Portage March 31st 1880

Dear John

I very gladly
 received your letter of arrival in
 San Fran - I had feared that
 some evil had befallen you in
 that band of many strangers -
 as you were longer in writing
 than usual - but our
 ever faithful and covenant -
 keeping God has preserved you
 in the midst of many trials
 and dangers, and even gave
 you many friends that showed
 you no little kindness - although
 you were in a band of strangers
 how much we have to be thankful for

Joseph and I have spent the winter here by ourselves - her health still improves and so does her eyesight - she is now able to read and sew she wishes to send her kindest regards to you and hopes you will send her the Bulletin you talked of - we would all like to see some of your writings -

Mary came home at Christmas and made a visit when she went home Anne went with her, and is still at Phillips.

Daniel came home on the 12th of this month and spent a

week with us, when he left us he intended to go to Nebraska in two weeks taking a man with him and a car load of animals and other things to begin his farm with - he intended to take his own family out in the fall - he has three little girls and has named one of them for Sarah - David and his family are well, he is still tugging away in the store busier as ever - Sarah came home while Dan was home and is more like herself again they are all well -

Mary & John & family are well he intends going to Nebraska this summer - your father
