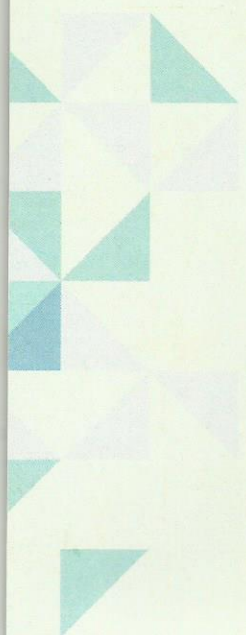

Keynote Speakers



Prof. Dato' Sri Dr. Zaleha Kamaruddin is a professor at Ahmad Ibrahim Kuliyah of Laws (AIKOL), International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). She was appointed as the fifth Rector of IIUM. Previously, she was the Dean of the Faculty of Law Ahmad Ibrahim at IIUM and Deputy Director General of the Institute of Islamic Understanding Malaysia. She has produced books, articles and research on the law and also provides consultancy services to ministers, departments and non-governmental organizations (NGOs).



Prof. Dr. Engku Rabiah Adawiah Engku Ali is currently a Professor at Ahmad Ibrahim Kuliyah of Laws, International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). She was conferred with PhD in Law (Securities Regulation) from the University of Aberdeen, United Kingdom. She also serves as a consultant to several financial institutions and legal firms. Currently, she is a member of the Syariah Advisory Council of Bank Negara Malaysia.



Assoc. Prof. Dr. Akram is the Executive Director of International Shariah Research Academy for Islamic Finance. Member of Bank Negara Malaysia Shariah Advisory Council. Member of Accounting and Auditing Organisation of Islamic Financial Institution (AAOIFI) Shariah Board. Member of Shariah Board of Employees Provident Fund Malaysia (EPF). He has extensive research experience in the area of Islamic finance and has presented many papers related to Islamic banking and finance at domestic and international level.



Dr Nurul Barziah is a senior lecturer, researcher and also sits as a Vice Dean for Cooperation, Development and Information System at the Faculty of Law, Universitas Airlangga, Indonesia since 2010 until now. Nurul's area of expertise is on International Intellectual Property, International Trade Law, International Law and International Dispute Resolution. She also acted as consultant for some Ministries in Indonesia, particularly in the context of drafting academic paper, developing policy and legal reform related to her expertise. She has also established the Intellectual Property rights Law lecturers Association of Indonesia. In 2012, Dr Nurul was awarded an Australian Alumni Award by the Australian Government for category of Excellence in Education.
