Definitions

Delegation:

A division of labor~

- Assignment of specific duties or responsibilities to an individual

Empowerment:

Instilling a sense of power~

- Granting decision-making authority, and/or
- Creating opportunities to influence decisions
- Providing ability to make choices

- Defined expectations
- Communication
- Coaching
- Monitoring
- Feedback
- Trust

Empowerment requires:

- Shared values
- Shared power
- Defined boundaries
- Communication
- Feedback
- Recognition
- Trust

DELEGATION


- PRINCIPLES OF DELEGATION
 - Assign duties to the right people
 - Grant authority to do the job
 - Minimize yo-yo delegation
 - Make due date specific
 - Don't delegate the critical thing you do

- Unconscious Competent




DELEGATING

1. TELL THEM WHAT TO DO
2. SHOW THEM WHAT TO DO
3. LET THEM TRY - OBSERVE
4. PRAISE PROGRESS
5. REPEAT UNTIL COMPETENT
6. TRANSFER THE RESPONSIBILITY
7. MONITOR PERIODICALLY


EMPOWERMENT
