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Preface

Demography is not only a desirable discipline but indispensable in all spheres of life and it is important that everyone has at least basic knowledge of it. The most crucial events in life are births, deaths, migration and marriages and the dynamic changes in them are of great cultural, social, economic and biological salience. Demography as a social science treats these dynamics in both qualitative and quantitative manners.

Demography is the study of human population using both empirical and statistical methods and employs census, survey and vital registration as its common tools. Demographic discipline is concerned with the measurement and discovery of uniformity in the basic process of human birth, death, migration and population growth and these phenomena are treated in both their socioeconomic and biological contexts. Demographic analysis enjoys reality and makes as much use of advanced mathematics as those of any other discipline in the social sciences. However, as interesting as these components are, their interconnectivity is complex to analyze and understood. This could be one of the reasons why students dread the discipline and why its texts are not so common. Among the tools needed to make Demography appealing are reader friendly and practical oriented handbooks with simplified concepts and principles that can be easily understood by all. These are definitely not common in demography especially in the areas of fertility, mortality and migration. This evasiveness is pungent and dangerous for upcoming generations, socio-economic development and the future of the discipline. While most demographic researches or papers end up at the conference tables, a formal packaging that is accessible to all is exigent. A compilation of basic concepts in demography like this is expected to fill this gap and help in popularizing the discipline of demography in our society.

This book is never a total compendium of Demography but a simplified synopsis of ideas and data relating to demographic concepts from reputed authors that will be found useful to all students, lecturers and professional researchers in the field of population. The book is divided into seven chapters with each covering specific and basic themes in demography. All concepts explained in this book are easy to learn and simple to apply. Review questions are also added at the end of each chapter to appraise the reader's understanding of the chapter.
