Dennis Zeisler has been on the faculty of Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia for 35 years serving as Director of Bands, Professor of Clarinet and Saxophone and Chair of the Music Department. Mr. Zeisler is a graduate of the University of Michigan where he was solo clarinetist of the Symphony Band under the direction of Dr. William D. Revelli. He was solo clarinetist of the Detroit Concert Band under the direction of Dr. Leonard Smith and clarinet soloist with the United States Military Academy Band at West Point. Mr. Zeisler is a past recipient of the Virginia Music Educator of the Year Award, is a member of the American Bandmasters Association and is the founder and conductor of the Virginia Wind Symphony. He is on the Board of Directors of the National Band Association, The John Philip Sousa Foundation, The Midwest Clinic and holds the office of President of the American Bandmasters Association.

Alexander Treviño is the Director of Athletic Bands and Associate Director of Bands at Old Dominion University. Dr. Treviño established the first-ever marching band program in the history of Old Dominion in 2009. The band began rehearsing in the fall of 2008 and has since performed in exhibition and in public performances throughout the Commonwealth. Dr. Treviño also teaches music education courses in the Department of Music and conducts the Symphonic Band.

Dr. Treviño holds a PhD. in Music Education from the University of Washington and a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting degree from The University of Tennessee. He also holds the Bachelor of Music in Music Education degree from the University of Texas at Austin.

Shock Wave is a high energy piece, driven by a constant sense of propulsion and rippling waves of motion. The initial shock wave is provided by the percussion section, which leads to a tension filled section, using multiple layers of sound scattered throughout the ensemble. This tension ultimately finds its release with a large impact with the entire band at rehearsal letter H. An agitated melody is then passed from the woodwinds to the trumpets at letter J, which leads to another explosion of sound at letter L. A new section unfolds at rehearsal letter O, with new layers of sound and rhythm in the brass and woodwind sections. Each new entrance is accompanied by a solo percussion instrument, which builds to a frenzied swirling conclusion to this middle section. The tempo suddenly becomes faster, building layer upon layer of musical pressure until the final resolution of the composition. The percussion section gets the last word, providing one final "aftershock" at the end of the piece.

Dr. Gary D. Ziek, Professor of Music, is the Director of Bands and Professor of Trumpet at Emporia State University. Dr. Ziek was the recipient of the Roe R. Cross Distinguished Professor Award for 2008-2009.
