SHAHEEN LEADS POORLY KNOWN REPUBLICAN CHALLENGERS IN 2020 NH SENATE RACE

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
DURHAM, NH – Senator Jeanne Shaheen holds clear leads over prospective Republican challengers Former New Hampshire House of Representatives Speaker Bill O'Brien, Retired General Don Bolduc, and Attorney Corky Messner. As their reelection contests approach, Representatives Chris Pappas and Annie Kuster are viewed favorably by pluralities of their constituents, but many are neutral or are unaware of them.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred eleven (611) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between February 19 and February 25, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the sample were 576 likely general election voters (MSE +/- 4.1%). Included were three hundred sixteen (316) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.5%) and two hundred ninety-five (295) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.7%).

Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire Senior Senator Jeanne Shaheen, who is running for re-election in 2020, remains popular in the state. Currently, 49% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 28% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 10% are neutral, and 14% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's favorability at the same point before her last reelection campaign in 2014 was nearly identical (50%).


Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, those with a college degree or more education, NHPR listeners, those aged 65 and older, Seacoast residents, and those who never attend religious services are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, and those with a high school education or less are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is +20%. Shaheen's net favorability has remained largely steady over her current term in the Senate. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +70%), somewhat popular among Independents (+20%), and unpopular among Republicans (-31%).




Net Favorability Rating - Jeanne Shaheen (D)

2020 Senate Election


Three prospective candidates have declared their intention to challenge Shaheen for the U.S. Senate seat in November: Retired General Don Bolduc, Former Speaker of the New Hampshire House Bill O'Brien, and Attorney Corky Messner. However, most state residents don't have opinions about these candidates. Twelve percent of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Bolduc, 11% are neutral, 4% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 73% don't know or are unsure. Twelve percent have a favorable opinion of O'Brien, 16% are neutral, 13% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 59% don't know or are unsure. Only 4% have a positive opinion of Messner, 10% are neutral, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, and 82% don't know or are unsure. Favorability towards Bolduc and Messner is unchanged since August 2019. New Hampshire residents are less familiar with O'Brien than they were when he was Speaker of the New Hampshire House and a smaller percentage say they have an unfavorable opinion of him.



Favorability - Republican Senate Candidates

Senator Shaheen holds significant leads over all three prospective Republican challengers. In a hypothetical general election contest between Shaheen and O'Brien, 51% of Granite State likely voters support Shaheen, 30% support O'Brien, 5% would vote for another candidate, and 14% don't know or are undecided. In a contest between Shaheen and Bolduc, 49% support Shaheen, 30% support Bolduc, 5% would vote for someone else, and 17% don't know or are unsure. In a contest between Shaheen and Messner, 52% support Shaheen, 28% support Messner, 4% would vote for someone else, and 17% don't know or are unsure.

In February 2014, before her last reelection, Shaheen held slightly smaller leads of 11% and 10% respectively over prospective Republican challengers Bob Smith and Scott Brown.




Shaheen vs. Potential Democratic Opponents

Favorability - Maggie Hassan


Forty-five percent of New Hampshire residents have a favorable opinion of New Hampshire's Junior Senator Maggie Hassan, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 15% don't know enough about her to say. Hassan's favorability is virtually unchanged over the past year.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, those who have completed postgraduate work, NHPR listeners, those aged 65 and older, North Country residents, and those who never attend religious services are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 or did not vote, self-described conservatives, and those with a high school education or less are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.



Maggie Hassan (D) Favorability

Hassan's net favorability rating is +16%, largely unchanged over the past year. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +63%, somewhat popular among Independents (+14%), and unpopular among Republicans (-31%).




Net Favorability Rating - Maggie Hassan (D)

Favorability - Chris Pappas

Thirty-two percent of First Congressional District residents have a favorable opinion of Congressman Chris Pappas, 21% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12% are neutral, and 35% don't know enough about him to say. Pappas's net favorability rating (+11%) is largely unchanged since August 2019 (+12%).

Pappas is popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +41%) and is somewhat unpopular (-20%) among Republicans while Independents (+8%) are largely neutral.




Chris Pappas (D) Favorability

Favorability - Ann Kuster

Forty-one percent of Second Congressional District residents have a favorable opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster, 26% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 22% don't know enough about her to say. Kuster's net approval rating (+15%) has slightly increased since August 2019 (+9%).

Kuster is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +57%), somewhat popular among Independents (+28%), and unpopular among Republicans (-32%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred eleven (611) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between February 19 and February 25, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the sample were 576 likely general election voters (MSE +/- 4.1%). Included were three hundred sixteen (316) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 5.5%) and two hundred ninety-five (295) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.7%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Rancho Santo Margarita, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as to party registration targets estimated by the New Hampshire Secretary of State. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
