#### STUDY ABROAD LEADERSHIP TEAM (SALT)

Each semester, the study abroad staff recruits study abroad returnees to join the Study Abroad Leadership Team, or SALT. The purpose of this team is not only to help promote study abroad, but also to provide students with both professional and leadership development after their semester abroad.

This semester, our SALT team consisted of 12 students who participated in programs in countries such as Australia, England, Italy, Ireland, Japan, and Ecuador. Throughout the semester, these students have helped organize and deliver study abroad-related programming such as the Study Abroad Fair (during International Education Week), study abroad orientation for Spring 2020 participants, and a student-led study abroad panel for Gateway Seminar students.

# INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

#### **ENROLLMENT**

The ESL program welcomed 22 students this semester from Japan, Peru, Vietnam, Ecuador, Saudi Arabia. These include students from our long-standing partner at Nihon University in Japan, as well as a cohort of religious sisters from convents in Vietnam.

#### **PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

- The students enjoyed classes in English language writing, reading, listening, grammar, and Cultural Immersion.
- The Cultural Immersion class took them on several excursions to area attractions:
  - Green Bay Botanical Garden
  - Sturgeon Bay Maritime Museum and Lighthouse
  - Camp Randall Stadium & Capitol Building in Madison
  - St. Norbert Abbey
  - Feeding America, service learning experience with inclass collaboration with Nancy Mathias from the Sturzl Center for Community Service & Learning
- Six ESL students completed the advanced level and graduated from the ESL program in December 2019. Two of these students (Peru, Vietnam) are matriculating to degree programs at St. Norbert College.
- 39 ESL, international degree-seeking, exchange, and domestic students and staff enjoyed a beautiful day trip to Chicago in early November.

#### **CGE GRADUATION & FAREWELL**

Over 50 guests attended the farewell ceremony for our departing and graduating students on December 5, 2019. We recognized six ESL graduating students (two of whom are matriculating into degree programs at SNC); one international student graduating from St. Norbert College; and four exchange students.

Dr. Daniel Stoll offered welcoming remarks to the audience. Several students reflected on their experience at SNC in their speeches. The first issue of the St. Norbert ESL Express newsletter was introduced and distributed to the audience.

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENT & SCHOLAR SERVICES

## **IREX & World Learning**

The Global Undergraduate Exchange Program (Global UGRAD), sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, brings future leaders to the U.S. to experience the U.S. educational system, share their culture, and explore U.S. culture and values. Global UGRAD - IREX is a highly competitive program with more than 20,000 applications received annually, and fewer than 300 students chosen to participate. SNC has welcomed Pakistani students through this program for two years. For the first time this year, SNC also received students through Global UGRAD - World Learning; a program similar to IREX opportunities. A fall site visit by World Learning staff resulted in a very positive report about our campus and the support offered to international students.

# **OPT Workshop**

International students nearing graduation were invited to attend an Optional Practical Training (OPT) Workshop led by the College's Primary Designated School Official (PDSO), Christina Hankwitz. OPT is a benefit available to F-1 international students for up to 12 months of employment in students' field of study as a way to gain practical work experience. Students received guidance on completing the OPT application, gathering the required documents, and submitting the required application fee.

#### **International Student Orientation**

This year's International Student Orientation for new students was updated to include the participation of multiple College offices to help incoming students learn more about the services available to them on our campus. The cohort of new international students spent three days together, exploring both the on-campus and off-campus community and forming a strong bond with each other.

#### **EXCHANGE STUDENTS**

# INTERNATIONAL RECRUITMENT

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

During the fall semester, International Admissions traveled to three continents, eight countries, and 12 cities and participated in 43 high school visits/fairs, seven counselor programs and one college fair. International recruitment activities took place in the following countries: Cambodia, Colombia, Ecuador, England, Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore and Vietnam. Spring travel season brings more opportunities to engage with prospective students abroad!

The International Admission Office continues to explore building our educational agent partnerships. In doing so, the international recruiter participated in a 3-day intensive agent workshop meeting with agents from target and exploratory markets; including: Brazil, China, Colombia, India, Nepal, Nigeria, Panama, Russia, Sweden, and Vietnam.

Beginning spring semester 2020, we will welcome 2 new international degree-seeking students from Peru and Vietnam. They will join the diverse and robust SNC international community consisting of 51 students representing 21 countries.



# **GLOBAL PROGRAMMING**

- **International Student Reception:** CGE celebrated new and returning international students at an International Student Reception during the first week of the semester. Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. Jenn Bonds-Raacke, Associate Dean for Global Affairs Dr. Daniel Stoll and international student Cesar Benavente offered words of welcome to the audience of students, faculty and staff.
- **International Education Week** 
  - Life, Language, and Culture Fair: Our ESL students prepared interactive poster presentations about various aspects of life, language, and culture in their countries. An audience of over 100 visited the fair.
  - Study Abroad Fair: The College's first Study Abroad Fair was held during International Education Week. During the fair, students had the opportunity to explore study abroad options by connecting with partner institutions from around the world, faculty and study abroad alumni. Over 100 SNC faculty, students and staff visited the fair.
  - Global Etiquette Dinner: In collaboration with the Office of Career and Professional Development, CGE offered a global version of the popular Etiquette Dinner. Five international students served as cultural ambassadors to a capacity crowd, leading student participants through various global norms and proper etiquette around the world.

## Ibrahim Mahmoud, exchange student, Egypt

"Personal space here is different from the Arab world. For Arabs, personal space is seen as a thing where if a person wants personal space, they might not be friendly. If an American was to go to the Arab world, it would be a very weird experience for them. Americans aren't used to having people so close to them. I knew the differences when I came here, so I'm trying to keep up with it. Sometimes I act intuitively and then I remember to keep some distance. The thing is just understanding perspective. Me seeing it in your perspective is hard. But when you understand the way of living in other places, it's easier to understand how they live, and how they form their lives."
