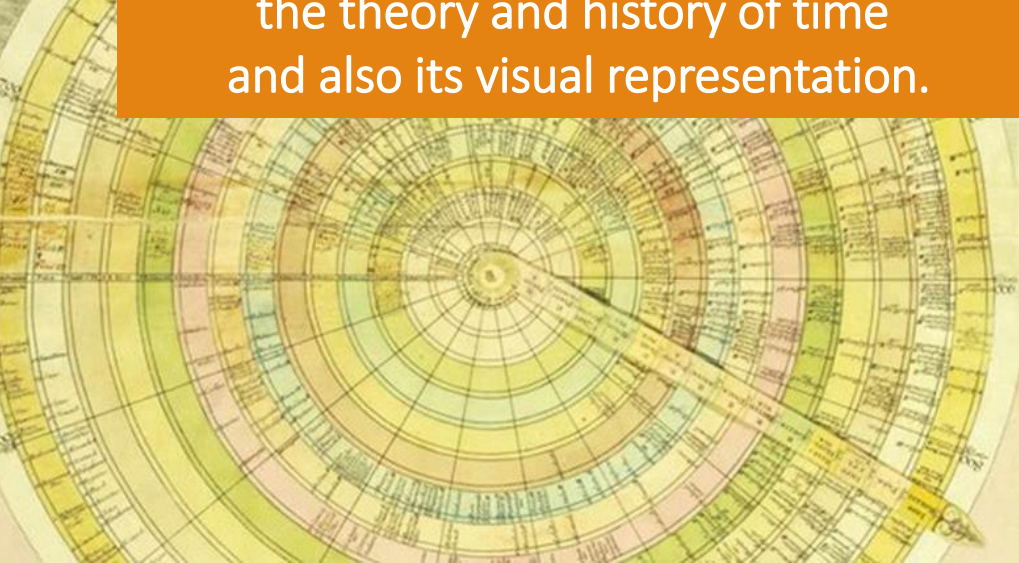

CIVIL RIGHTS TIMELINE

HIGHLIGHTING SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN UNITED STATES HISTORY THAT ADVANCED CIVIL RIGHTS

1820 The Missouri Compromise is created so that the United States is made up of 12 free states and 12 slave states.

1861 The Southern states secede from the Union. The Civil War begins.

1863 President Abraham Lincoln issues the Emancipation Proclamation, freeing all slaves in the rebelling states.

1865 The 13th Amendment is passed, abolishing slavery and involuntary servitude.

1870 The 14th Amendment is passed. Equal protection is guaranteed and promised to all persons under the law.

1870 The 15th Amendment is passed. No states may deny voting rights based on race, color or previous condition of servitude.

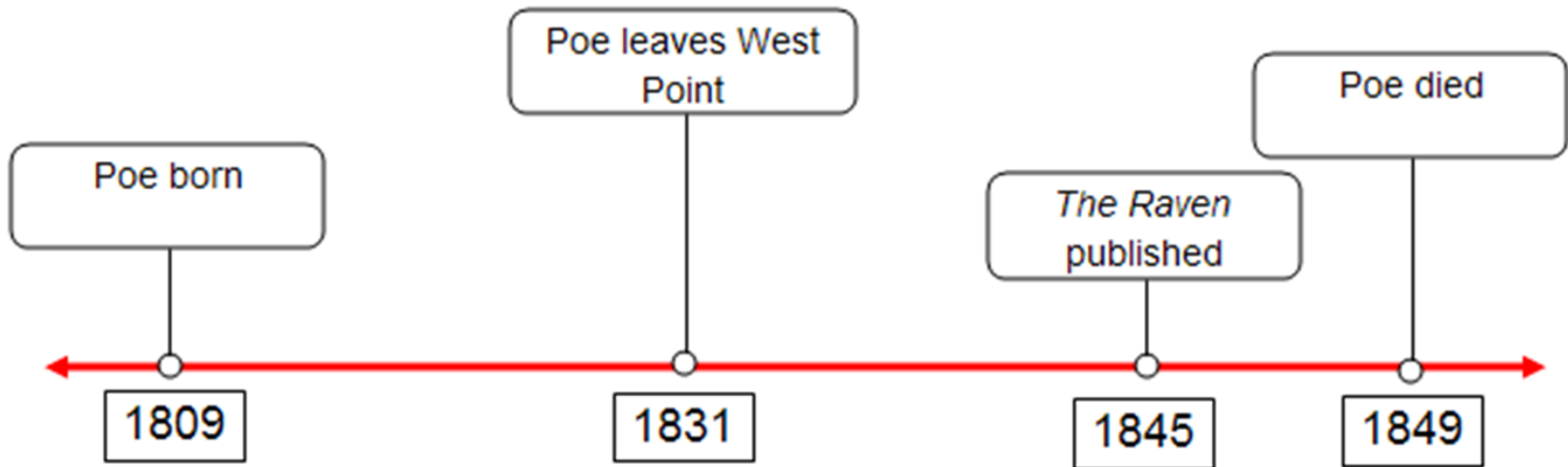

Also discussed were timeline benefits and drawbacks, e.g., timelines inadvertently can flaw historical interpretation because:

- Sequencing implies events relate to another and an earlier event caused following events.
- Events appear as abrupt changes without transition or influence.
- Simplicity leaves out struggles, complexities, and related multiplicity of details that convey a more accurate accounting.
- Traditional timelines present only one view, one “argument,” in the guise of objective reality.



Digital timelines mitigate and even solve some of these problems with linkages for tiered communication and the multiple perspectives option as seen in The Path of Protest and Texas History Timeline.

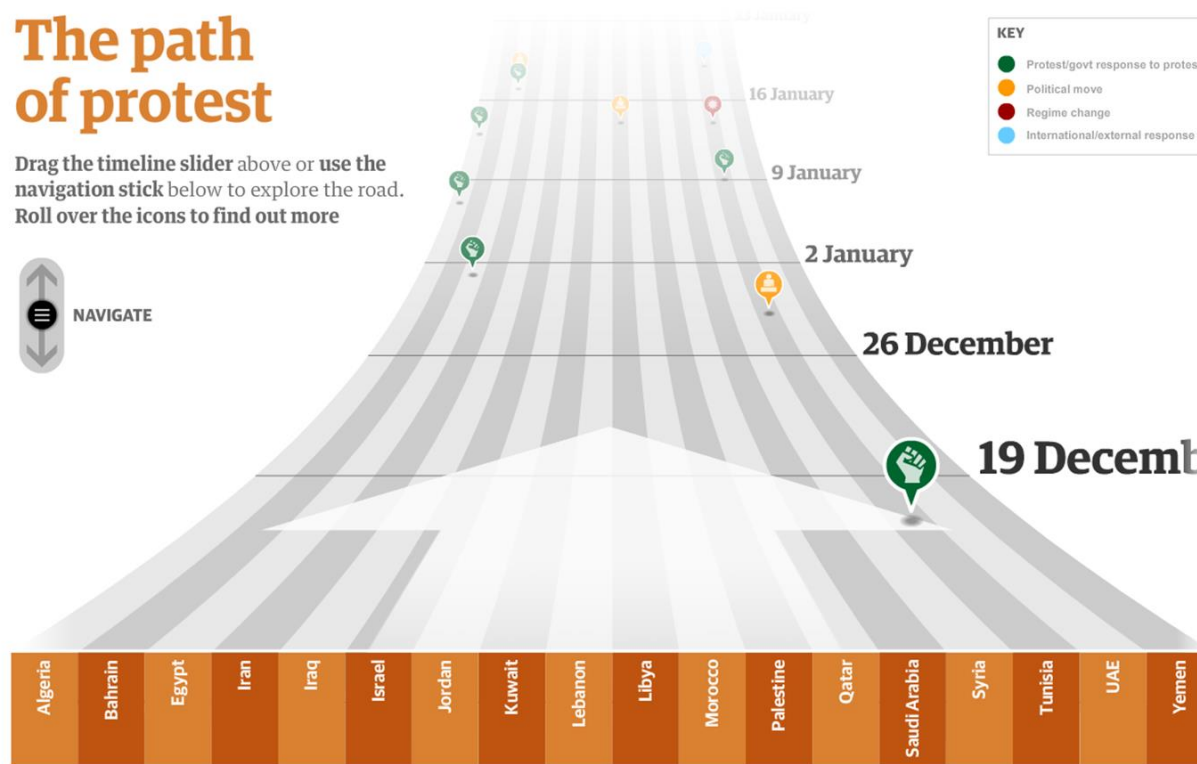

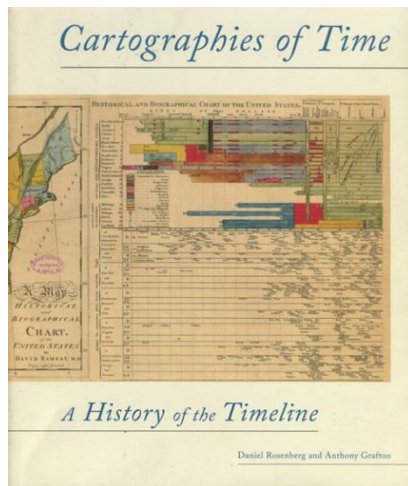
