Dear Interscholastic Leaguer:



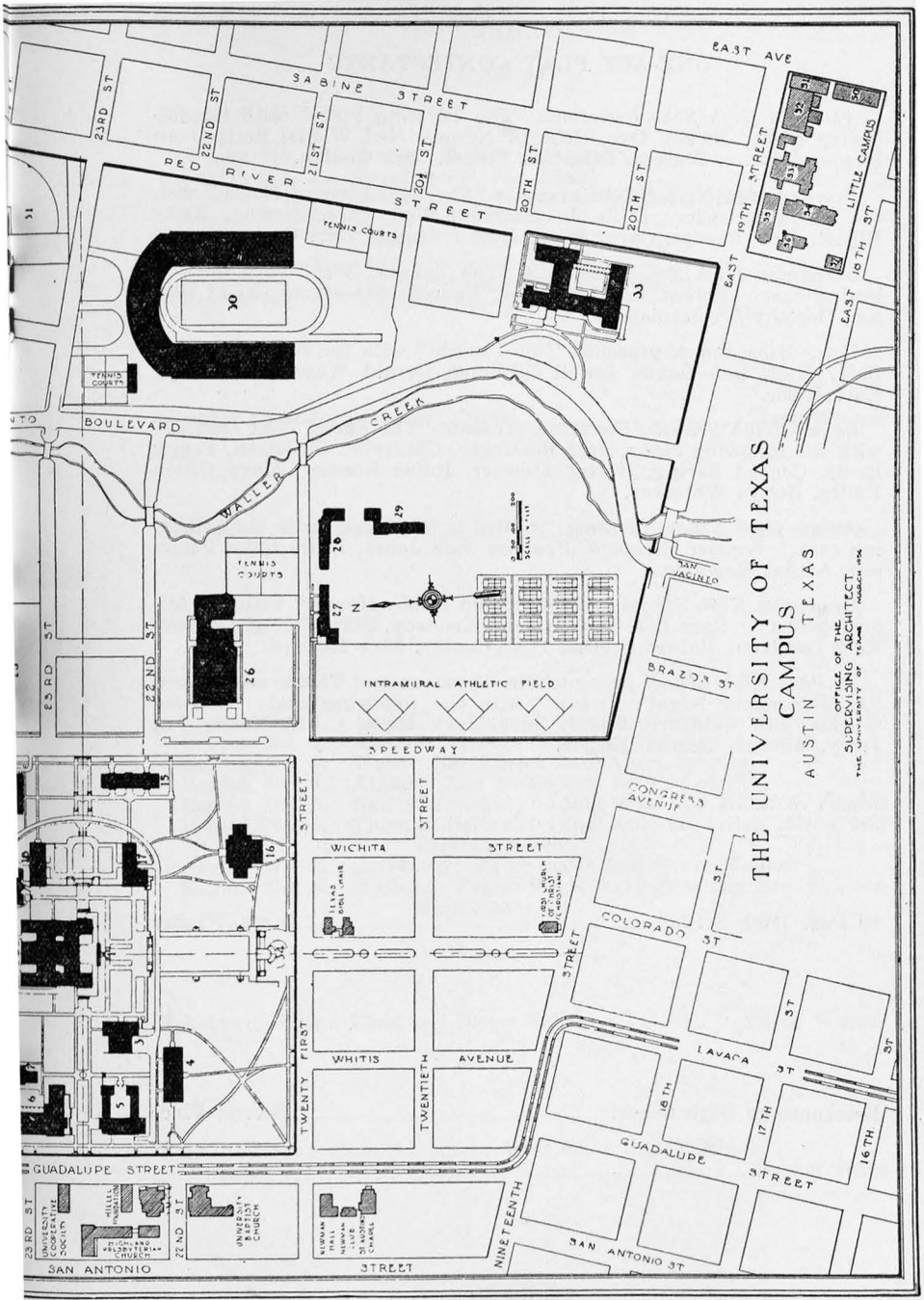
