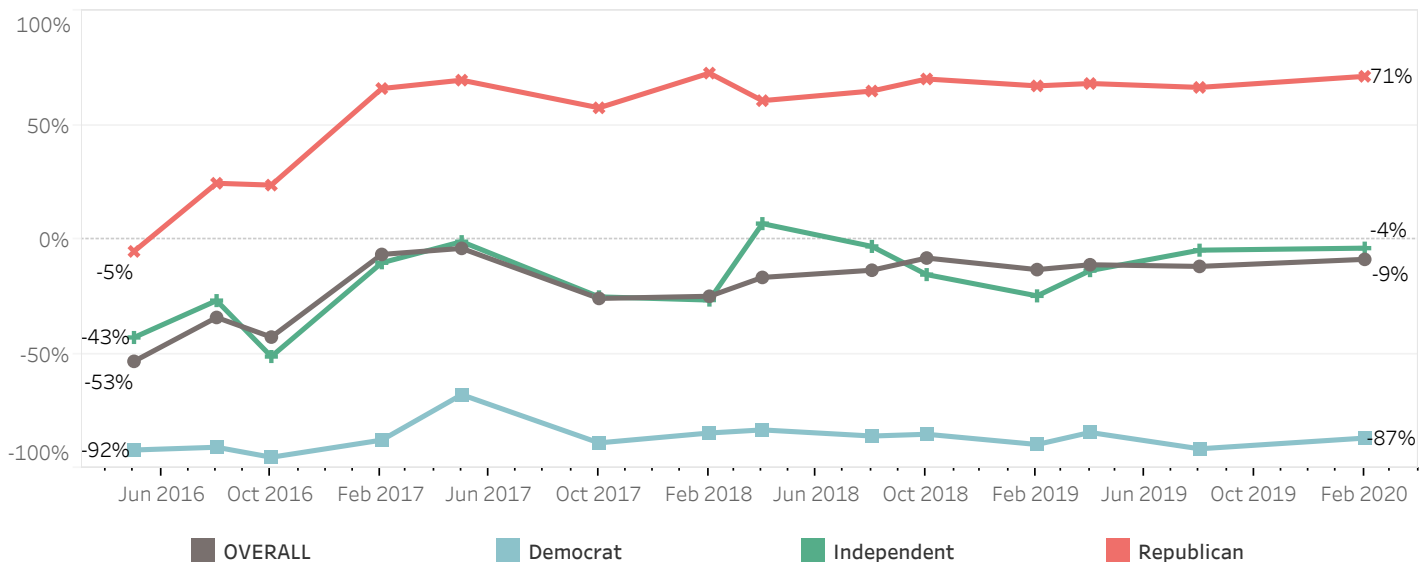
Favorability - Donald Trump



Trump's net favorability rating, the percentage of people who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is -9%, largely unchanged since August 2019 (-12%). Trump's popularity among Republicans (+71%), Independents (-4%), and Democrats (-87%) has remained largely steady over the past year.

Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump

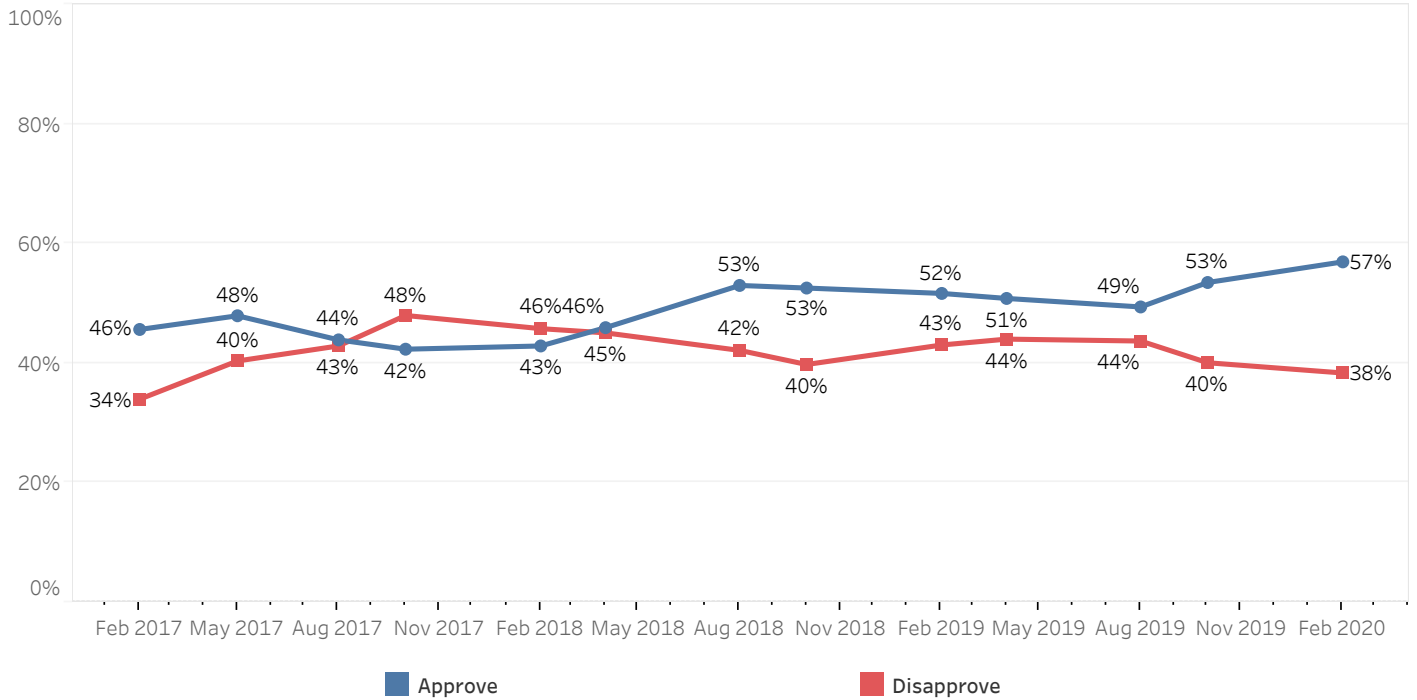
Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)



Economic Approval

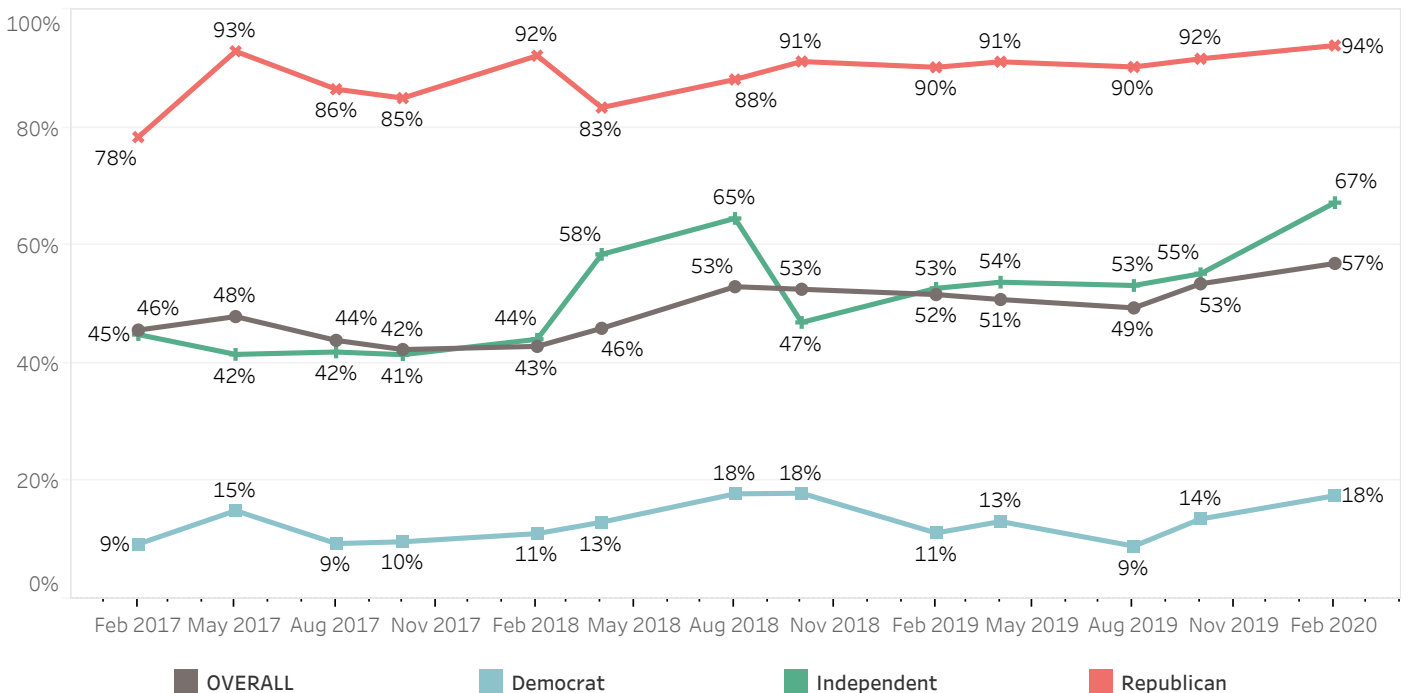
New Hampshire has enjoyed a strong economy during the Trump administration and the most recent unemployment rate stands at 2.6%. Fifty-seven percent of New Hampshire residents approve of President Trump's handling of the economy, 38% disapprove, and 5% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Trump's handling of the economy has slightly increased since October 2019 (53%) and is at its highest point in his presidency.

Ninety-four percent of Republicans approve of Trump's handling of the economy and two-thirds of Independents (67%) approve; approval among both groups is at its highest point in Trump's presidency. Only 18% of Democrats approve of Trump's handling of the economy, slightly higher than in August 2019 (9%).

Economic Approval - by Party ID

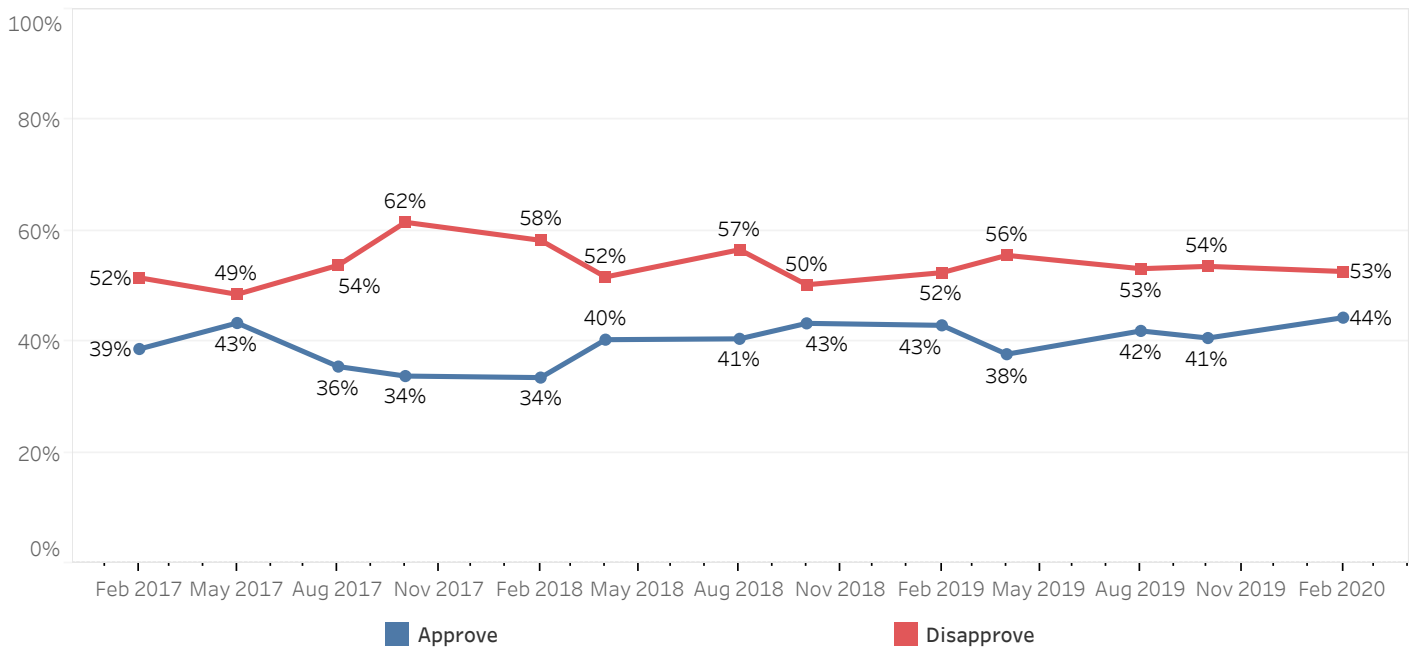


Foreign Affairs Approval

Granite Staters' opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs is slightly more positive than early last year but continues to lag behind approval of his handling of the economy. Currently, 44% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 53% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

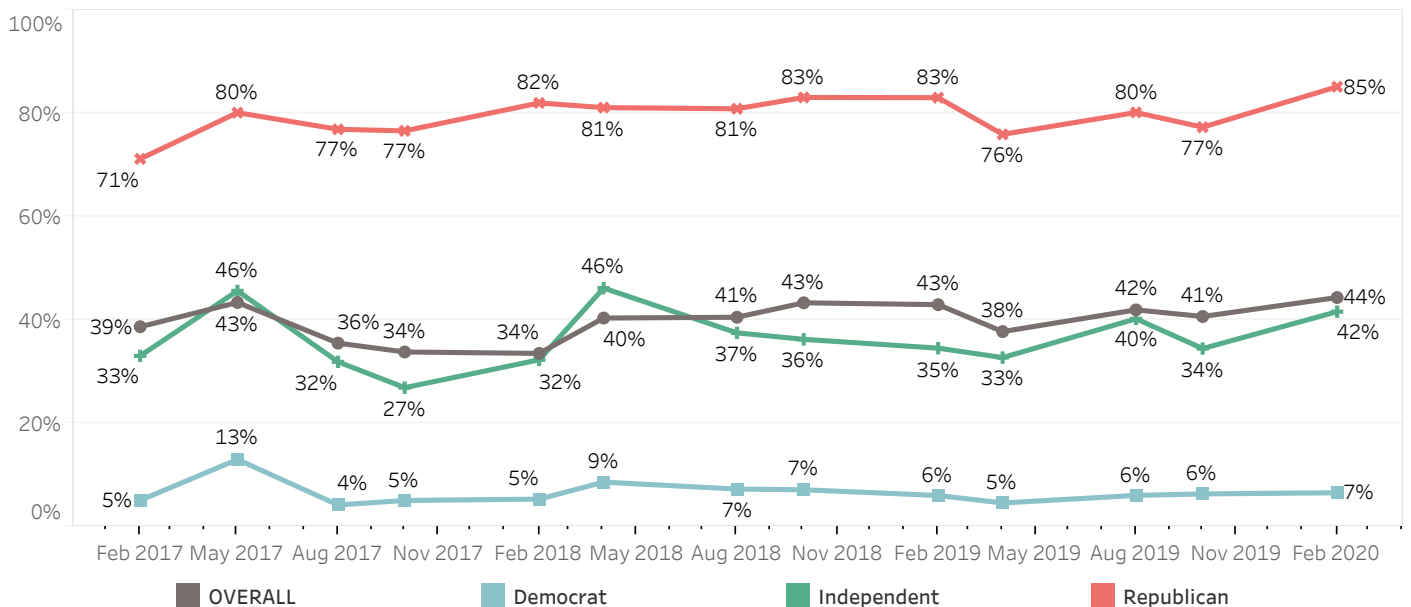
Overall, 44% of New Hampshire residents approve of Trump's handling of the economy and his handling of foreign affairs, 11% approve of his handling of the economy but disapprove on foreign affairs, less than 1% approve of his handling of foreign affairs but disapprove on the economy, and 38% disapprove of his handling of both.

Eighty-five percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance on foreign affairs, the highest percentage of Republicans who approve of Trump's performance on foreign affairs during his presidency. Forty-two percent of Independents, slightly more than in October 2019 (34%) agree, while only 7% of Democrats approve of Trump's handling of foreign affairs.

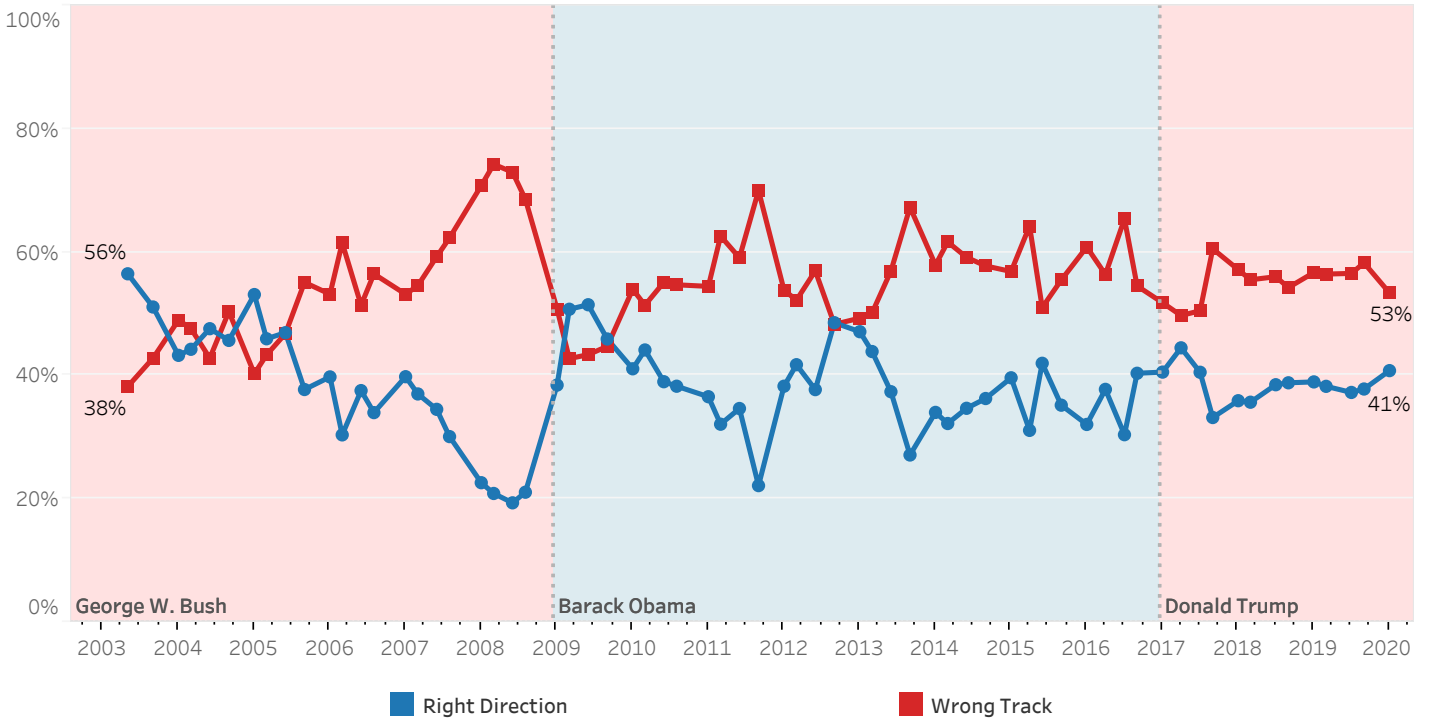
Foreign Affairs Approval - by Party ID



US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

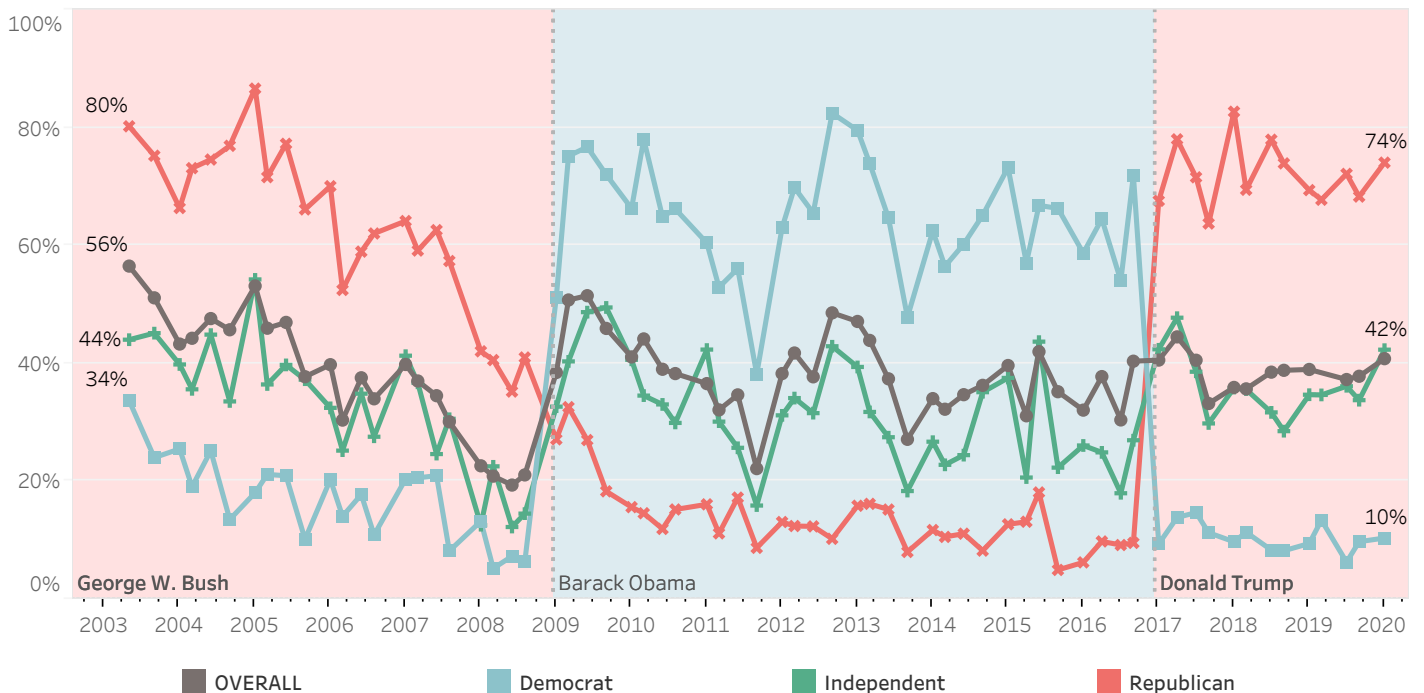
A majority of New Hampshire residents (53%) continue to say things in this country are seriously off on the wrong track while 41% say things are going in the right direction and 6% don't know or are unsure. Granite Staters have become slightly more optimistic about the country since October, when 58% said things were off on the wrong track.

Seventy-four percent of Republicans and 42% of Independents believe the country is headed in the right direction but only 10% of Democrats agree.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred eleven (611) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between February 19 and February 25, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the sample were 576 likely general election voters (MSE +/- 4.1%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Rancho Santo Margarita, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as to party registration targets estimated by the New Hampshire Secretary of State. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
