PREPARING FOR A LOSS

Anyone who purchases homeowner or business property insurance should go through the exercise of assuming that he will have a total loss. By documenting everything he owns (including its value), a homeowner or business person puts himself in a better position to file a claim should the need arise. Next, policyholders should pay particular attention to the "exclusions" section of their policies. This section lists what the insurance company covers in the case of a loss. Lastly, anyone who is faced with the prospect of filling out a claim form should consider enlisting the aid of an insurance professional in doing so. Failure to complete the claim for fully could compromise the policyholder's ability to collect the full amount to which he is entitled.

Adequate cash flow must be maintained

When the economy slows down, your business's profitability (and survival) depends more than ever on an adequate cash flow. Here are some tips for increasing your business's cash flow by improving your accounts receivable collection system.

✓ **New customers.** Check financial soundness and credit history thoroughly before extending large amounts of credit to a new customer. Don't rely on credit reports alone; make a few quick calls to other businesses that trade with the prospective customer.

✓ **Current customers.** Once you have delivered your goods or services, you must make it as easy as possible for the customer to pay you quickly. Send the invoices shortly after the sale (perhaps bi-weekly instead of monthly). Use informative invoices so the customer can quickly determine

whether the order was authorized and received.

Use your sales staff to assist in the collection process. By tying commissions to sales collected instead of sales made, you give incentive to sell to paying customers. A more direct method is to have your sales staff check with the cus-

tomers shortly after invoicing to ensure that the customer has received the order and that all is well with the payment schedule.

✓ **Delinquent customers.** If a payment is overdue, be flexible in your collection approach. If necessary, break a \$500 invoice into five monthly payments of \$100 plus a reasonable interest fee. Small payments are better than no payments.

Finally, don't forget to be cordial in your dealings. Everybody has occasional cash-flow difficulties, and nothing will turn away a good customer faster than sending in your collection agent or lawyer the minute the payment becomes overdue.

A cabinetmaker eliminates the need for much sanding by using a scraper. It takes off fine shavings than a plane. It will produce a smooth cut even against the grain and is a good tool for cleaning up along glue lines. A cabinet scraper has a blade sharpened to a 45-degree angle, with a hooked edge which is turned over by "burnishing," using a special tool. The hook does the cutting. The blade is held in a frame that has two handles. The scraper blade is adjusted by tightening a thumbscrew which springs the blade so its hook projects. In use, the tool is pushed away from you. A hand scraper works like a cabinet scraper except that it has no frame.

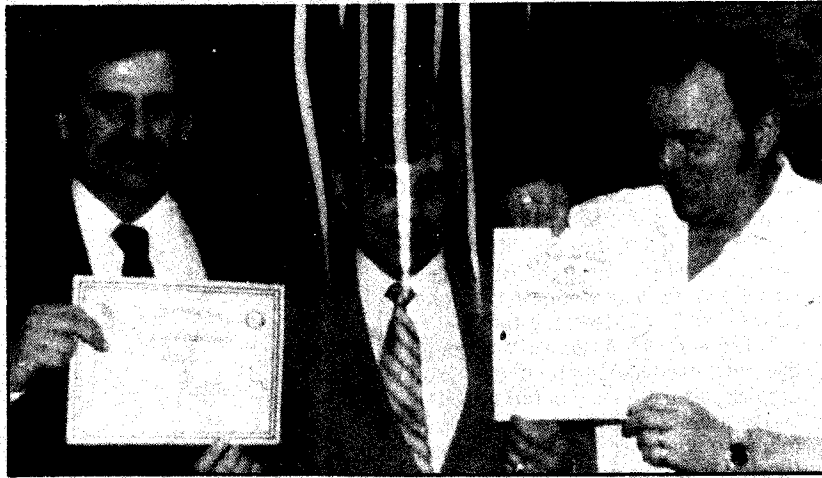

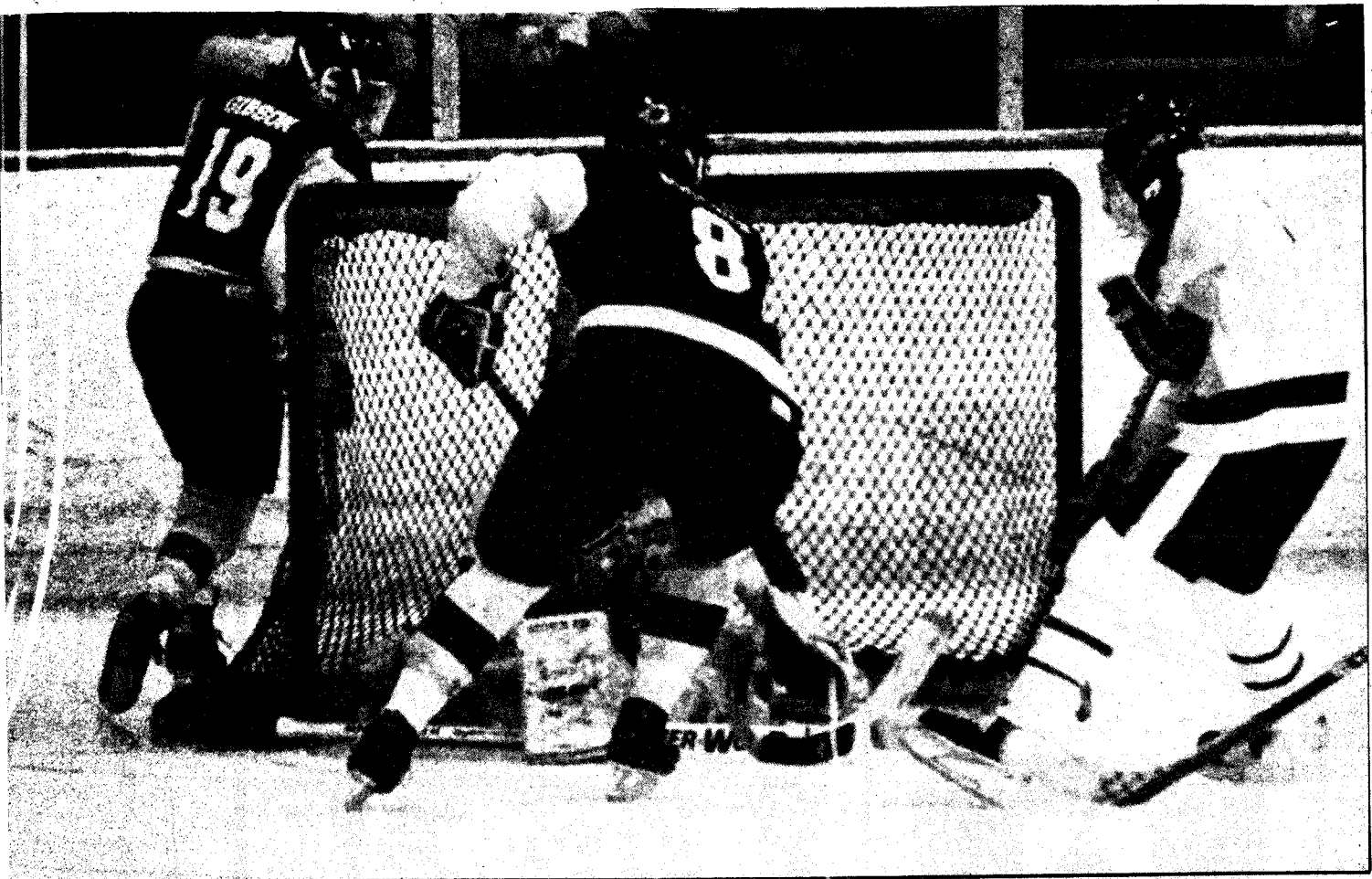

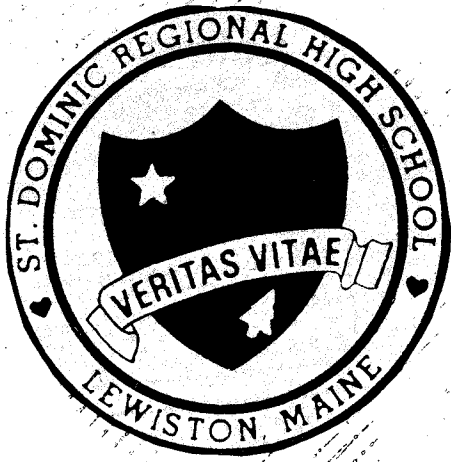

There were other ideas such as a

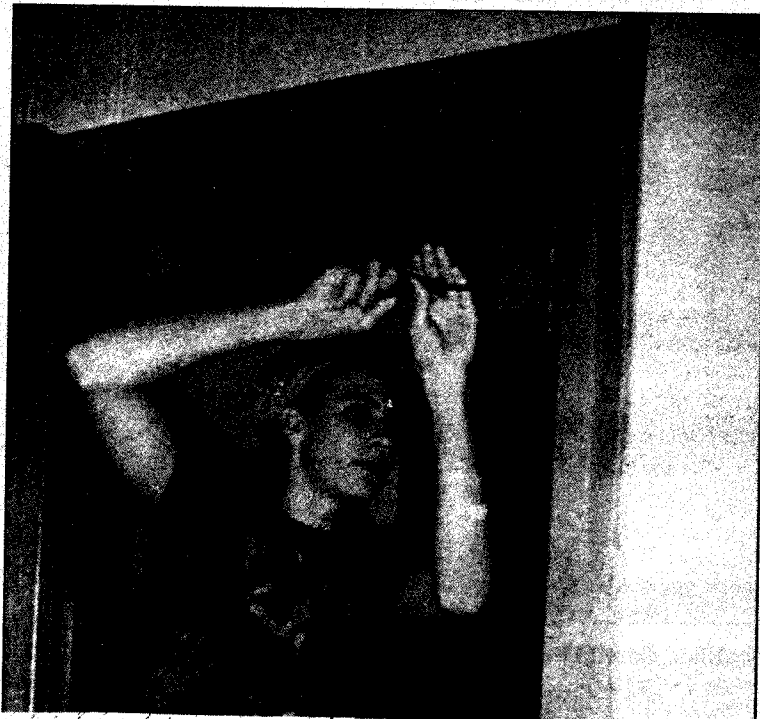
telephone that translates foreign languages, and a telephone with which you can see the person with whom you are communicating.

Hockey teams, they are a'changing

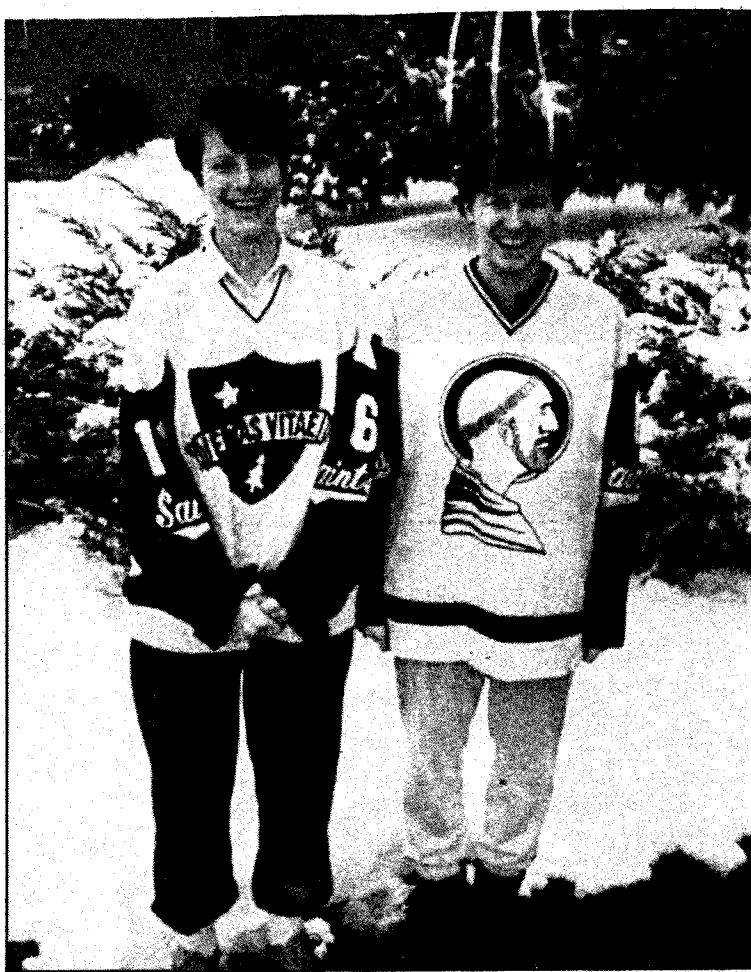

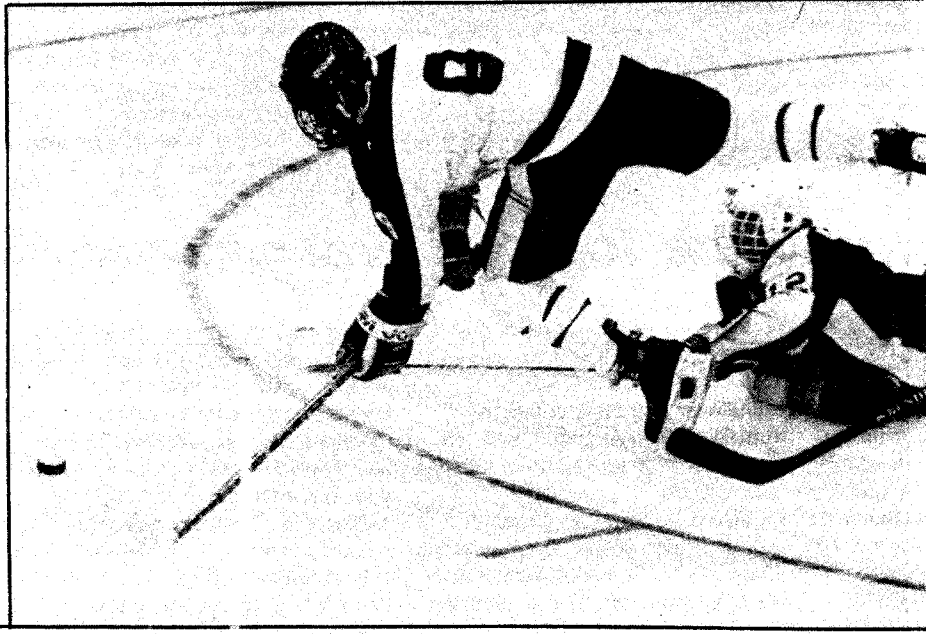

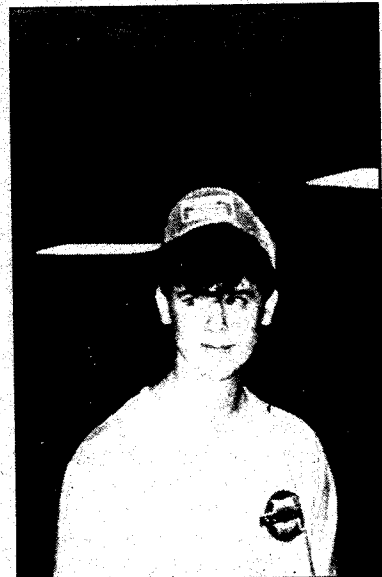
Musical show to benefit St. Dom tuition fund

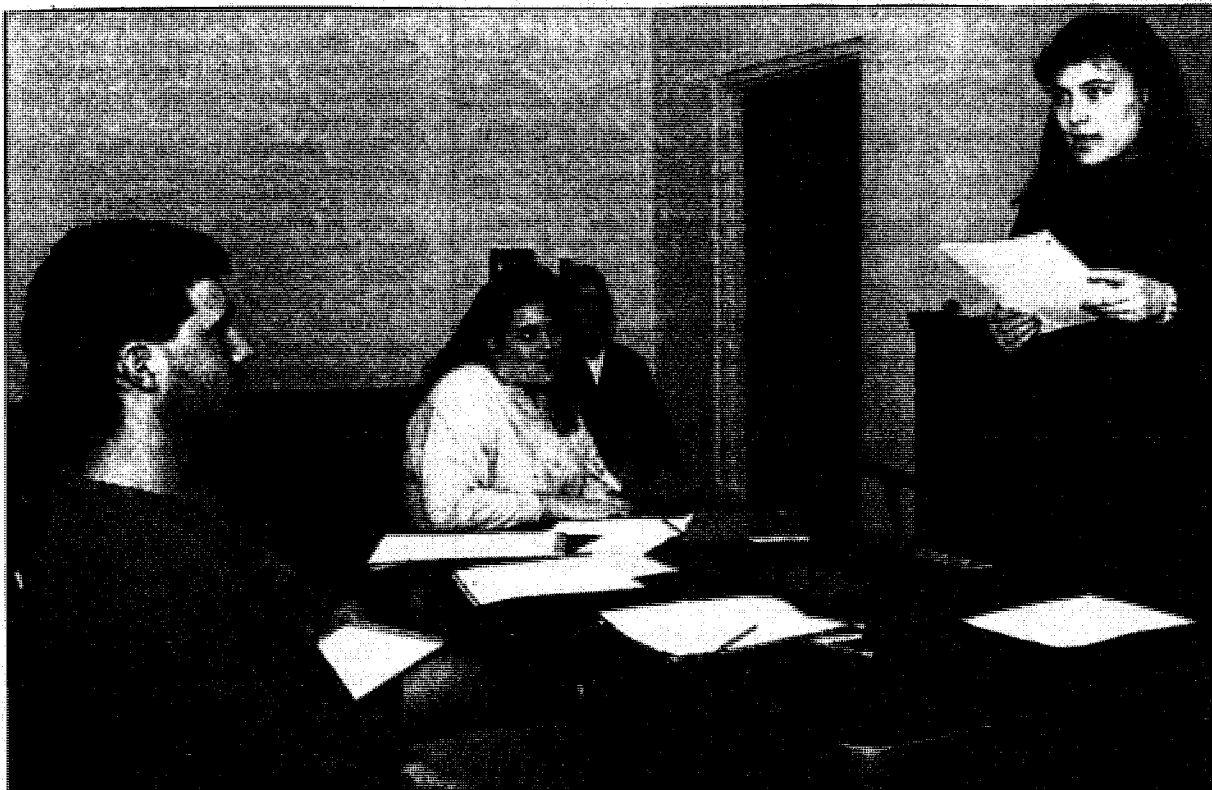

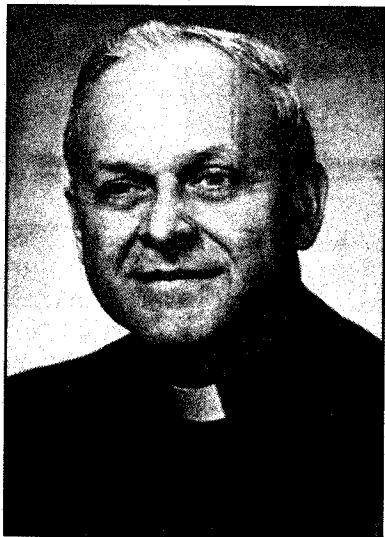

Cajun fun: Beausoleil is back

and New York. The band has been together since 1976; besides Michael Doucet and his brother David on guitar, members are drummer Tommy Alesi, bassist Tommy Comeaux, percussionist Billy Ware, and accordionist/saxman Jimmy Breaux.

Though Beausoleil is Doucet's prime focus, he also has "back pocket" ventures that include solo work and dates with the very traditional Savoy-Doucet Cajun Band. Like Doucet, accordionist Marc and singer-guitarist Anne Savoy figured prominently in the revival and national discovery of Cajun culture from the 1970s on.

But it's hard to overestimate the role Doucet and Beausoleil played in that renaissance. Cajun music was

moribund by the 1970s, despite occasional flashes in the national pan like Doug Kershaw. Assimilation and prejudice were weakening the culture, and its younger people were looking elsewhere for their music.

"We went out and did research, and met a lot of the older musicians who really made this music," says Doucet - musicians like fiddlers Dennis McGee, a pioneer still active in his 90s, and Canray Fontenot, whose Creole music reflects the black perspective on the bayou experience.

"And that's what still guides us. We're not debauching this music for commercial reasons. We still want to play it ... in an ensemble kind of way. Not by highlighting the fiddle or accordion, but everybody playing to-

gether in a unified sound," says Doucet.

"Which basically I like to call 'back porch music' - the kind of sound you might hear at a friend's house, brought to you on a stage."

This warm ensemble approach - with a decided emphasis on danceability - certainly was key to the group's quick success. Almost at the outset, they were hired for a festival in France and for a Jimmy Carter inaugural ball.

They went on to folk festivals all over the U.S. and tonier dates at places like Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center. Regular appearances on the radio program "Prairie Home Companion" got the word out to an even wider audience.

Gamache is braced for battle

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Lewis-ton's Joey Gamache Jr. steps up to a heavier weight class at the Marina Hotel at St. Johns Place here tonight in his eight-round co-main event fight against Arthur Clarke of Nassau, the Bahamas.

That worries Johnny Bos, his matchmaker and co-promoter, but Gamache says he's not sweating it.

"He could come in as a heavy-weight and it wouldn't help him,"

said Gamache, the International Boxing Federation-Intercontinental champion who is 22-0 and ranked either third or fifth among junior light-weight contenders by five other sanctioning organizations. "I'll probably come in at 140 (pounds), and I feel good fighting at that weight. That means I don't have to starve myself to get down to 135 or 130."

Bos says he isn't quite as confident about his protege's fight against Clarke, who comes with a reported record of 18-6-1 and a reputation as a

battler.

"This is a scary situation," Bos said. "This is the first time we've ever fought at junior welterweight. I hear Clarke weighs 139 right now, and he could come in at 150. This is the kind of fight that worries me."

The 24-year old Gamache, who arrived in this city in Northeast Florida Wednesday, admitted that a fight against an opponent like Clarke has its dangers.

Like so many other things, Cajun music can be as simple or complex as you want it to be.

To some, the French-language folk music of southern Louisiana is defined by its limits - rhythms limited to waltz and two-step, chords limited by the one-row button accordion, instruments limited to squeezebox, fiddle, guitar and triangle.

Michael Doucet's perception is quite different. Doucet is a fiddler, the leader of the Cajun band Beausoleil, and he is one of the main reasons people outside Louisiana know what they know about this rural, once-isolated culture.

To Doucet, who brings Beausoleil to Lewiston on March 8, the simple fabric of Cajun music provides a canvas for a rich and diverse stylistic landscape. He explains that during two centuries of Cajun history, the music has absorbed countless influences, while remaining true to itself.

"It's always in flux, and you can look at any period, any time, and pick out a style that is completely different from maybe five years before or after," he says. "That's what's so intriguing about the music. It's so elastic, you can't really go wrong."

And, he adds - perhaps in an implicit rebuff to critics of his eclectic

approach-- "I'm not someone from outside the culture dissecting it, I'm someone very inside the culture. And basically we're just playing what we want to play.

"There are no rules," he laughs.

LA Arts presents Beausoleil in concert at 8 p.m. March 8 at Lewiston Junior High School. Tickets, which cost \$10, are available at Lewiston and Auburn Shop 'n Save supermarkets and at LA Arts, 36 Oak St., Lewiston. Call 782-7228 for tickets and more information.

Doucet, reached for a phone interview at home in Lafayette, La., is relaxed, talkative and excited about the imminent beginning of a new Beausoleil recording. He says that he has written six new songs for the project. It will be distributed not by Rounder, the band's longtime label, but by Rhino, renowned for witty and well-executed compilation sets.

Doucet is also excited about plans for Richard Thomson, the Englishman whose songs and guitar work have attracted a devoted cult following, to guest on the recording. (Thompson is playing at Raoul's in Portland on Monday). The two are old collaborators - notably on 1988's Cajun Brew, a jokey "garage band" project that Cajunized rock chestnuts like "Woolly Bully" and "Louie, Louie."

Franco-Americans provide

LEWISTON — Franco-American supporters of the arts on Tuesday night "bowed over" a representative of the Maine Arts Commission with ideas to attract grant money to the Twin Cities.

Representatives of the state Arts Commission and Maine Arts Inc., met with about 30 local Franco-Americans at Bates College's Olin Arts Center in an effort to shape a grant application to the National Endowment for the Arts.

"I was absolutely bowled over by the number of people who showed up and by the broad representation of the Franco-American community as well as by the wonderful ideas," said David Cadigan of the Maine Arts Commission.

The National Endowment for the Arts is making funds available to state art agencies to work in partnership with communities to develop and give stability to arts programs. The NEA wants to make arts more accessible, particularly in "underserved communities," which lack established programs. Up to \$150,000 could come to Maine.

'wonderful ideas' for arts grants

Representatives from the state Arts Commission have been meeting with Franco-American groups and others since they received the NEA guidelines in late January.

"It is an extremely difficult task to put this proposal together," Cadigan said. He said the guidelines for the grant proposal are so broad that not only did he need to hear of specific ideas, he was also searching for ideas for a general focus. "We really need your input," he said.

"I feel what definitely must be done is to isolate and evaluate ethnicity as an American treasure" said Raoul Pinette. "As

Suggestions included rehabilitating the Grand Trunk Railroad Depot to a museum, reinstating the Franco-American Festival, organizing a team of French-speaking people, developing a statewide network of Franco organizations, introducing the Franco culture in local schools and creating and preserving tapes and videos of Franco music and dance.

All suggestions were enthusiastically received by the crowd.

LA Arts, said, "the community is ready and needs this kind of focus."

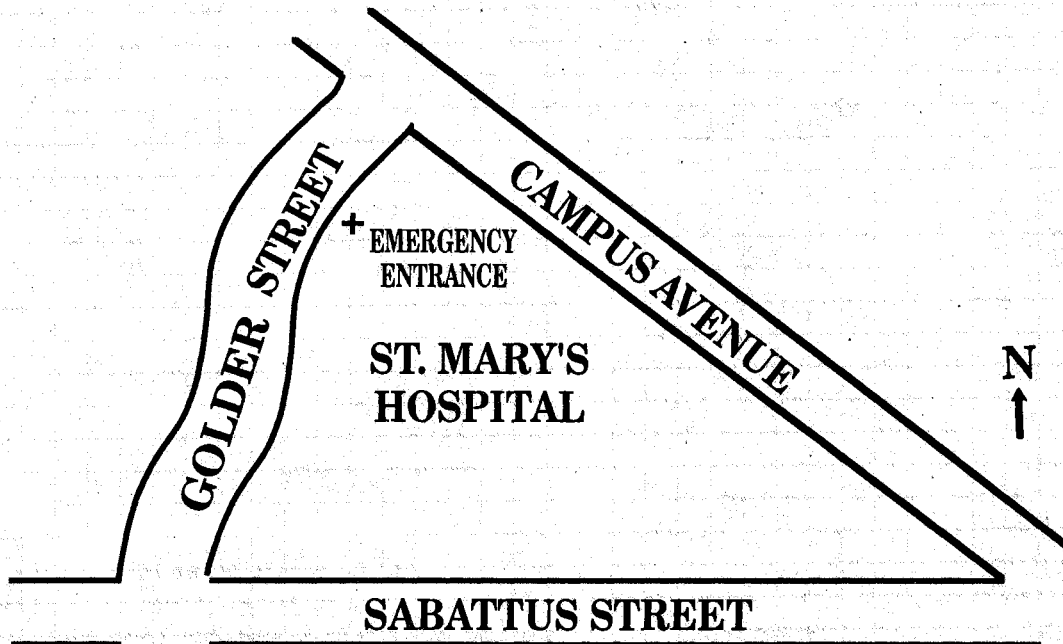
Both Cadigan and Hazard will be working in the next three weeks to put together the grant application.

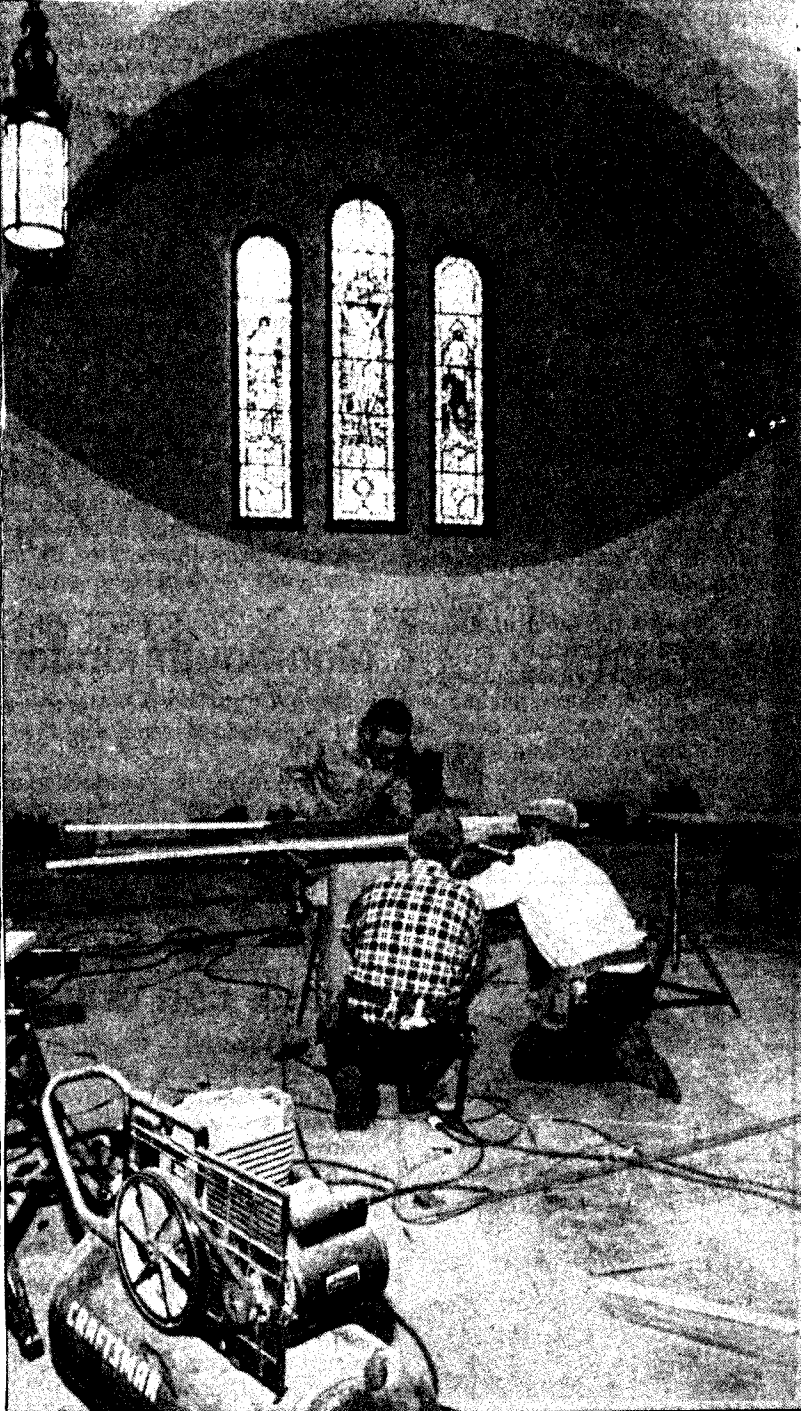

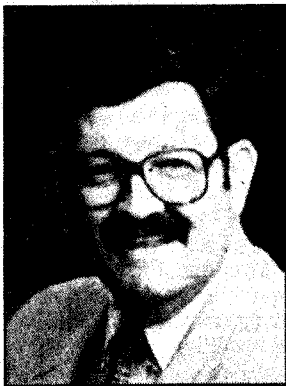

Pinard, Perron win school board seats

SABATTUS — Robert Pinard Jr. and Katherine Perron were winners Friday in a hotly-contested school board election which saw almost 25 percent of the town's registered voters turn out.

Pinard led the poll with 361 votes for a three-year term. Perron, with 252 votes, edged her nearest rival, Richard Beaudoin, by only 16 votes for the other three-year seat, with Elaine Chateauvert running third at 203 votes.

Running unopposed, Paul D'Amour got 551 votes for a two-year school board term and Linda Pierce claimed another one-year term with 520 votes.

In the other contested election, Joseph Fisher swept to an easy victory with 327 votes for road commissioner, followed by Bernard Roberts with 187 votes, Donald Poussard with 106 and Joseph Flemming with 36 votes.

In uncontested elections, Rudy Gayton won another term as selectman with 569 votes and Carolyn Early her 23rd term as town clerk with 608 votes, the highest of any candidate. Thurl Hinkley received 547 votes for park commissioner and Richard LaBrecque garnered 526 to become a trustee of the Sabattus Water District.

Budget Committee election results will not be known until these votes are counted Saturday morning.

Lewiston sailor provides 'comfort' to men and women in Persian Gulf

PERSIAN GULF — When the United States declared war on Iraq, the multinational force of more than half a million troops was ready to fight.

Pierre J. Croteau, the 32-year-old son of Joseph and Patricia Croteau of Lewiston, was ready for war too, but in a different capacity. Croteau is a U.S. Navy petty officer first class on board the USNS Comfort, one of the two hospital ships supporting allied forces in the Middle East.

"Our mission is to provide care of casualties that happen in the desert and to give the best medical care to military personnel on Operation Desert Storm," said Croteau, a 1976 graduate of St. Dominic Regional High School, Lewiston.

Comfort is the third largest class of ship in the Navy, after aircraft carriers and helicopter carriers, and is one of the largest trauma facilities in the United States.

"We provide relief to any or all of the ships and units in the desert with adequate and timely medical care for all cases," Croteau said.

The primary mission of the hospital ship is to provide mobile, flexible, rapidly responsive acute medical

and surgical care in areas where hostilities may be imminent.

The Comfort is as long as three football fields and as high as a 10-story building. The ship is designed to accept an average of 200 casualties every 24 hours, either by helicopter or small boat.

The 1,000-bed medical treatment facility on board includes a casualty receiving area with 50 trauma stations, 12 operating rooms, a 20-bed recovery room, 80 intensive care beds, and 16 intermediate-, light- and limited-care wards.

Rendering services, which include radiology, a pharmacy, a blood bank, comprehensive dental care, burn treatment, physical therapy, and lens fabrication capabilities keeps the 1,200-member crew busy.

"The most challenging aspect of operating in this area of the world is dealing with the unknown factor of when people will head back home again," said Croteau.

Croteau would like to say to friends and family back home, "Thank you for caring and supporting Desert Storm and suffering the separations of family and friends."

Report to offer suggestions for site of industrial park

AUBURN — A city task force initially charged with surveying the city for potential locations to site an industrial park will take their work a step further and recommend several specific spots for development in a report expected by early May.

Ward 3 City Councilor Joseph Deschenes, who headed the Industrial Land Task Force, said a pared-down version of the group will begin meeting this week and should present the council with its recommendations before budget deliberations begin.

Deschenes said this phase of the committee's work will focus on picking one site, along with alternates, and developing plans to determine what it would cost to build a municipal industrial park on the land.

The project, started last year at Deschenes' urging, has been promoted as a necessary step for the city to boost its lagging commercial and industrial tax base by helping lure new companies to the area.

Deschenes said the committee will also look at ways of paying for the project if the council decides to go ahead with its recommendations, and said those methods could

either rely on taxes or federal grants and low-interest loans from either the city's funds or money from local economic development agencies.

The task force's earlier report targeted about 20 sites for either short-term or long-term industrial development, but made no specific recommendations.

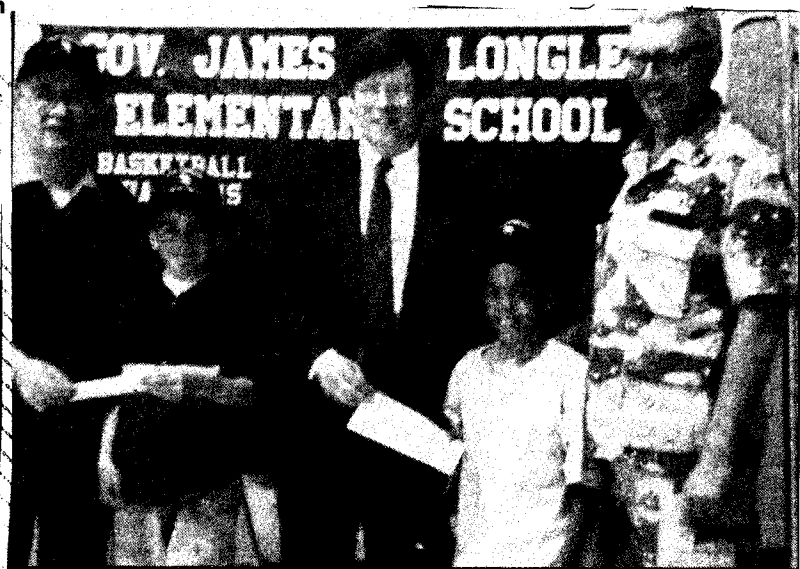

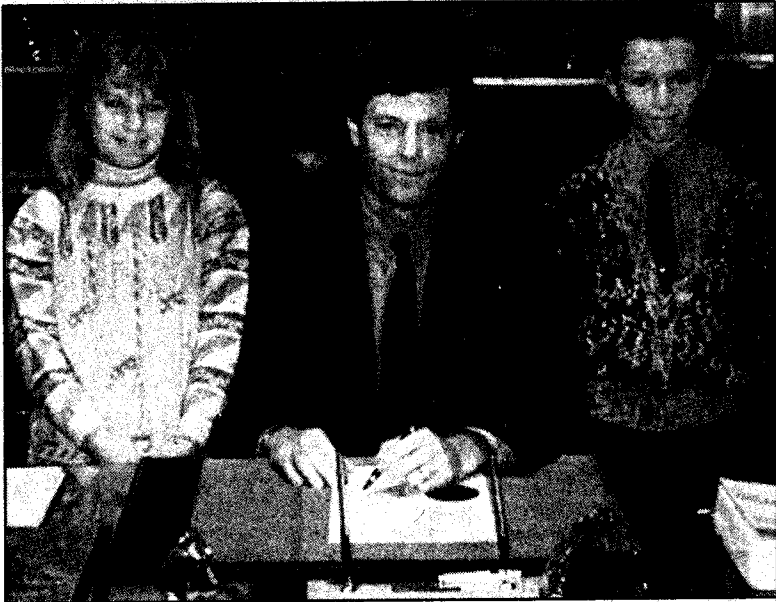

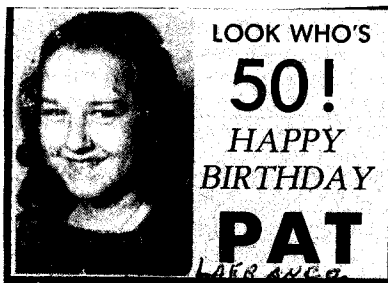

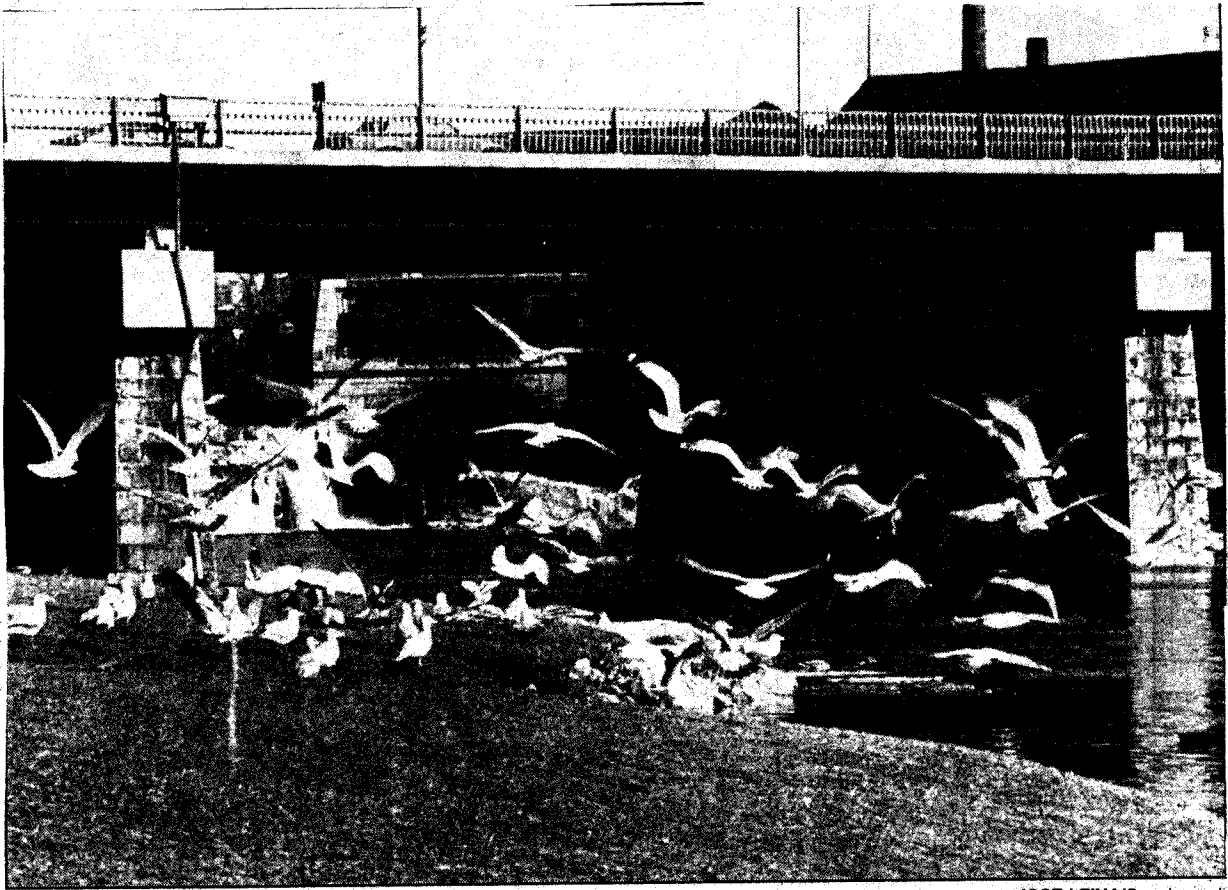

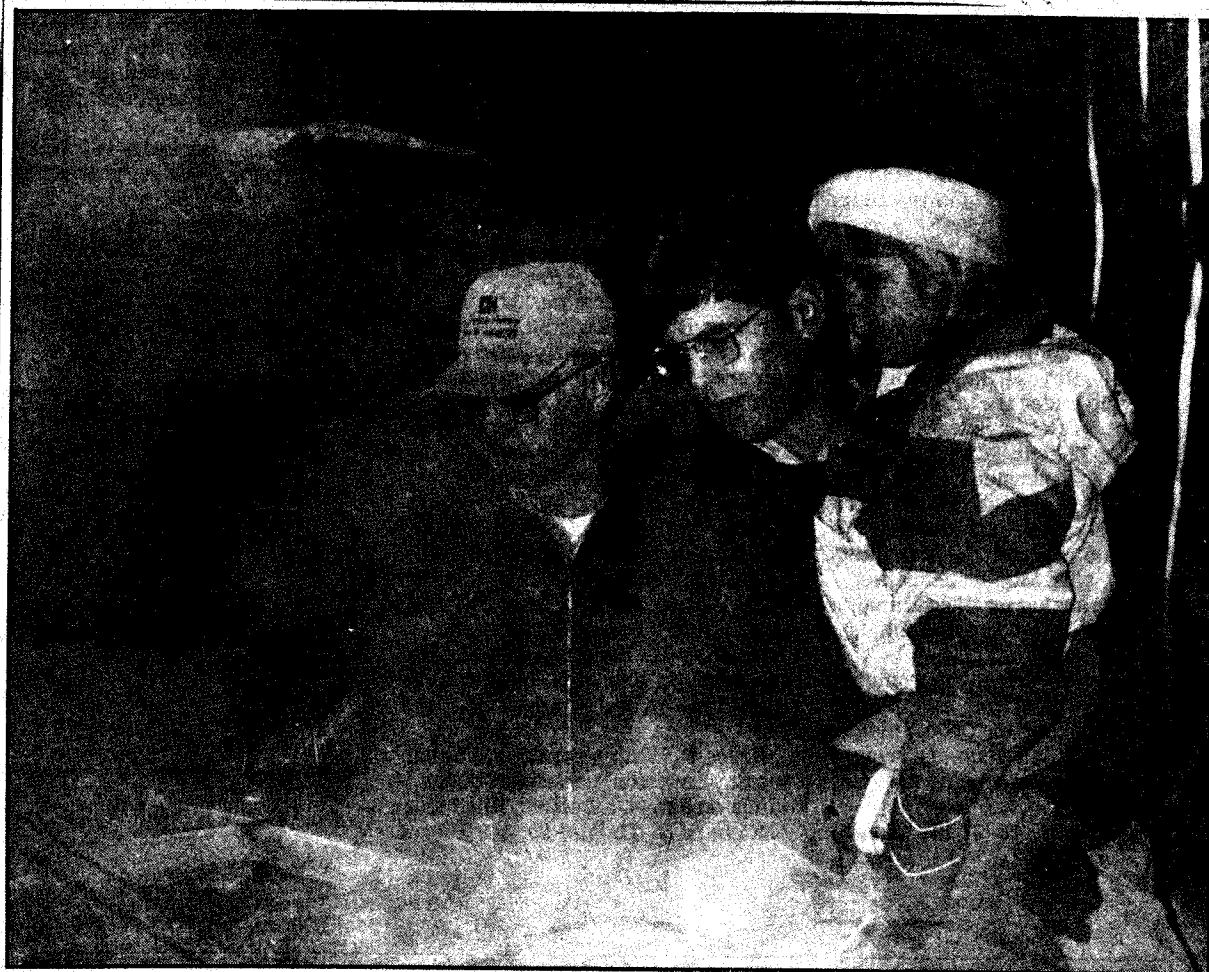

Our Lady of the Rosary, Sabattus



The Church of Our Lady of the Rosary in Sabattus started out in 1910 as a mission-church of the Dominican Fathers. Father Thomas Gill, O.P., was the first permanent priest to be assigned to Sabattus. Very interested in the site where the church now stands, the former property of Charles Maxwell, Father Gill influenced his sister to purchase the land for him. In the spring of 1913, the cornerstone of the Catholic church in Sabattus was laid, and the name "Our Lady of the Rosary" was given. Work was slow, but in 1915 the basement of the Church was opened and the first Mass was held on Christmas day. With the help of the Dominican Fathers and Brothers of Lewiston, and friends of all faiths, the church was completed in 1918.

Through the years, Our Lady of the Rosary has been served by 13 pastors, each making his own contribution. A parochial school was opened under the administration of the Dominican Sisters. An old barn was converted into a Parish Hall and is known today as the Maxwell-Gill Hall. And with the growth of the parish, an addition was made to the church and school.

In 1975, the mission was transferred from the apostolate of the Dominican Fathers, who had served as true servants of the Lord for over 70 years, to the Diocese of Portland. Bishop Edward O'Leary blessed and approved the establishment of Our Lady of the Rosary Church as a diocesan parish.

Today, in the decade of the 90's, the "little church in the pines" continues to serve the people of the Sabattus area. Though the parochial school was closed in 1986, the classrooms are being used by the Sabattus Elementary School for its kindergarten. Our Church looks to the future with hope and enthusiasm as it tries to meet some of the spiritual and other special needs of the people in the area.

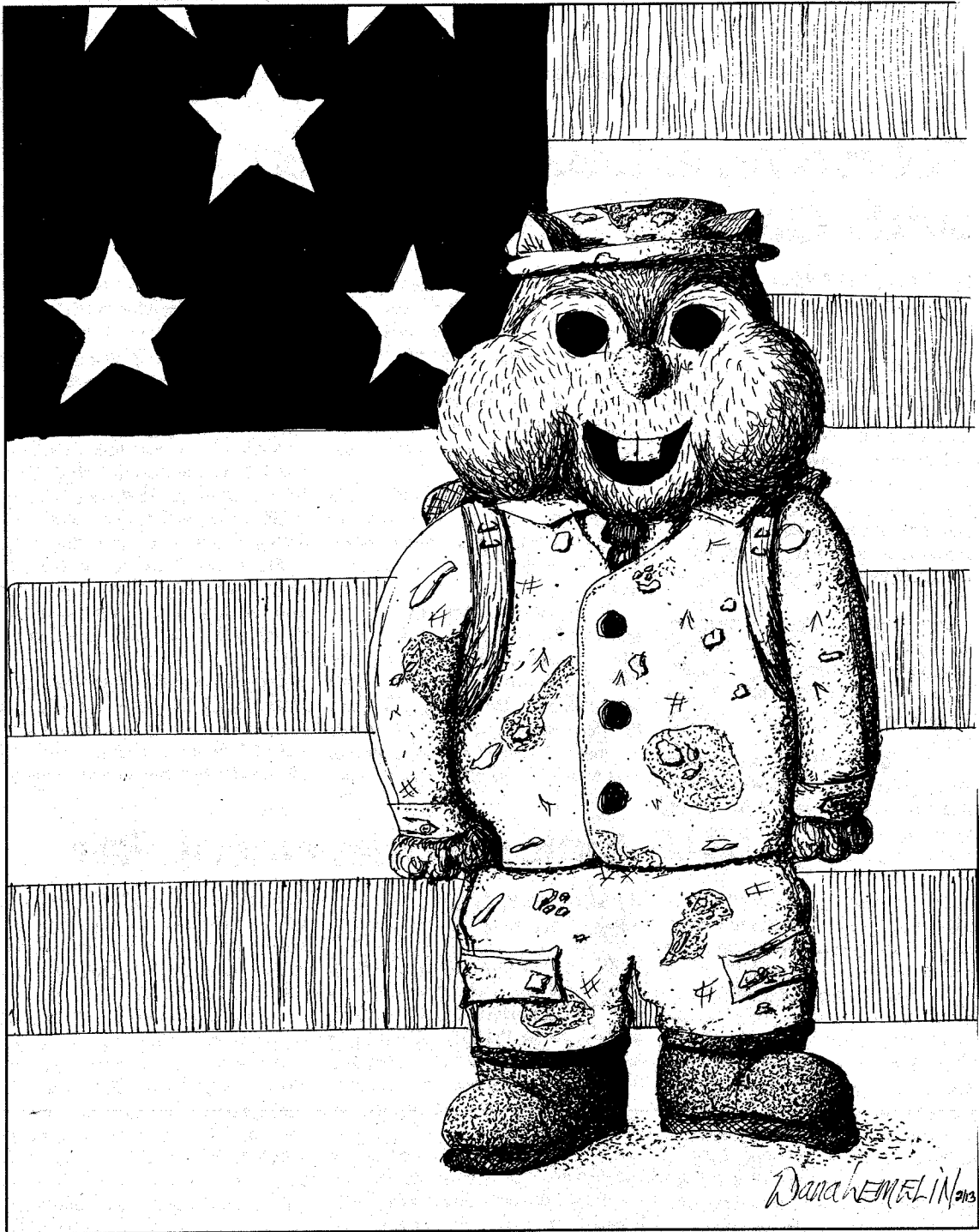

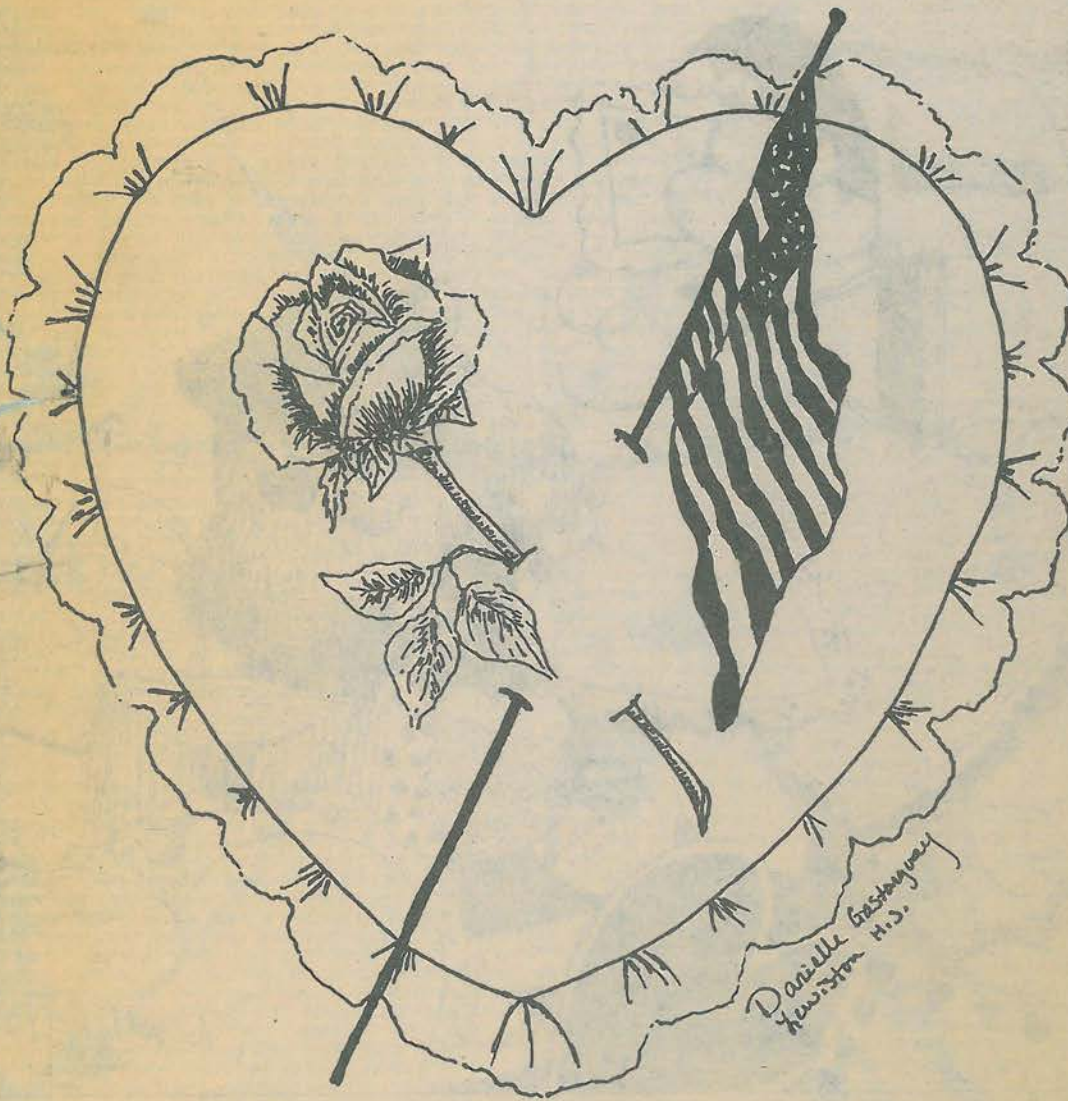
