Wind Patterns through the sea channel 'Dardanelles' that connects the Aegean sea to the sea of Marmara











Aerial view of the Troy I-II architectural remains from the north







Early Troy III (2280-2200 BC) (Blegen's II f-g = III)







Developmental Stages of EBA TROY

1. Troy I-Initial Phase (Introduction of Bronze)

2. Troy II-Expansion Phase (Elites, Monumentality, Prestige goods)

3. Troy III-Consolidation and Decline (Competition, Conflicts)
