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CHAPTER 4

Sino-Arabic Script in Islamic Art and Architecture in China with Special

Reference to Xi'an Mosque

Abstract:

The Islamic art has played a significant role in the cultural, social, historical and religious development of Muslim Chinese in China. Its development was uniquein response to cultural needs of the minority Muslim groups in China. The Islamic calligraphy, for example, was widely used in architecture, especially in interior andexterior decoration of mosques and other religious buildings. The aim of this study is to interpret the Sino-Arabic script of the great mosque of Xi'an. To achieve this, the Sino-Arabic script of calligraphy will be examined in order to determine its characrastics and the nature of the effects to which they have been subjected. The research collected a broad range of information through a field survey that was carried out in the Great Mosque of Xi'an in China on October 2007.¹ The field survey also benefitted from input by renowned Muslim Chinese calligrapher Haji Noor Deen Mi Gouanggiang. The research hopes to further increase the body of knowledge onunique cultural heritage of Islam in China.

The study of Sino-Arabic calligraphy and its application in Islamic art and architecture as a part of heritage that was produced by Muslims in China. This research is divided into four parts. The first part sets out the background of the study and its significance of calligraphy in Chinese culture and significance of calligraphy to Islamic culture. The second part presents the significance of calligraphy in both Chinese and Islamic cultures and their styles of writing. The third part focuses on the development of Islamic calligraphy in China.
