Dear Brother John:

are you quite well we are all pretty well here. I am attending the high school I like it very well Mary and myself stay up stairs most of the time where Miss Briggs teaches I like her first rate we recite all of our lessons to Miss Briggs with the exception of our grammar before we go down to Mr Magoffin to recite that. The Saturday before last was George Washingtons birthday and there was a celebration among the schools we all gathered at the school house as usual in the morning at about 9 oclock and Mr Carrwell lent us eighteen little flags well after all

Bandercooks hall and then we  
sang the red white and blue  
then Mr Magoffin read part
