MEWS REVIEW OF THE SEMESTER

THIRD TRI-STATE CABINET CHOSEN AS 1300 STUDENTS ENROLL

__YEAR 1245___

December 11----

After two woeks of vacation, Tri-State high school mened its doors again to 1244 students. A new start, a new beginning and there are only ten more weeks until vacatim.

Besides studies, there were many rallies (two to be exact) enjoyed this year.


As usual the seniors had their banquet and ball, both of which were really outstanding affairs.
