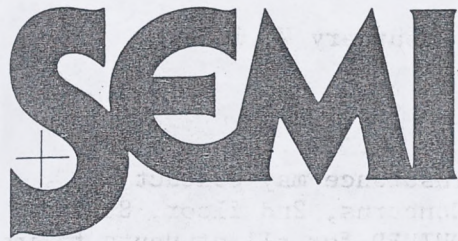

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

New student orientation/registration will be held on Friday, June 15, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Registration for returning students will be held on Tuesday, May 15, from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and on Wednesday, May 16, from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Priority numbers for returning students, assigned on the basis of total number of units a student has completed, may be found on the bulletin board just outside the Office of the Registrar in the second week of May. Students taking five-week courses or ten-day intensive courses may also register on the first day of class, at other than scheduled class time. Late registration will be held June 18-25 for ten-week courses. Late registration for five-week courses and ten-day intensive courses is held on the second day of the course only, at other than scheduled class time. In either case, current late fees will be assessed. Students may enroll for up to twenty units during the full Summer quarter, selecting any combination of ten-week, five-week, and ten-day courses—except that only one intensive course may be selected during any ten-day session.
