February



We hosted our first ever waste audit where we sorted through trash and recycling from 4 different buildings on campus. On average, 11% of what we found in the "trash" was actually recycling. We diverted about 18 pounds of recycling from the landfill!

Common recyclable items in the trash included plastic drink bottles in the Union and Natural Sciences, and paper products such as newspapers

and old flyers in the Williams Center.

The Williams Center has the most work to do with 29% of its waste actually being recyclable.

We will be conducting a repeat waste audit at the end of March – help us improve our True Blue recycling habits by making sure the recycling stays out of the trash!

What Does Georgia Southern Recycle?

Can recycle: paper, #1 and #2 narrow necked plastic bottles, corrugated cardboard, and aluminum cans

Do NOT recycle: paperboard (cereal boxes, toothpaste boxes, granola bar boxes, etc.), pizza boxes, food, Starbucks drinks, glass, plastic straws, etc.

What can I put in campus recycling bins?

Empty all containers. Keep items loose, clean and dry. Don't tie up in plastic bags.
