March 2d Dear Brother John: are you quite well we are all pretty well here I am attending the high school I like it very well Mary and myself stary up stairs most of the time where mis Brigs teaches I like her firstrate we recite all of our lessons to this Brigs with the exception of our grammer lefron we go down to Mr Magoffin to recite that . the saturday before last was George Washing tons birthday and there to wees a celebration among the schools we all gathered at the school house as usual in the morning at about a oclock and Mix Carswell lent us eighteen little flags well after all
