**Dennis Zeisler** has been on the faculty of Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia for 35 years serving as Director of Bands, Professor of Clarinet and Saxophone and Chair of the Music Department. Mr. Zeisler is a graduate of the University of Michigan where he was solo clarinetist of the Symphony Band under the direction of Dr. William D. Revelli. He was solo clarinetist of the Detroit Concert Band under the direction of Dr. Leonard Smith and clarinet soloist with the United States Military Academy Band at West Point. Mr. Zeisler is a past recipient of the Virginia Music Educator of the Year Award, is a member of the American Bandmasters Association and is the founder and conductor of the Virginia Wind Symphony. He is on the Board of Directors of the National Band Association, The John Philip Sousa Foundation, The Midwest Clinic and holds the office of President of the American Bandmasters Association.

**Alexander Treviño** is the Director of Athletic Bands and Associate Director of Bands at Old Dominion University. Dr. Treviño established the first-ever marching band program in the history of Old Dominion in 2009. The band began rehearsing in the fall of 2008 and has since performed in exhibition and in public performances throughout the Commonwealth. Dr. Treviño also teaches music education courses in the Department of Music and conducts the Symphonic Band.

Dr. Treviño holds a PhD. in Music Education from the University of Washington and a Master of Music in Instrumental Conducting degree from The University of Tennessee. He also holds the Bachelor of Music in Music Education degree from the University of Texas at Austin.

Jubilatéo was commissioned for the 100th anniversary of the Calgary stampede Show Band of Calgary, Alberta. This wonderful ensemble has a rich history with the world -amous Calgary Stampede as well as numerous appearances around the globe as musical ambassadors of their city. This piece was premiered on February 28, 2012 at the Rozsa Center on the University of Calgary campus.

<i>Mountain Thyme</i> was commissioned by the Mangelson Family and the Westlake High School Band of Saratoga Springs, Utah, Brek C. Mangelson, conductor. It was composed in memory of Garrett Kenton Mangelson (January 17, 2009-June 29, 2011). <i>Mountain Thyme</i> was premiered on December 12, 2012.
"Last year, Brek Mangelson contacted me and, in a lengthy, heartbreaking email, asked if I would compose a memorial piece for his two-year-old son who recently passed in a tragic home accident. I was honestly concerned that I could not bring myself to write such a piece. At last year's Midwest Clinic, Brek personally approached me and convinced me that I could. <i>Mountain Thyme</i> is the result. I based it on the gorgeous Irish folk song <i>The Braes of Balquhidder</i> . The lyrics of the folk song reference a boy asking a girl if she will go to the mountain and pick the flower wild mountain thyme that grows around the purple heather, the final line being, "Will ye go, lassie, go?" I wrote this setting from the viewpoint of young Garrett, waiting in Heaven for his mother, Brooke. He is asking her if she will go to the mountain with him. This piece exists in that moment."  -Samuel Hazo
