



The OA2020 Initiative was established at the 12th Berlin Open Access conference where thought leaders in the global Open Access movement came together to propose concrete actions that would finally offer an incisive, feasible and rapid path to an open information environment.

Building on the 2003 *Berlin Declaration on Open Access to Knowledge in the Humanities*, and the pursuant, urgent *Mission Statement* of 2013, OA2020 proposes the transition to open access by transforming the existing corpus of scientific literature from their current subscription system to open access.

The transformation envisioned by OA2020 is founded on analysis that shows there is enough money within journal publishing to allow for a transition to open access at a minimum – cost-neutral. This analysis is outlined in a widely-read *White Paper* published by the Max Planck Digital Library in April 2015.



El 4 de septiembre de 2018, un grupo de organizaciones nacionales de financiación de la investigación, con el apoyo de la Comisión Europea y el Consejo Europeo de Investigación (ERC por sus siglas en inglés), anunció el lanzamiento de cOAilition S, una iniciativa para hacer que el Acceso Abierto (AA) completo e inmediato a las publicaciones de investigación sea una realidad. Está construido alrededor del Plan S, que consta de un objetivo y 10 principios (Science Europe, 2019). Dicho objetivo es:

"Para 2020, las publicaciones científicas que resulten de investigaciones financiadas con subvenciones públicas otorgadas por los consejos de investigación y organismos de financiación nacionales y europeos participantes, deben publicarse en revistas de acceso abierto compatibles o en plataformas de acceso abierto compatibles".



Guidelines for Transformative Agreements

Below are some of the fundamental guidelines of transformative agreements, as defined by the ESAC Initiative community; a listing of the specific requirements that have been adopted by national consortia and other organizations can be found here <https://esac-initiative.org/guidelines/>.

Transformative agreements are temporary and transitional.

Transformative agreements are meant to enable a swift and irreversible shift away from the subscription model on a global scale, affecting the financial and operational changes required for a fully open access publishing paradigm. While individual transformative agreements have the potential to convert 100% of a given institution or consortium's output to open access publishing, it is the sum of many agreements together that will induce the transition at scale. Naturally, wherein public funds and collective effort have assisted the transformation of a publisher's portfolio to open access, this should remain open access and not revert to paywall access under subscription models.



Assistance with Article Processing Charges (APC)

A number of funding options are available to authors

Research4Life initiative

Corresponding authors based in countries classified by Research4Life as 'Group A' and 'Group B' countries are eligible for a full APC waiver. Corresponding authors based in other countries, or who lack research funding or open access funds to draw upon, may apply for a discretionary waiver.



2

Open Access Membership

The Royal Society Open Access Membership programmes actively encourage open access in scholarly communication. Discounts of up to 25% are offered on each article processing charge. Prepay Membership enables an organisation to cover open access article processing charges incurred by its researchers upfront.

Discretionary waivers

We will consider waiving the APC in cases where authors lack funds and are not eligible for other means of funding support. Editors are not made aware when a waiver has been granted and requests are independent of the peer review process.
