I am writing in behalf of my friend Mr. Henri Temianka. He is a violinist of international repute. His San Francisco appearances, most of which I have attended, have been enthusiastically received. I have known him intimately for more than two years and can state that in addition to his great artistic ability, he is a man of fine character and deep rooted democratic ideals. He is a British citizen and has applied for his first citizenship papers.

I myself am an American citizen by birth, was born in Los Angeles, California on October 20th, 1906, and have lived continuously in California. I graduated from Stanford University, A.B., 1927 and M.D., 1931. Since 1933 I have been on the faculty of the Stanford Medical School, instructing in Surgery.
