

### Breeder Hens up 12 Percent

All heavy turkey breeder hens on Texas farms December 1, 1979 totaled 533,000, according to the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. This is 12 percent above the 475,000 on hand December 1 a year earlier.

The December 1, 1979 value of breeder hens on farms was \$8.3 million. The average value per bird was \$15.50, up \$2.50 from the past year.

### 26 STATES

### Breeder Hen Inventory Up 10 Percent

Turkey breeder hens on December 1, 1979 in 26 States totaled 3.70 million head, up 10 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 3.36 million were heavy breeds, up 8 percent, and 343 thousand were light breeds, up 38 percent from December 1, 1978.

## TURKEYS RAISED 1979 AND 1980 INTENTIONS

#### **TEXAS**

Texas turkey growers intend to produce 6 percent more turkeys in 1980 compared with 1979 according to the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

If growers carry out their intentions, approximately 8,500,000 turkeys will be raised compared with 8,000,000 a year ago.

In 1979, there were 8,000,000 turkeys raised in Texas. This number is up 10 percent from 1978.

#### **20 SELECTED STATES**

### Turkey grower intentions above 1979

Turkey growers in 20 major States intend to raise 164 million turkeys in 1980 compared with 150 million in 1979.

The number of turkeys actually raised in 1980 may vary from growers's intentions shown in this report depending on feed prices, supply and price of hatching eggs and poults, and prices growers receive for turkeys during the next few months.

#### UNITED STATES

### Turkeys Raised in 1979 Increased 13 Percent From 1978

In 1979, turkeys raised in the United States, increased 13 percent from 1978. Heavy breed turkeys totaled 145 million, up 11 percent from a year ago, and light breeds totaled 11.3 million, up 41 percent from 1978.
