The Associated Students of the University of Montana 2 Resolution Regarding Sustainability Fee Referendum 3 October 29, 2019 4 SB26-19/20 Authored by: Kyle Johnston, ASUM Senator; Zoe Nelson, ASUM Senator; 5 6 Sponsored by: Emma Kiefer, ASUM Senator; 7 8 Whereas, Efforts to implement sustainable practices have repeatedly received strong support from the 9 student body through campus-wide referenda, student surveys, and past years' Associated Students of the 10 University of Montana (ASUM) resolutions: 11 12 Whereas, The Sustainability Fee is a major source of dedicated funding for the University of Montana's 13 (UM) sustainability efforts, including carbon emission reductions, developing green buildings and 14 grounds, supporting sustainable transportation, reducing or utilizing efficient means of energy consumption, supporting locally sourced food options on campus, and diverting waste through recycling 15 16 and composting efforts; 17 18 Whereas, Supporting sustainability efforts are instrumental in campus-wide recruitment endeavors; 19 20 Whereas, The ASUM Sustainability Fee is the only dedicated funding source for implementing 21 sustainability efforts at UM; 22 23 Whereas, The ASUM Sustainability Fee is the only ASUM fee with an "opt-out" option, and currently 24 sits at \$6; 25 26 Whereas, The ASUM Sustainability Fee's opt-out rate was reported to be approximately 29% in Fall. 27 2019 but is, on average, about 33%: 28 29 Whereas, Making the fee mandatory versus "opt-out" would generate over \$38,000 of additional funding 30 annually; 31 32 Whereas, An increase of \$6 per semester for the students that would otherwise opt-out would constitute a 33 marginal increase to the cost of attendance for in-state and out-of-state students; 34 Therefore, Let It Be Resolved, That in accordance with Article 10, Sections 2 and 3 of the ASUM 35 36 Constitution, the following question be placed before the student body of UM for a vote during the 2020 37 ASUM General Election: 38 39 "The ASUM Sustainability Fee is \$6 per semester and is used to carry out student-led sustainability 40 projects such as the installation of covered-bike parking and water-bottle filling stations. In addition to 41 student-led projects, the Sustainability Fee funds efforts of the ASUM Sustainability Center to advocate 42 for students' sustainability concerns. ASUM is proposing that the current Sustainability Fee be changed 43 from an "opt-out" fee to a mandatory, campus-wide fee. This change to the Sustainability Fee would generate around \$38,000 more for sustainability efforts annually, based on current enrollment. 44 45 Yes, I support changing the ASUM Sustainability Fee to a mandatory fee and removing its current 46 47 opt-out status. 48 49 No, I do not support changing the ASUM Sustainability Fee to a mandatory fee and removing its current opt-out status." 50
