wanderings, after the doctor desisted
we we shall drift about in the
summer from one cool place
to another, going home, from
time to time to take a fresh

from Charlie Stoddard, from
Rome, quite cheerful & pleasant,
only longing for us to be with him
as he got rather lonely at times -
I cannot write more, it is my
right side that has been affected
& my hand gives out -
