SOT Grants

Application packets for 86-87 SOT grant are available in the  
Office of Financial Aid. All students who desire any kind of  
SOT grant (i.e., Team Ministry, Ethnic American, Black and  
Hispanic Ministries, Regular & Endowed Scholarships) must  
complete this application. Eligibility for regular grant:

1. Must be a regular MDiv or MA student
2. Must take minimum of 36 units Summer Qtr. 86 through  
Spring Qtr 87.
3. Must attend classes on the main campus.
4. Must be a US citizen or permanent resident

Award Amount: Seminary grant awards are based on relative  
need and cover as much as half the cost of tuition. Due to  
the great need on campus, we ask all student to pursue all  
other forms of grant support first (i.e., church,  
denomination, individuals, etc.)

Deadline: For returning students, the completed application  
packet must be in the Office of Financial Aid by April 15,  
1986.

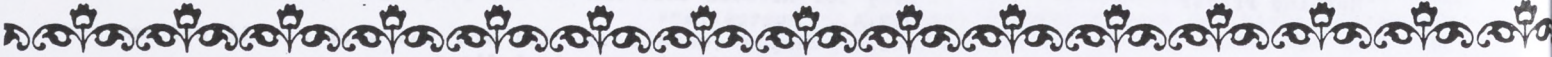
