CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois and Southern Illinois, two teams still seeking consistency on the football field, will square off in a Gateway Conference game Saturday (Sept. 28) at SIU's McAndrew Stadium. Kickoff is 1:30.

This is the first Gateway Conference game for the Panthers, who are 2-1 overall and the preseason pick to win the league title. SIU is 1-3 and 0-1 in conference action.

EIU eked out a 35-27 victory over Saginaw Valley this past Saturday while the Salukis lost to Drake 31-6.

"There have been some great games between Eastern and Southern the past few years," says Coach Al Molde, "and now that we're in the same league it just adds more interest to a strong instate rivalry."

The Panthers will field a healthy unit as Molde expects to start the same offensive unit that has averaged nearly 33 points a game and 492 yards total offense.

The defense also has not had any injuries since the start of the year however coordinator Larry Edlund said it may be midweek before the starting unit is determined.

Eastern Illinois University (2-1) at Southern Illinois (1-2, 0-1), 1:30, THE GAME: Saturday, Sept. 28, McAndrew Stadium, Carbondale.

RADIO: All the action can be heard on 50,000 watt Mattoon WLBH-FM, 97 on the dial . . . Ken Wooddell calls play-by-play with Doug Bock providing commentary . . . pregame begins with the Al Molde Show at 1:15.

COACHES: EIU's Al Molde, in his third season, is 17-9 here, 91-51-6 (63.5%) overall in 15 seasons . . . he has had 11 winning seasons and four NCAA playoff teams coaching at Sioux Falls College, Minn-Morris, Central Missouri . . . he is 0-2 vs. SIU.

> SIU's Ray Dorr, in his second season, is 4-10 as a collegiate head coach . . . he previously spent 13 years as Don James assistant at Kent State and Washington . . . while at Washington, Dorr was offensive coordinator when the Huskies won two Rose Bowls, the 1979 Sun Bowl and the inaugural Aloha Bowl.

- SERIES: SIU leads the series, 30-18-1 since this rivalry was renewed in 1979 the Salukis hold a slim 3-2 edge . . . four of the five games have been decided by a touchdown or less with the largest margin of victory a 20-7 EIU win in 1982.
- LAST YEAR: SIU jumped to a 41-13 halftime lead and held off a furious Panther second half rally to spoil EIU's Homecoming with a 48-40 victory . . . QB Sean Payton was 27-54-3 passing for 384 yards and four TDs to earn league 'player of the week' honors . . . WR Roy Banks caught eight for 126 yards . . . EIU was driving for a potential tying score when a Payton pass was intercepted at the E39 with a little over two minutes remaining.
- SIU FACTS: The Salukis jumped to a great start with a 63-0 win over Lincoln (MO) University but then lost their Gateway opener, 40-28 to Southwest Missouri . . . two weeks ago SIU played Illinois to the wire before losing 28-25 and then dropped the 31-6 game at Drkae . . redshirt freshman Kevin Brown has won the QB battle ahead of sophomore Pat King . . . however the Salukis are predominantly a running team as Brown has thrown for 270 yards with King getting 211 . . . sophomore tailback Byron Mitchell and junior fullback Bruce Phibbs have rushed for 330 and 256 yards, respectively . . . the Saluki offense is getting 326 yards p/game while allowing 308 and scoring 30 points while giving up 24 . . . linebacker Rick Spielman leads the defense with 53 tackles, linebacker Frank Carr is next with 49 and strong safety John Field follows with 46 . . . punter Drew Morrison will be a factor as his 43.1 average is among the nation's top five.
- ESPN HONORS PAYTON: QB Sean Payton (Naperville-Central) was chosen the ESPN 'Player of the Day' for his record-breaking passing against Saginaw Valley . . . his Saturday records were:

PASSING YARDAGE, GAME: 509 (old, 486 by Payton vs.

Southwest Missouri, 1984)

TOTAL OFFENSE, GAME: 507 (old, 498 by Payton vs.

Southwest Missouri, 1984)

PASSES COMPLETED, GAME: 40 (old, 34 by Payton vs.

Northern Iowa, 1984)

TIED, PASSES ATTEMPTED, GAME: 58 (also by Payton vs. UNI).

His 40-58-3 day also included four TD passes which raises his career total to 37 total passes, No. 2 on the all-time EIU list trailing Jeff Christensen's 51 total.

- MORE PAYTON: Payton is also moving up on Poke Cobb's No. 2 standing for total offense, and could pass him this week at Southern . . . Payton has 4906 total yards and needs 256 to top Cobb's 5161 . . . Jeff Christensen is the No. 1 man with 6185 yards.
- BANKS, TOO: Junior WR Roy Banks (Detroit-King) has cracked EIU's top five in receiving yardage with 1620 . . . his 21 TD receptions is No. 3 on that list and tied for fifth in total TDs scored . . right now Banks has caught 95 passes in his career, and only played in 16 collegiate contests.
- HOW 'BOUT PIERCE: The emphasis on stopping Roy Banks has allowed slotback Calvin Pierce (Robbins-Oak Lawn Richards) to assume the role as the top statistical receiver . . . he has caught 26 passes for 380 yards . . . he is No. 1 in the country in receiving yardage and No. 4 in passes caught p/game (8.7) . . . his 186 yards last week was No. 3 on EIU's single game list, and only nine shy of Willie White's 195 school mark.

OTHER NCAA I-AA STAT TALK:

Payton is No. 4 in total offense at 334 p/game, and No. 2 in passing yards with 1040 . . . Banks is T7th in receptions p/game . . . running back DuWayne Pitts (Detroit-MacKenzie) is No. 9 in rushing at 124.7 and No. 13 in all-purpose running at 159 . . . the team total offense is No. 3 at 492 yards, passing offense is No. 4 at 346.7 and scoring offense No. 12 at 32.7 ppg.
