I have listed below several items that may be helpful to the Chancellor in framing a response to the letter he received from Y. Bushyhead

- 1. There was a meeting held in Omaha and funded by the NASA Nebraska Space Grant Consortium on 2-25 and 26, 1997 with UNO representatives and:
 - a. Yvonne Bushyhead President of Little Priest Tribal College(LPTC)
 - b. Skyler Houser President of Nebraska Indian CC (NICC)
 - c. Chuck Squirer Superintendent Santee Public Schools
 - d. Virgil Likness Superintendent of Winnebago Public Schools
- 2. Items discussed were:
 - a. Tribal School/UNO future educational partnerships
 - b. Joint research and grant writing opportunities.
 - c. Scholarship opportunities and funding mechanisms
 - d. Curriculum development for improving K 12 mathematics, science, and technology education through the use of aeronautics
 - e. Faculty enhancement workshops
 - f. Future interstate, regional, and national Native American/NASA Space Grant initiatives.
 - g. Development of Lighted School programs
- 3. NASA/Nebraska Space Grant Consortium has currently funded:
 - a. One NASA \$750 annual scholarship each for students from Santee, Winnebago, Macy, & Walthill
 - b. One NASA \$750 annual scholarship for tribal college students (one at NICC and one at LPTC)
 - c. One NASA \$1500 organizational enhancement grant for NICC
 - d. One NASA \$1500 organizational enhancement grant for LPTC
 - e. Two NASA ACE Academy scholarships will be awarded to Winnebago Schools; in 1998, two to Santee Schools
- 4. Visitations between administration of the Aviation Institute continue with trips to the tribal schools
- 5. MOUs for CPACS with Little Priest Tribal College and Nebraska Indiana Community College are currently being developed
- 6. A NASA Grant proposal is being prepared for UNO to serve as an Education and Outreach Broker/Facilitator. This proposal will include faculty members in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics Education, and Aeronautics.
- 7. The UNO Aviation Institute is playing an interstate (NE, SD, and KS) and regional leadership role in developing Native American aeronautics initiatives.
