Fáilte ón Uachtarán

Tá áthas orm fáilte a fhearadh romhaibh inniu, lá deasghnátha agus ceiliúrtha. Tá céimithe, aíonna agus baill fhoirne de chuid DIT Shráid Chaomhín agus Scoil Cheoil agus Drámaíochta na hInstitiúide cruinnithe in Ard-Eaglais mhaorga stairiúil Phádraig ar ócáid bhliantiúil Shearmanas Bhronnta na nGradam.

Is lá iontach é seo daoibh siúd atá ar tí céimnithe. Is buaic é ar na blianta staidéir fhónta san Institiúid agus is marc tábhachtach é i dtógáil bhur saolréanna amach anseo. Tréaslaím sibh as bhur saothar agus bur ngaisce, agus molaim bhur gclanna agus bhur gcairde as a n-íobairt agus a dtacaíocht thar na bliana. Fosta tréaslaím gach ball foirne — idir léachtóirí, teicneoirí, riarthóirí agus lucht cabhraithe eile — as na torthaí ar a sár-obair agus a ndúthracht, ar léiriú sibhse orthu. Sibhe atá ag tosú ar bhur saolréanna, ba mhaith liom féin gach rath a ghuí oraibh amach anseo.

Is lá fíor-thábhachtach é seo freisin i saol na hInstitiúide i gcoitinne mar is marc foirmiúil é ar aistiriú nua-eolais agus scileanna chuig glún daoine óga, d'fhonn dul chun cinn leanúnach a chinntiú i bhforbairt na tíre agus an gheilleagair. Tá sé de cheangal ar an Institiúid an t-am ar fad an caighdeán is airde a bhaint amach, trí chúrsaí acadúla ardleibhéil a choimeád ar siúl agus áiseanna oideachais agus deiseanna forbartha a dhéanamh insroichte do dhaoine de gach aois as gach cearn den tír. Bíonn cúrsaí lánaimseartha agus páirtaimseartha ar fáil anseo ó mhaidin go hoíche. Taobh istigh den Institiúid bíonn tréaniarracht á déanamh an t-am ar fad na foirgnimh a fheabhsú, na trealaimh shaotharlainne a athnuachan agus na háiseanna tacaithe a fhorbairt. Earcaítear baill fhoirne den chaighdeán is airde ina réimsí cuí agus spreagtar iad a gcuid eolais a leathnú tré thaighde agus fhorbairt. Déanann an saothar seo, is cuma acadúil nó feidhmeach é, caighdeáin acadúla a ráthú, cinntíonn go bhfuil cláracha na hInstitiúide ábharta maidir le cúrsaí tráchtála, tionsclaíochta agus ealaíona, agus cothaíonn seirbhís den chéad scoth do na mic/iníonacha léinn.

Is í an DIT an chéad Institiúid náisiúnta de leibhéal ollscoile a chuir próisis chuimsitheacha Chinntiú Caighdeán i gcrích maidir lena cláracha uile. Tá an obair cheannróideach seo lárnach don aidhm go mbainfeadh an Institiúid caighdeáin acadúla agus éacht den chéad scoth amach i ngach Scoil, I rith na bliana seo caite rinne painéal idirnáisiúnta saineolaithe, iad acadúil agus tiosclaíoch, meastóireacht mhion ar an gcóras Cinntiú Caighdeán seo thar ceann an Údaráis um Ard-Oideachas (HEA). Mar thoradh ar a dtuairisc siúd, mhol an HEA féin gur cheart don Aire Oideachais an chumhacht reachtúil a thabhairt don Institiúid céimeanna príomhúla agus iarchéime dá cuid féin a bhronnadh. Gríosaímid an tAire an moladh seo a ghlacadh gan mhoill mar táimid cinnte de go dtabharfaidh an fhorbairt seo aitheantas cuí don raon leathan imeachtaí de leibhéal ollscoile atá ar siúl i láthair na huaire san Institiúid agus go spreagfaidh sí cúrsaí agus cláracha dinimiciúla nua ar fud na hInstitiúide a bhainfidh amach buntáistí eacnamaíochta níos fearr ná go dtí seo.

Ard-Eaglais Phádraig

Meastar go raibh ionad eaglasta léinn ar an láthair seo ó aimsir Phádraig Naofa féin agus leis na cianta bhí tobair bheannaithe Phádraig sa pháirc atá taobh leis an Ard-Eaglais. Bhunaigh Ardeaspag Comyn, an chéad ardeaspag Gallda ar Bhaile Átha Cliath, coláiste anseo sa bhliain 1191 agus rinneadh ard-eaglais aisti i 1213. I rith a startha bhí an ardeaglais ina dún, ina príosún, ina cúirt dlí, ina ollscoil — agus ina stábla má luaitear cuairt Chromail uirthi — chomh maith lena gnóithe eaglasta.

Fuair na hUigínigh ón bhFrainc dídean adhartha anseo tar éis 1660 agus adhlacadh Schomberg, ceannfort de chuid Liaim Oráiste, anseo i ndiaidh cath na Bóinne. Bhí Jonathan Swift iomráiteach ina Dheán anseo idir 1713 agus 1745, agus tá sé adhlactha i gcorp na heaglaise faoi mharmar dubh agus a fheartlaoi fhéinscríofa air sin. Cinnte tá leachtanna cuimhneacháin ar fud na hArd-Eaglaise a chuireann gnéithe dár stair agus dár n-oidhreacht i gcuimhne dúinn — clann Robert Boyle, ceannródaí na ceimice; an Cearallánach, an bard deireanach; Lover, an cumadóir amhrán; Lecky, an staraí: Balfe, an cumadóir ceoil; agus Dubhlás de hÍde, bunaitheoir Chonradh na Gaeilge agus céad Uachtarán na hÉireann.

Thóg Henry Willis an t-orgán ollmhór i 1902 agus meastar gur sárshaothar dá chuid é.

Achóiríodh an Ard-Eaglais i ndiaidh 1865 trí fhéile Shior Benjamin Guinness agus chuir an obair seo bun-phlean agus bun-dearadh siméadrach an fhoirgnimh ar ais, rud a bhí ceilte leis na céadta. Mar thoradh ar an obair sin, tá an Ard-Eaglais againn anois, ó thaobh ailtireachta de, den chuid is mó mar a bhí nuair a tógadh den chéad uair í timpeall ocht gcéad bliain ó shin.

St Patrick's Cathedral

It is believed that there was an ecclesiastical school on this site since the time of St. Patrick himself. For ages there was a holy well named after him in the park beside the Cathedral. Archbishop Comyn, the first English Archbishop of Dublin, founded a college here in 1191 and it became a cathedral in 1213. During its history the Cathedral has been a fortress, a prison, a court of law, a university — and a stable if one takes Cromwell's visit into account — as well as fulfulling its ecclesiastical functions.

The Huguenots from France found shelter for worship here after 1660 and Schomberg, the Commander of William of Orange, was buried here after the Battle of the Boyne. The famous Jonathan Swift was Dean here between 1713 and 1745, and is buried in the nave under a black marble stone on which is inscribed the epitaph which he wrote himself. There are memorials throughout the Cathedral to remind us of different aspects of our history and heritage: the family of Robert Boyle, the pioneer of chemistry; Carolan, the last of the bards; Lover, the song-writer; Lecky the historian; Balfe, the composer; and Douglas Hyde, founder of Conradh na Gaeilge and first President of Ireland.

Henry Willis built the present massive organ in 1902 and this is generally considered to be his masterpiece.

The Cathedral was restored through the generosity of Sir Benjamin Guinness after 1865 and this work of rescue restored the original plan and symmetrical design of the building which had been obscured for centuries. As a result, the Cathedral as it now stands, has for the most part the main original architectural features of eight hundred years ago.

Traidisiún Láidir Oideachais Theicneolaíochta ar Shráid Chaoimhín

Bunaíodh an chéad scoil theicniúil ar Shráid Chaoimhín i mí Dheireadh Fómhair 1887. Faoin bhliain 1891, nuair a reachtaíodh an tAcht um Theagasc Teicneolaíochta in Éirinn, bhí 513 mac léinn ar an rolla, méadú mór ón 78 a bhí ann ar dtús. Chuaigh Bardas Átha Cliath i bhfeighil na scoile i 1893 agus fuair deontaisí chun trealamh saotharlainne a sholáthar. Leathnaigh an scoil go dtí uimhir 37 Shráid Chaoimhín ansin agus faoi 1897 bhí 925 mac léinn ag freastal uirthi. Tógadh scoil nua a bhí níos mó fós ansin, scoil a d'osclaíodh i 1901.

Tar éis bhunú an stáit athraíodh cúram maidir le teagasc na teicneolaíochta ón Roinn Talmhaíochta go dtí an Roinn Oideachais i 1924. Ansin i 1930 tháinig an tAcht um Ghairm-Oideachas i bhfeidhm agus ina dhiaidh sin bhí an scoil faoi chúram Coiste Ghairm-Oideachais Bhaile Átha Cliath. Ag deireadh 1938 bhí breis agus 2,000 mac léinn (idir daltaí lae agus oíche) ar na rollaí. Aistríodh cuid de na cúrsaí go dtí scoileanna eile sa chathair chun an brú a mhaolú.

I 1940 cuireadh cúrsa um dheisiú raidió ar bun chomh maith le cúrsaí réamh-ollscoile sna hábhair eolaíochta; i 1942 bunaíodh cúrsa trí bhliain san innealtóireacht raidió, cúrsaí sa radharcmhastóireacht, phoiticéireacht agus radaghrafaíocht, agus cúrsaí céime de chuid Ollscoil Londain. Ba sna blianta sin a tháinig cruth choláiste thríú leibhéil ar an scoil.

I 1963 tosaíodh ar an bhfoirgneamh atá againn inniu a thógail, agus osclaíodh an coláiste nua go hoifigiúil i mí Mheithimh 1968. Timpeall an ama sin bunaíodh cúrsaí speisialta do theicneoirí, teicneoirí innealtóireachta i 1960, teicneoirí saotharlann leighis i 1963 agus teicneoirí eolaíochta i 1969. Ba sa bhliain 1968 a thosaigh an coláiste ar a chuid ghradam féin a bhronnadh agus i 1975 rinneadh ceangal páirtnéireachta acadúla idir an coláiste agus Coláiste na Tríonóide chun céimeanna na hOllscoile san eolaíocht, sa daonbheathú agus san innealtóireacht a bhronnadh ar mhic léinn a bhaineann amach gradaim chuí ar leith de chuid an choláiste.

Sa bhliain 1978 nascadh sé choláiste thríú leibhéil sa chathair — ina measc an coláiste seo — le chéile chun Institiúid Teicneolaíochta Bhaile Átha Cliath a chruthú, fós faoi réim Choiste Ghairm-Oideachais Bhaile Átha Cliath. Cuireadh leathnú ar an gcoláiste i 1988 — 25 seomra ranga, leabharlann nua agus bialann nua. Ar 1 Eanáir 1993 tháinig Acht Institiúid Teicneolaíochta Bhaile Átha Cliath i bhfeidhm, rud a bhunaigh an Institiúid mar aonad neamhspleách ar an gCoiste Gairm-Oideachais.

Faoi seo tá timpeall 5,000 mac/iníon léinn againn, 2,600 díobh lánaimseartha agus 200 díobh ag gabháil le cláracha iarchéime. Tá taighde iarchéime ag méadú an t-am ar fad agus béim á chur air. Tá deontais chuige seo á mealladh ag ár mbaill fhoirne ó eagrais agus ó chomhlachtaí in Éirinn agus san Eoraip. San athstruchtúrú atá ar siúl san Institiúid neamhspleách nua i gcoitinne, tá sé i gceist go mbeidh an Institiúid leagtha amach ina dámha. San am díreach amach romhainn beidh Dámh na hEolaíochta agus leath de Dhámh na hInnealtóireachta lonnaithe ar Shráid Chaoimhín. Tá sé leaghta orainn go leanfar go dúthrachtach le soláthar cúrsaí agus seirbhísí den scoth sna heolaíochtaí agus sna teicneolaíochtaí, do mhic/iníonacha léinn na cathrach agus na tíre, do chomhlachtaí gnó agus don tsochaí ina hiomláine, amach anseo.

A Strong Tradition of Technological Education in Kevin Street

The first technical school on Kevin Street was founded in October 1887. By the year 1891, when the Technical Instruction in Ireland Act was enacted, there were 513 students, a huge increase from the 78 at the start. Dublin Corporation took over the running of the school in 1893 and obtained grants to provide laboratory equipment. The school then spread to number 37 Kevin Street and by 1897, there were 925 students attending. A new larger school was built and opened in 1901.

After the founding of the state, responsibility for technical instruction passed in 1924 from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Education. Then in 1930 the Vocational Education Act came into force and after that the school came under the jurisdiction of the City of Dublin Vocational Education Committee. At the end of 1938 there were more than 2,000 (both day and evening) pupils on the rolls. Some courses were transferred to other schools around Dublin to relieve the pressure.

In 1940 a course in radio servicing as well as pre-university courses in science subjects were initiated; in 1942 a three-year course in radio engineering, courses in optometry, pharmacy and radiography, and degree courses of the University of London were begun. It was in those years that the school took shape as a third level college.

In 1963 the construction of the present college building was begun and it was officially opened in June 1968. Around that time special courses for technicians were initiated, engineering technicians in 1960, medical laboratory technicians in 1963 and science technicians in 1969. It was in 1968 that the college began to confer its own awards and in 1975 an academic partnership link between the college and Trinity College was formed so that University degrees in science, human nutrition and engineering, would be conferred on students who obtain appropriate awards of the college.

In 1978 six third level colleges in the city – including this college – were amalgamated to create the Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) under the aegis of the City of Dublin Vocational Education Committee (CDVEC). An extension to the college was completed in 1988 – 25 class rooms, a library and restaurants. On I January 1993 the DIT Act was implemented to establish the Institute as an entity independent of the CDVEC.

At the present time we have about 5,000 students, 2,600 full-time and 200 engaged in postgraduate programmes. Postgraduate research is increasing and emphasis is being laid on developing this work. Grants to carry out this work are being attracted by staff members from organisations and companies in Ireland and further afield in Europe. In the re-structuring underway in the new independent Institute, it is being organised it into faculties. In the immediate future the Faculty of Science and part of the Faculty of Engineering will be located in DIT Kevin Street. We are determined, in the years ahead, to continue faithfully to provide courses and services of the highest standard to students from the city and the country, to commercial companies and to society in general.
