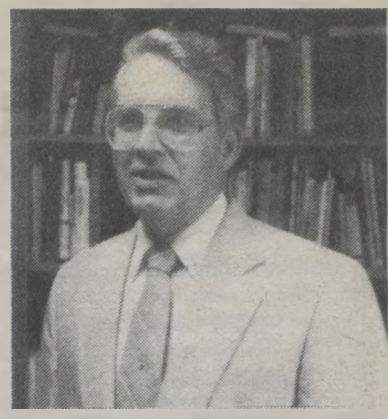

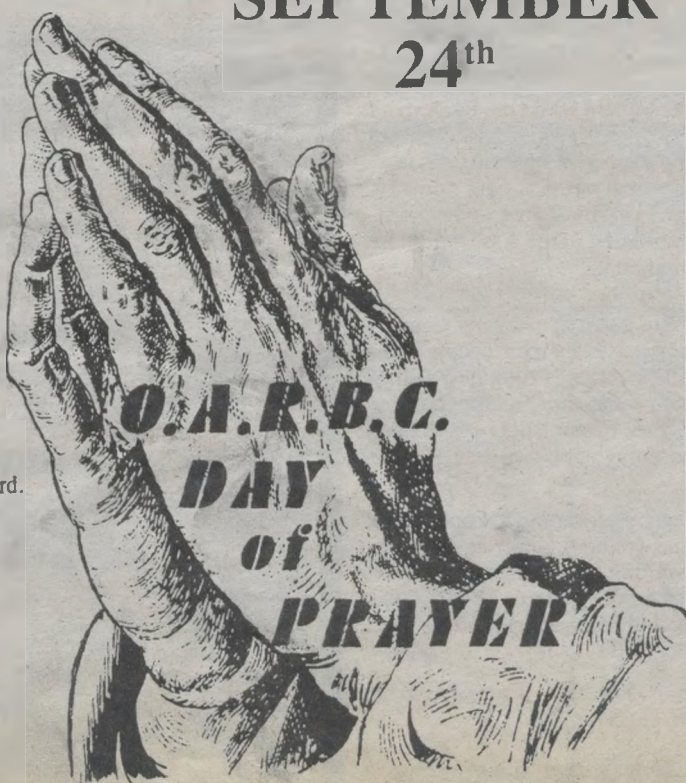

The Second Annual "One Accord" Day of Prayer, sponsored by the Ohio Association of Regular Baptist Churches, will be held on Sunday, September 24, 1989. This special day has been designated by the Council of 12 to be held each year on the last Sunday of September. Last year's inaugural Day of Prayer had great participation, with many special blessings reported by those churches that participated.

During this year's Day of Prayer, all pastors and churches are encouraged to devote their attention to prayer for our fellowship, its churches, pastors, missionaries, and special needs. Several suggestions are offered to help make the Day of Prayer a very meaningful time for our churches:

- 11:00 A.M. TIME OF PRAYER:** All churches are asked to designate 11:00 A.M. in their morning services as a time for "one accord" prayer for our national and state fellowships. Thank Him for His work in our fellowship, and pray for the continuing work of your church and sister O.A.R.B. churches in your area. Many have commented on the special blessing it was during last year's Day of Prayer to realize that our hearts were united together for the same purpose at the same precise moment before the Lord.
- ASSOCIATION SUNDAY OFFERING:** Consider having an Association Sunday in conjunction with the Day of Prayer observance. While focusing on the blessings of God upon our fellowship, why not use this as a time to show our thanksgiving for our rich heritage by receiving a special love offering for the O.A.R.B.C. General Fund. Pastors are encouraged to share with their congregations information concerning our O.A.R.B.C. fellowship.
- AREAWIDE PRAYER SERVICE:** Consider having an areawide Day of Prayer service with sister O.A.R.B.C. churches in your area. An afternoon or evening prayer and praise service helps our churches

to appreciate other brethren in their area who are laboring diligently for the cause of Christ. Those churches that held joint services last year reported a time of great spiritual enrichment and edification. If your area is planning such a service, by all means participate. If your area fellowship is unable to plan this activity, consider joining with another area church for such a service. Last year some churches used this service in place of their regular evening service. Others may choose to participate in an afternoon service and still conduct their own evening service. Suggested formats for such a service are available from Pastor Ken Floyd.

- 4. PRAYER BULLETINS:** Use the specially designed O.A.R.B.C. prayer bulletin insert to pray for specific areas of need. This bulletin includes special items of prayer that are appropriate for a special prayer service. A master copy of the prayer bulletin has been included in the Day of Prayer packets sent to each church.
- 5. RE-EMPHASIZING PRAYER:** All pastors and church members are encouraged to use this day as an opportunity to re-emphasize the importance of prayer in the life of individual believers and the local church. Renew your commitment to participate in the regular prayer meetings of your church. Renew your commitment to making prayer a regular part of your daily schedule, seeking a closer time of fellowship and growth with God.

# As I See It

## "WHAT A FELLOWSHIP!"

As you read this, I will have finished just four months serving as your new State Representative. As Pat and I have had the opportunity to begin to move around among the churches, we have already been impressed with the strength and vitality of our Association and our churches. Though I have a long way to go in getting to know all of you personally, I have had contact with enough pastors so far to be convinced that God has indeed blessed our fellowship with some outstanding leaders in our pulpits across the state. We have discovered that we have many keen, Godly young men who have a great burden for souls, and who are walking with God. They are anxious to be effective in reaching their communities for Christ. We also have many dedicated veteran pastors who have faithfully proclaimed God's Word for many years. They bring great experience and maturity to our fellowship.

Just stop to ponder for a bit what it means to be "The Church of the Living God." He has given to us "the exceeding greatness of His power...according to the working of His mighty power, which He wrought in Christ, when He raised Him from the dead..." It astounds me just to think of the power God has made available to us as "the church, which is His Body, the fullness of Him that filleth all in all." Oh my, what a force we are! What a potential we have for God! What possibilities of great ministry! What a power to serve God and accomplish His work in bringing Christ to at least our part of the world!

In His wisdom God has drawn us together into a fellowship to work together to reach Ohio with the Gospel. We do not stand alone. We each are a part of a great team of workers dedicated to getting a big job done. That is the Biblical pattern. These are the words the Bible uses to describe the relationship of God's people to one another:

fellow-citizen	fellow-prisoners

fellow-heirs	fellow-soldier
fellow-helpers	fellow-workers
fellow-laborers	yoke-fellow

There is indeed a sound Biblical basis for such a fellowship as the Ohio Association of Regular Baptist Churches.

One of the best and most enjoyable aspects of fellowship is that of getting together to enjoy the company of friends. Which is just one reason why we have an Annual Conference each year in October. We need this time together. You need it! We need you! Now is the time for you to plan to be with us for the meeting. It should be on your schedule and nothing should be permitted to conflict with this date. It is always held the third week in October. This year the date is October 16 to 18, Monday evening through Wednesday noon. It is to be held in the lovely new facilities of the Nottingham Baptist Church of Willoughby Hills, which is just east of Cleveland.

Elsewhere in this issue are more details of the conference, including the list of speakers. The main speaker will be Dr. David Jeremiah, who, of course, had his roots right here in Ohio. He is now serving as the Senior Pastor of the Scott Memorial Baptist Church in San Diego, California. God has given Brother Jeremiah a tremendously effective ministry. He has a radio broadcast that is heard nation-wide. He serves also as Chancellor of Christian Heritage College, and has an extensive Bible conference and writing ministry. He spoke recently at the Summer Enrichment Conference for alumni at Cedarville College. He has an excellent balance of Biblical exposition, illustration, humor, and convicting challenge. I can promise you, you will go away motivated to return home and do an even better job for God.

Also the council of 12 has asked me to take an hour to share with the Association the burden that God has placed on my heart for this work. I am very anxious for all of you who love this Association and want to be a vital part of it to be present for this presentation. I will be presenting a VISION FOR MINISTRY for the OARBC, and especially for the office of State Representative. I do not take this position lightly. I have put much prayer and thought into formulating my vision for the ministry, and I want to share it with all of you. I am truly excited about what God is doing here in our state. Please let me share that excitement with you. Remember the old adage: "If you aim at nothing, you are sure to hit it every time." It is necessary that we have clearly thought through goals for our ministry. Some will be personal goals, what I will endeavor to accomplish as a part of my own responsibilities. Others will be Association goals, things I would like to promise to the Association for your consideration for our churches as a fellowship to undertake.

Another very important part of our fellowship is the leadership given to us by our Council of 12. It is a great privilege of mine to work with these men. They are Godly men, deeply committed to the Lord and to His work and to our Association. The election is right now taking place. Each church has received a ballot in the mail, along with a statistical report form for your church. Please, I implore you to fill these out and return them to Pastor Bill Davis of Bedford, who is the secretary of the council. Thank you for doing that for us.

A closing word about my own ministry so far. Pat and I are enjoying getting to know some of you better by visiting in your churches. God has given us some wonderful meetings. We are now doing some counseling with some pastors and some consulting and advising as we are requested by our churches. ## "THERE'S GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS" AT CHRISTIAN BIBLE

As reported by Pastor Lawrence Shells, Christian Bible Baptist of Youngstown has been plagued over the past several months with severe leaking in the roof over the fellowship hall. In late June, because of storms, the roof caved in and water damage caused the loss of a piano and the carpeting as well. Partial repairs have been made but the church has been advised that the entire roof should be reconstructed to prevent further deterioration, at an estimated cost of \$1,000.00.

On the "Good News" side, because of the generosity of the ADOPT-A-CHURCH program, which graciously provided all the funds to install the new gas heating system, the East Ohio Gas Company proffered a budget payment plan to the church of \$65.00 per month, beginning this September. That is a considerable savings as opposed to the \$500.00 plus per month, previously, for electric heat.

*(Editor's Note: Perhaps some of you churches would be willing to help Christian Bible again with a gift to help in this crisis - even a "change-in-your-pocket" offering during one of your services. Many of the folks in this church are on welfare and are giving as much as they can. Let's help them out. Or you might even consider putting Christian Bible in your budget.)*

### INSTALLATION SERVICE FOR NEW PASTOR

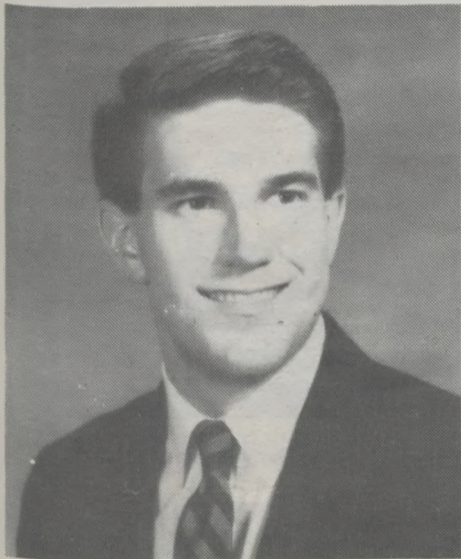

### OUT OF THE PAST — 62 YEARS AGO! FIRST O.A.R.B.C. CONFERENCE

(Account of the first Annual Meeting of the O.A.R.B.C. which was the organizational meeting in October of 1928 at Central Baptist Church, Columbus, as reported in the November, 1928 OHIO REGULAR BAPTIST.)

"The Gospel Helper" of the Fostoria Baptist Church says, "Tuesday, October 31st, about noon, marked a significant moment in the Baptist history of this State." It was then that a group of Bible-believing and evangelistic Baptists, long weary of the fight to expel modernism from existing Conventions, adopted a Constitution, By-Laws and Declaration of Faith for the "UNION OF REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCHES OF OHIO" (now the OHIO ASSOCIATION OF REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCHES).

Two days were spent together in Convention in the Central Baptist Church of Columbus. These were days filled with prayer, praise, and spiritual power. Masterly messages were brought to us by Missionary Joseph McCaba, of Africa; R.T. Ketcham, of Elyria; and President H.C. Wayman of Des Moines University.

It is our purpose in this article to point out the offices provided by the newly adopted Constitution and to say a word concerning the function of the committee.

An Executive Committee of nine was elected and the following men were named: President, R.T. Ketcham, Elyria; Vice President, H.O. VanGilder, Columbus; Secretary, Miss Ruth Taylor, Elyria; Treasurer, L.W. Beckley, Fostoria; Chairman of Committee on Missions, E.G. Griffith, Toledo; Chairman of Committee on Bible Schools and Young People's Work, R.H. Stoll, Sandusky; Chairman of Committee on Bible Conferences and Evangelism, C.E. Bacon, Medina; Chairman of Committee on Publication, M.M. Hanenkrat, Findlay; and Editor of the Official Organ, C.E. Garvin, LaGrange.

It is the responsibility of the Committee on Missions to investigate proper missionary channels and advise the constituency of the Union of approved agencies. No agency can be called approved which will not subscribe to the Articles of Faith adopted by this Union.

The Committee on Bible Schools and Young People's Work shall endeavor to promote harmony and fellowship between the various organizations across the state. They shall promote Summer Rallies similar to the one held at Erieside last August. It shall also be the work of this committee to recommend suitable literature for use in the different schools and societies.

The work of the Committee on Bible Conferences and Evangelism is one of great importance. This committee will seek to help the various churches, especially the weaker ones, to plan for Bible conferences and evangelistic campaigns. If your church desires such a conference, get in touch with the chairman of the committee.

The official Organ of the Union is the OHIO REGULAR BAPTIST (now the OHIO INDEPENDENT BAPTIST). This paper will appear monthly and will carry news of the Union, inspirational messages and news from local churches. The circulation and financing of this organ rests upon the Committee of Publication.

The Chairmen of these committees, by virtue of their office, become members of the Executive Committee (now the Council of 12) and are directly responsible to the Union. May I suggest that each church make use of these committees in their respective fields and seek to help them in their work.

(Thus began THE OHIO ASSOCIATION OF REGULAR BAPTIST CHURCHES, which has grown in number of churches from 15, as reported after the second annual conference in 1929, to the 207 churches of today. But does our beloved Association mean as much to us today as it did to those 15? We give our answer by our participation. Plan now to attend the 62nd Annual Conference at Nottingham, October 16, 17 & 18. — Editor)



## ON TARGET WITH MISSIONS

### "BOY, ARE WE SPOILED!"

At times prayer letters can describe the life and work of missionaries extremely well. The following is from a letter by Jon and Patricia Hall, short-term missionaries to the Central African Republic:

"Am I spoiled!" was the thought as I skimmed the bugs off the cooking macaroni.

"Boy, are we spoiled!" Jon exclaimed as he discovered we had not put water into our filtering system - no drinking water.

"Hey, Mom, we're out of peanut butter!" David laments. "I'll roast peanuts in the oven after I bake bread tomorrow, then make the peanut butter when the power comes on the next day." I answer.

Time; planning ahead; consistency, are an important part of our lives here. We can't go to the kitchen sink for a glass of cold water - we have to take the time to clean and fill our filtering system then wait for the water to go through before we have safe, drinkable water. Time has to be taken to store food properly or you gain added protein from little creatures quickly. Time to preserve or make some foods - peanut butter, mayonnaise, jams/jellies, breads - we can't just run to the store and buy these things.

If we want chicken, we buy one alive then dress it out for the meal. Meat is bought in chunks then time taken to clean, cut, and grind. The kerosene refrigerator smokes up, blackening the ceiling and walls with greasy soot; three days are taken to scrub top to bottom and everything in the cupboards (soot has seeped in them as well). Time!

Jon has had to take time to make tools to get jobs done. He plans a job and then African help doesn't show up or the tools "walk away." Perhaps the wrong materials are sent for a job - that job waits another six months after reordering. Time is taken just to live in/with the environment as the heat saps strength and only half a day's work is done. Termites are discovered in a building and all other work comes to a halt as the men take time to exterminate.

Time for sermons, classes, and lessons. Take time for the leper who comes to the door hungry. Take time with the old woman selling tomatoes (and time to clean the tomatoes). Time to dig out the tracts in Arabic for the Boro woman to take to her husband.

Please, pray that we will take more time for our Lord and His Word.

"To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:" Ecclesiastes 3:1.

### MEN FOR MISSIONS - A WORLD OF OPPORTUNITIES

When Baptist Mid-Missions began its MEN FOR MISSIONS ministry several years ago little did I realize that it would grow to what it is today. It has not only reached out across the United States and Canada to touch thousands of lives, but the potential of the program is staggering.

It is not uncommon for 25% of the mail and the phone calls that reach my desk each day to have something to do with the MEN FOR MISSIONS ministry. Correspondence, phone calls, and even conversation with men out in the churches are often MEN FOR MISSIONS related.

MEN FOR MISSIONS is definitely a unique ministry which provides numerous opportunities for men and women to use their time, talents and energy for the great cause of missions. Hundreds have joyfully discovered that their practical ability is in plumbing, carpentry, electrical, mechanics, medical, etc., and can be used to help in a work that is close to their hearts - missions. Men from all kinds of vocations have successfully participated in MEN FOR MISSIONS. One team member was heard to say that it was his privilege to carry cement in a wheelbarrow so the block layers could do their jobs. The interesting thing about it all is that the man who pushes that wheelbarrow could be a top executive of one of the leading companies in America. On the other end of the line, the block layer could be a commercial airplane pilot. That's what makes MEN FOR MISSIONS so unique. That's why the program draws men to it like a magnet.

A recent issue of THE VOLUNTEER, the official publication of Baptist Mid-Missions' MEN FOR MISSIONS program, carried an article on the front page entitled "I Can Never Be The Same Again." This same terminology has been used by others returning from the mission field. The flavor of this statement has permeated the heart and lives of hundreds of both men and women who have taken part in one way or another in work projects.

It has been reported to me time and time again by pastors, team leaders and even other team members that upon their return back home, one of the first questions usually asked is "How soon can we do it again?" From one who is very much involved in the MEN FOR MISSIONS ministry, I can assure you that the news of MEN FOR MISSIONS as well as the results of its activities are spreading into churches, small, medium and large, across America. There are organized MEN FOR MISSIONS groups numbering anywhere from six men to over 200 men. It is a blessing to this writer's heart when I hear of such groups, large and small, meeting on a regular basis. Perhaps one of the more recent exciting news that I have heard is the talk among the state area fellowship group to form a MEN FOR MISSIONS fellowship following somewhat the pattern that the women in that particular fellowship are already doing. I have often said that as men endeavoring to promote missions we can learn much from the example of what the women are already doing in their areas as well as state fellowships. I am convinced that MEN FOR MISSIONS could be the instrument used by the Lord to involve men in the churches on a greater scale, individually and collectively, in the churches and in areas and statewide MEN FOR MISSIONS fellowships. It is refreshing to hear of those whose thinking is in this vein of thought.

### ORDINATION OF E.B.M. MISSIONARY

On Thursday, May 25, an ordination council met at the Emmanuel Baptist Church in Xenia, Ohio, to examine Mr. Jeffrey Cook as to his call and preparation for the Gospel ministry. Following a thorough examination by the council of 18 men, it was unanimously recommended that the church proceed with ordination. Chairman for the council was Rev. Lawrence Fezter, State Representative for the Ohio Association of Regular Baptist Churches, and clerk was Gary Holtz, member of the host church.

The ordination service was held on Sunday evening, May 28, with Dr. David Marshall, President of Evangelical Baptist Missions, bringing the ordination message. Retired U.S. Navy chaplain, Robert Mitchell, brought the charge to the candidate and Dr. R. William Wheeler, pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church, brought the charge to the church.

Rev. Cook and his wife, Inga, have recently completed their first term as missionaries to West Germany under Evangelical Baptist Missions. They have planted one church in Germany, working with American military families, and began their second work before returning to the United States for a short furlough.

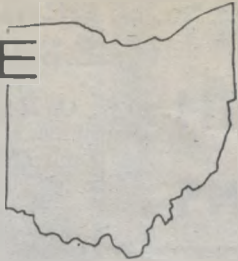

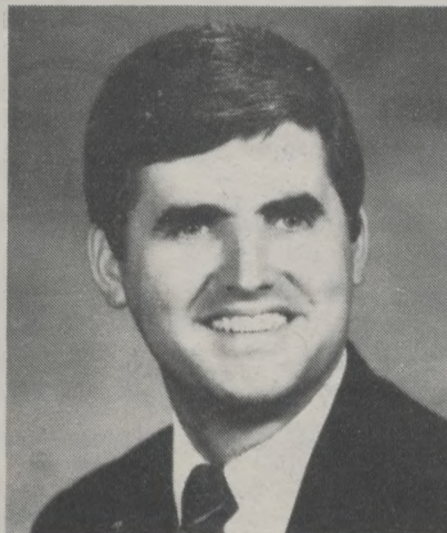
## FAITH STUDENT RECEIVES AWARD FROM AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY

The FBBC&S staff busily prepared to support almost 300 conferees in separate conferences held at Faith Baptist Bible College and Seminary during May, July and August.

The Committee on Missionary Evangelism (COME), Baptist Mid-Missions (BMM) North American Field Council, Continental Baptist Missions (CBM), and Campus Bible Fellowship (CBF) held conferences on campus where each met to attend prayer meetings, seminars, preaching and business meetings.

Approximately 60 COME conferees met May 20-24. CBM held its Family Conference from July 11-14. One hundred seventeen people attended while 40 people stayed in campus housing. CBF's conference gathered about 50 people on the Faith campus for its conference during August 1-5. The BMM field council numbered 120 people at its conference from August 7-11.

**TWO SCHOLARSHIPS APPROVED BY FBBC&S BOARD**

The Board of Directors of Faith Baptist Bible College and Seminary have approved two new scholarship funds. These new missionary scholarships are the Far Eastern Missionary Scholarship and the International Students Scholarship.

Department of Missions and Evangelism Chairman, Earl J. Dannenberg, explains that these new scholarships are currently being built through gifts to these scholarships.

The Far Eastern Scholarship will assist students with a burden for the Far East countries. The International Students Scholarship will be applied to the tuition, room and board of a foreign student already involved in ministry and desiring further Christian education. 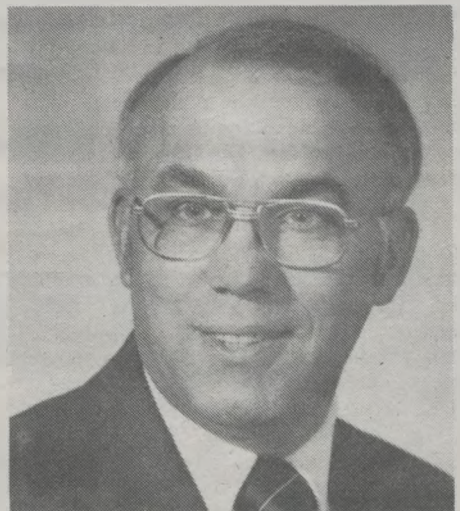
Burke led the squad to a record 11 and 10. With successful recruiting efforts, Coach Burke anticipates even better results from the Lady Comets next season.

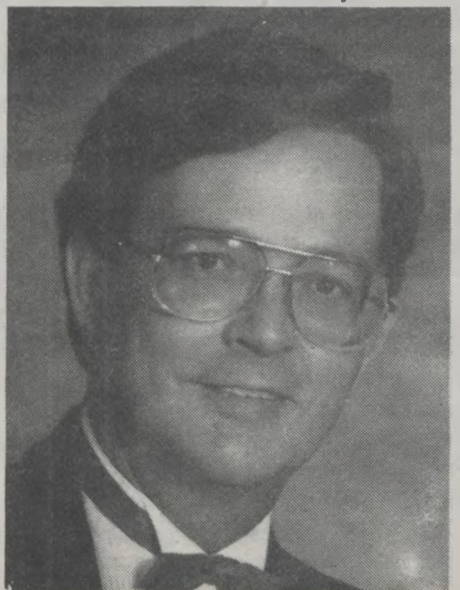
**NEW APPOINTMENTS**
