**FURNISHINGS FOR DORMITORY ORDERED**

In a recent statement made recently President Coates announced that \$2000 worth of furnishings had been ordered for the new dormitory. This equipment, manufactured by the Simpson Company, is both modern and practical. Since it is made of metal it will be easy to clean and long-lasting. (Just think - no more trouble with broken chairs or worn writing surfaces on wooden desks!) Every student will have a steel, heavy-duty case, a chair with a leather upholstered seat, and a desk lamp. They will have low single beds which possibly may have wireframe beds. Each study-bedroom will accommodate four will have two bookshelves on the walls, two chests of drawers, one wardrobe and a washbasin.

The low-price value of the metal furniture will increase with the light and airy tile floors. The windows will be equipped with matching drapes and window blinds which should help to give a more homelike atmosphere to the room.

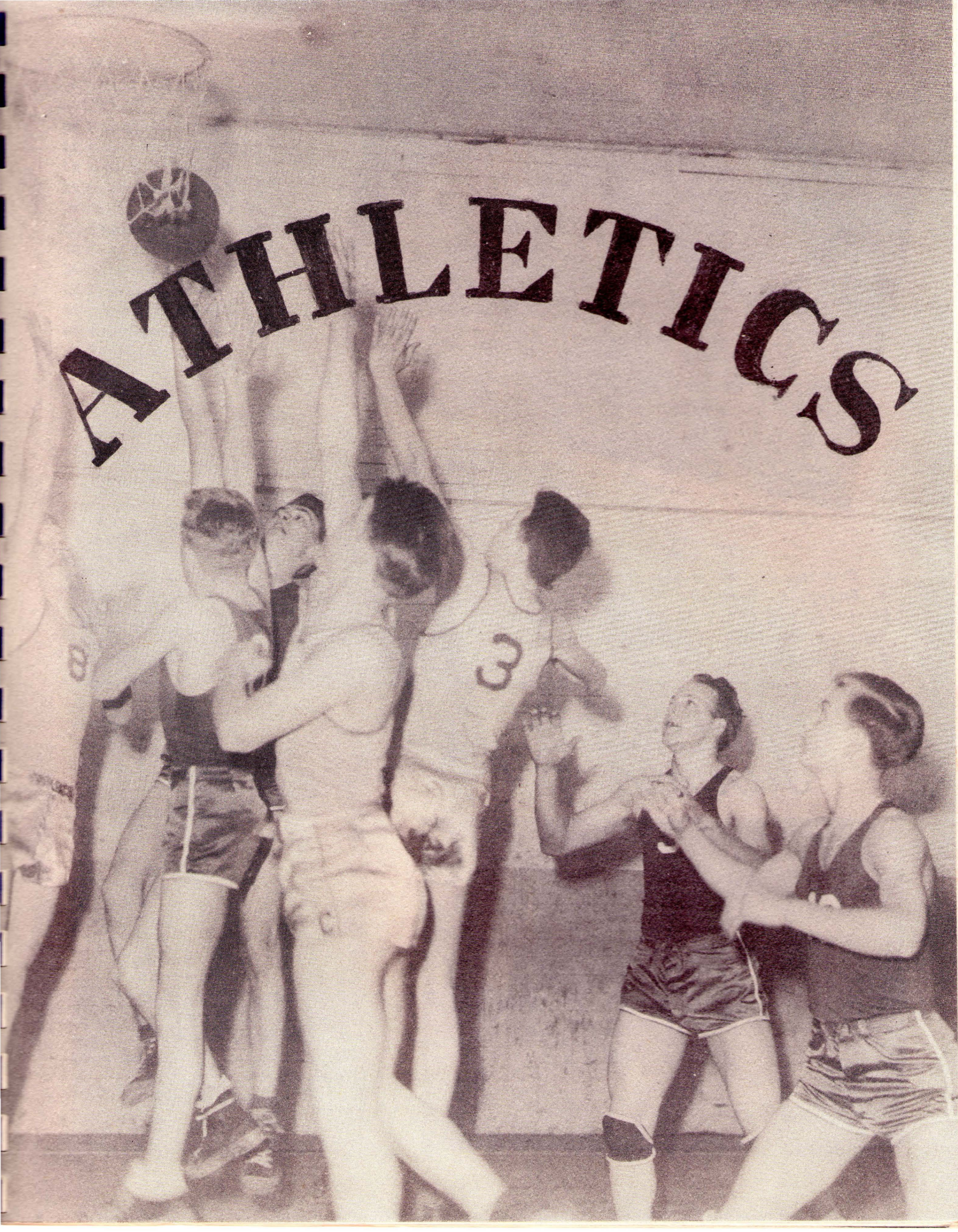
President Coates also reported that new desks and tables for the dining room will be ordered for the dining room. Furniture for a lounge for which the students are a good many of their spare time will also be bought.

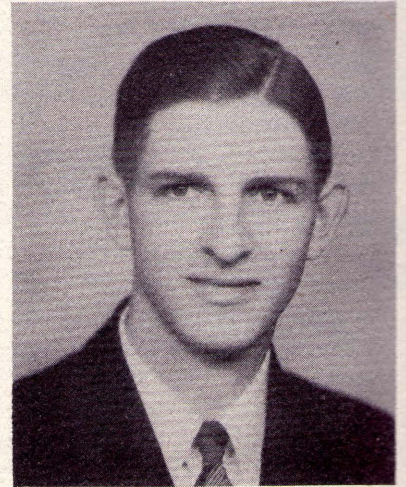
Some of this first class, Ed. Meyer, sends greetings and prayers. God's richest blessings are upon the Alumni Association and that the number of members may increase rapidly.
