Theft Prevention in Brothers Mahallahs

INTRODUCTION

Student's residential college of the International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM) is better known as *Mahallah*. The word Mahallah refers to a place where it is supposed to be a seft-contained not only with services but also activities. IIUM chooses to name its mahallah after the leading companions of the Prophet s.a.w and the female *Mujahidah* and *Syuhada*.

Since the early years of its establishment, IIUM practices 100% accommodation for its full time undergraduate students. For postgraduate students, the accommodation is provided based on availability of rooms. Priorities are given to the non-Malaysian students especially new intake students.

Currently, IIUM Gombak has 16 mahallats that accommodate about 16,000 students who come from various countries and cultures. Each mahallah is lead by a Principal and assisted by administrative staff and fellows. The administrative staffs concentrate on the administrative and maintenance requests of mahallah while the fellows focus on the students' matters and activities³.

Nowadays the theft cases at the mahallah occurred because some students have duplicated the key and some of the students did not return the key. At the same time also security personnel do not allow female students to enter mahallah after curfew hours. This has rise concern on sister's safety. In addition many motorcycles were stolen because of disfunction of light provided at the parking area of the mahallah garage. Students' belongings were stolen during the day time even in short of time.
