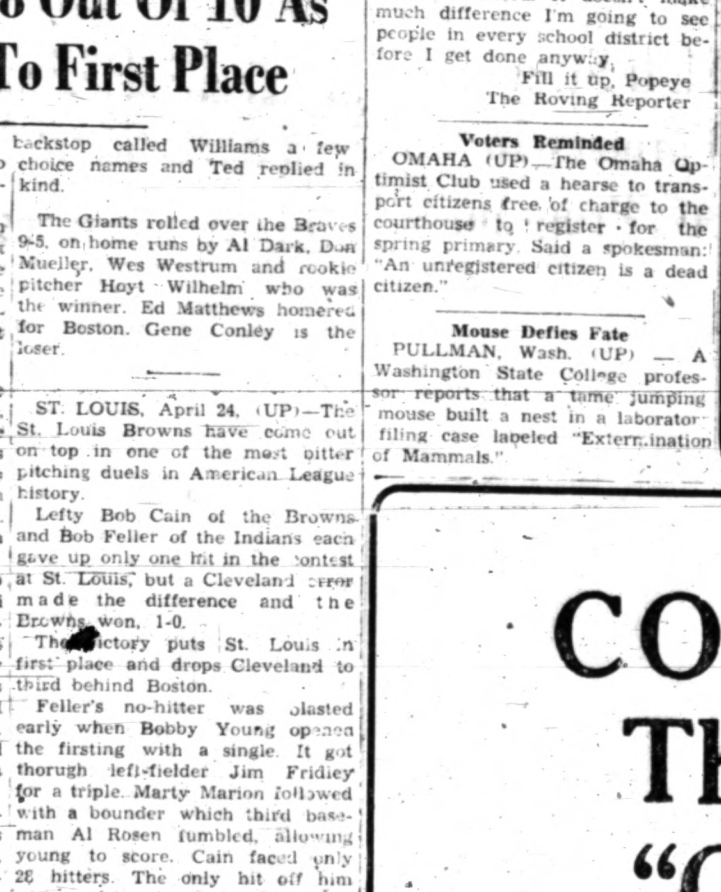

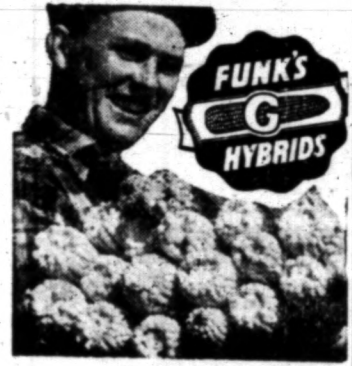

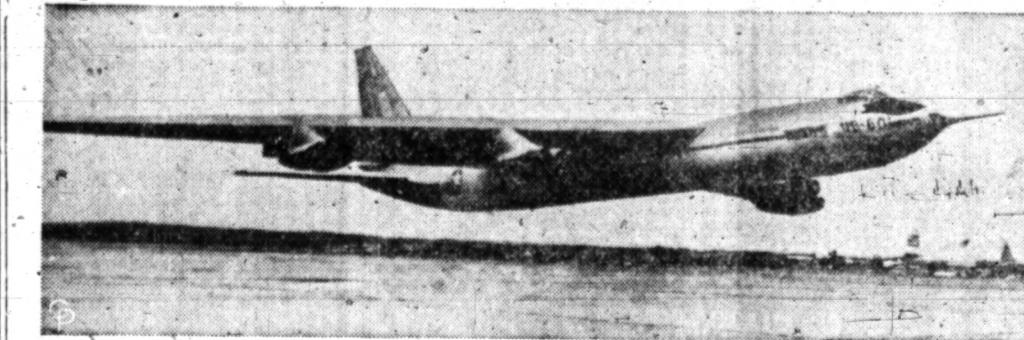

Today's Bride More Sentimental Than Her Sisters Of Past Season Says Manufacturer

One of the nation's leading makers of bridal finery says today's bride is more sentimental than her sisters of other seasons.

Manufacturer Murray Hamburger says this year's bride is less practical and more romantic, and as a result there's a return to the traditional wedding—the use in church, with the bride decked out in white, full-length dress and train, and attendants in long dresses.

Other seasons, he says, the traditional type of wedding ran into competition with the informal one, where the bride settled for one attendant and wore either a street-length or ball-length frock.

Nowadays, Hamburger argues, the bride isn't interested in a dress that she can wear later as a formal. She wants one she can take away with her—ball-length, or shorter.

Some department stores disagree with Hamburger, reporting they still are selling as many shorter frocks as long ones.

Whether the bride is to wear a short or a long frock, the story this year is about as simple: pastel shades made of net, tulle, or organza, or with net or tulle in combination with satin or tulle.

One manufacturer, David Klein, puts a tulle redingote, with cap sleeves and scooped-out neckline, over a strapless, tulle, net dress. The outfit is ball-length. The net dress, which is strapless, can be used after the wedding as a formal.

For the girl who insists on a double-duty bridesmaid dress, the manufacturers have figured out neat ways of covering up shoulders for the one big day. Hamburger uses filmy sleeves, but prefers jute-cambray for sleeves and shoulders. They're removable later. Or, the manufacturer says, dresses have many removable buttons.

One of the prettiest of the ball-length frocks is of nylon, tulle, and net. The dress, with a bustle, is trimmed at the waist with a cummerbund of satin.

Wise Hosiery Buyer Tells Salesgirl 4 Items Before Buying

If your hosiery bill equals your food bill, maybe you're not a wise clothing shopper. The department of agriculture says the wise hosiery buyer tells the salesgirl 4 items before buying.

The department's clothing experts explain that gauge refers to the fineness or closeness of the knit. Donor refers to the fineness of the yarn which went into the stockings.

Today, the experts say, a 51 gauge is considered low or coarse; 64 gauge is medium; 69 is fine; 69 very fine; 75 donor; 13 or 20 is the fine yarn used for sheer hose; and 30 the heavier for service weight. A very fine yarn, cuts for a firm or close knit so that probably will last longer in the case of 60 or 66 gauge rather than in the 51 coarsest gauge.

For good wear, the correct hosiery length gives room for fastening to the reinforced top, rather than the sheer gait.

Unselfishness Called For By Business Man

DALLAS, Texas—The greater the demand upon government, the bigger and more powerful government must become, and the bigger and more powerful the government, the greater is the consequent tendency, human nature being what it is, to deterioration of both public and private morals, Leroy A. Lincoln, board chairman of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, told the Southwestern Legal Foundation conference at Southern Methodist University here April 22.

Some people "expect from central government many things for which government is not equipped and which are not a part of our American philosophy," Mr. Lincoln added. "They come close to an ideology which has made headway in some countries and which we certainly prefer to spurn," he said. "I suppose there are relatively few of our citizens who are not unconsciously or avowedly supporters of one or another kind of so-called pressure group. Their adherence to the public official is overwhelming."

If there is a remedy, Mr. Lincoln declared, it must be the development of "social unselfishness." Groups must not seek to pile their demands on public officials and government, and must be prevailed on to seek the general good rather than their own selfish personal interests. Furthermore, the individual citizen must once again learn to recognize their many responsibilities and accept them as such.

"It is only when our citizenry recognizes this fact and begins to set the example and to make its views known that we can hope for any change," he said. "Democratic government is no better and no worse than its citizens demand that it be, and morality in government is no better and no worse than the standards fixed by the people themselves."

A strong plea was made by Mr. Lincoln for Americans in every walk of life to return to reliance upon themselves and, where feasible, upon their local governments rather than rely upon a strong central government. He saw trends toward the "welfare state" as influences sure to lead to moral deterioration in government.

In closing, Mr. Lincoln called attention to a recent statement issued by the Bishops of the United States, from which he quoted the following:

"We exhort Americans in every walk of life to dedicate themselves to the wisdom of our founding fathers—a wisdom which proclaimed God's rightful place in human affairs—a wisdom so memorably expressed by the father of our country in his farewell address: Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports...reason and experience both forbid us to expect that national morality can prevail in exclusion of religious principle."
