

Corporate Generosity — Emerson Strengthens IT Systems

When David Farr, CEO of St. Louis-based Emerson Electric Co., visited Fontbonne University, it was a two-fold cause for celebration.

Farr gave a thoughtful and insightful presentation to a packed room of Fontbonne students, faculty, staff and guests as part of the university's Building Global Relationships speaker series. Farr's visit also gave the campus community the opportunity to thank the business leader and his company for a generous gift — a \$235,000 grant marked specifically for enhancing and upgrading Fontbonne's technology systems. The gift will provide system stability, educational opportunities and peace of mind for the university and its students for years to come.

"Emerson is well known for its commitment to educational institutions in the St. Louis area, and the company has been a past donor to Fontbonne," said Mark Franz, Fontbonne's vice president for information technology. "In recent conversations with corporate personnel at Emerson, we made them aware of strategic needs of the institution, which were consistent with their interests. Some specific products that Emerson has developed and perfected were implemented as key elements in solving the issues we were facing."

Through the grant, Fontbonne purchased products and installation services that will provide the university's central computer servers with a new system for reliable and consistent power. These include a battery backup system, a cooling system server racks, and an uninterruptible power supply (UPS), as well as a diesel generator and transfer switch for Ryan Hall, which contains the central server room. Additionally, the grant led to the naming and upgrade of the Ryan Hall third-floor computer labs, now known as the Emerson Technology Center.

"This gift enabled us to upgrade our computer labs, as well as do major work behind the scenes of our IT department," said Sandra Lehrer, Fontbonne's vice president for institutional advancement. "Before, if we had a power outage, we had about a 15-minute window to get systems back up, or we would run

the risk of losing data. The university is now in a completely different place to safeguard our technology."

While Emerson's financial gift was more a "behind-thescenes" boon to the campus, Farr's presentation provided a rare and up-close glimpse into the leadership of a successful multinational corporation. For aspiring business students, especially, it was a momentous opportunity.

The day, however, brought with it one more surprise. On top of his company's already generous grant, Farr, upon touring the IT department and seeing Fontbonne's phone system, offered to fund its upgrade as well.

"He took one look at our phone system and knew immediately what we needed," Lehrer said. "He's a person who makes things happen and a very generous individual who firmly believes in supporting the country's next generation of leaders."

No one was happier with the surprise improvement than the IT department. "In the 20 plus years since Fontbonne acquired its current system, the technology in the telecommunications industry has been transformed," Franz said. "Emerson recognized that a new telecommunications system, with its wide range of enhanced functionality, would transform our communications infrastructure and augment the level of services we can provide to our students, faculty, staff and other constituencies."

The generosity, dedication to education, and level of corporate responsibility Emerson exhibited during this project didn't surprise Dr. Linda Buhr, a former Emerson employee who is now a Fontbonne assistant professor of business administration and an organizer of the speaker series. She likened the company's key tenets to Fontbonne's mission and vision.

"Fontbonne's overarching integration of ethics and integrity actually mirrors Emerson's own deep dedication to those same grounding principles," Buhr said. "That connection is what brought Mr. Farr to Fontbonne."

And it is this type of strong corporate support for which the Fontbonne community will be continually grateful.

with communication disorders.

John Capellupo, chair of the finance committee for the Fontbonne University board of trustees, and his wife, Mary Ann, a member of the Fontbonne Community Connection, are both actively involved and engaged in the Fontbonne community. Inspired by family friends who have a child with a communication disorder, the couple has found a way to become even more supportive of the university.

This year, the Capellupos met with Dr. Dennis Golden, Fontbonne president, and Sandra Lehrer, vice president of institutional advancement, who introduced them to the heads

of the university's department of communication disorders and deaf education (CDDE): Dr. Gale Rice, professor and chair of the CDDE department, and Dr. Susan Lenihan, professor and director of the deaf education program. After assessing the needs of the department with Rice and Lenihan, the Capellupos ultimately decided to give a multi-year gift, which will impact three different areas. Now, every CDDE student and every client who walks through the department's doors will benefit from the Capellupos' generosity.

Part of the \$250,000 gift will name the John P. and Mary Ann Capellupo Development Language Group Family Observatory

and Therapy Rooms, a suite of rooms within the Eardley Family Clinic for Speech, Language and Hearing, which is open to the public and meets the needs of individuals with

Disorders and Deaf Education Scholarships over the next five years. And the rest of the gift will help fund the department's biannual Capellupo Family Augmentative and Alternative Communication Family Theater Camp.

"Part of the gift from the Capellupos will fund 'It's Showtime,' a family weekend theater camp for children who use augmentative communication," explained Rice. "The camp is directed by faculty members in the department of communication disorders and deaf education. Speechlanguage-pathology graduate students work one-on-one with campers during the weekend."

The camp, affectionately termed "Camp Cap" by the department, accomplishes a variety of tasks. Fontbonne students receive hands-on experience in their field, parents and siblings receive support, and children with communication disorders have the chance to do something they might not otherwise — perform in a play.

"While Camp Cap directly benefits children and families and provides a valuable experience to our graduate students, the indirect benefits are substantial and far-reaching," Rice

Lehrer was struck — but not surprised — by the generosity of the Capellupos, who brought their grandchildren to see the performance at the most recent Camp Cap this fall.

"It's just like them to share the joy of giving with the next generation," she said. "They're such caring people. Their

Also at the ceremony, Fontbonne honored Kevin Cloninger, Ph.D., president and COO of the St. Louis-based Anthropedia Foundation, as recipient of the Jason Sommer Dedicated Semester Award, an honor that recognizes leadership in relation to the university's annual dedicated semester experience. Cloninger contributed to the 2010 dedicated semester focused on "Happiness: Traditions and Tensions."




Navy SEAL Featured as Speaker

A New Recipe for Summer Camp

Mention campFRESHSM, and Mary Beth Ohlms' eyes light up. A new initiative offered at Fontbonne this past summer, campFRESHSM brought grade schoolers to campus to set sail for seven weeks of global adventure. Ohlms, a registered dietitian and instructor in Fontbonne's dietetics department, captained the ship, enthusiastically steering her crew on their maiden voyage.

The camp itself was a new take on an old childhood favorite: summer day camp. But campFRESHSM did away with construction paper crafts and animal cracker snacks. Each week, from June through August, students were transported to a different continent to explore and celebrate unique cultures through food, sports, science, music and theater. At the core of the camp was a focus on health and wellness, and the idea that equipping a child with culinary skills and nutritional knowledge can help foster a lifetime of healthy living.

While Ohlms served as the director of campFRESHSM, her colleagues in the Human Environmental Sciences department, including then-department chair Cheryl Houston, supported her endeavors.

"Cheryl has been trying to do this for years," Ohlms said.

"Last year, two donors came to her and wanted to do something different. So Cheryl pitched the idea of a passport to health. They were thrilled."

The donors, Tracey and Bill Marshall, saw a need in the community they felt Fontbonne could fill.

"We chose to support campFRESHSM because we have an interest in education and teaching life skills," said Tracey Marshall, who graduated from Fontbonne with a bachelor's degree in family and consumer sciences in 1997 and a master's in the same field in 2007.

"We are aware, as most are, of the nutritional challenges that face our young people in the community," Marshall said. "This is a chance for children to not only learn their way around the kitchen, but to create healthy snacks while learning about other cultures and worlds. We found this idea both creative and intriguing, and definitely worth supporting. We are thrilled with the success!"

The camp started small for the first year, said Ohlms, with space for 10 fourth- through sixth-graders each week in order to give every child a hands-on experience. Targeting only that particular age group was a conscious choice.

"This is right before high school, when kids begin leading more sedentary lifestyles and struggle with self-identity and body issues," Ohlms explained. And, she added, healthy children equal healthy families.

"No one wants to spend a lot of time in the kitchen, but the reality is that the best way to improve your health is to cook," Ohlms said. "These kids will leave summer camp with a book of healthy recipes to use at home."

Ohlms and her team, a group of two chefs, two educators and three aides, most of whom were Fontbonne students or alumni, built "camp cookery" into almost every day's camp schedule.

The chefs taught campers food science and safety, and the campers then had a hand in preparing, cooking and even presenting their homemade lunches.

"Every day, I would pick three children to present their dishes," said camp chef Jean Ann Mantia. "It was their favorite thing." She kept a stack of tablecloths and decorative serving wear on hand for the campers to display their culinary masterpieces. "I thought they should be involved in every aspect of their work. They chose the fabric, the height and the 'star of the show' for each meal."

This hands-on experience empowered the campers to try new flavors and remain open to different foods. They didn't always like what they tried, but for Ohlms and her team, the point was that they tried it.

"We had a sandwich with beef — well, I had chicken — peppers, onions and some type of leafy vegetable," wrote camper Ajay in the camp blog about lunch during Australia week. "And we had a salad with the best goat cheese ever, and something I had never tried before. Pine nuts!!!"

Throughout their travels, campers made and tasted foods like baba ghanoush, lamb patties, lettuce wraps, curry, and yes, pine nuts. They even convinced KSDK-TV reporter Heidi Glaus to visit camp, where she learned that veggies really can be delicious. Campers also participated in a Food Network-style cook-off, transforming family recipes into tasty, healthier versions. A sweet potato bread took top marks.

"My favorite part of campFRESHSM is when we get to cook our own lunch with Chef Karen," camper Emma wrote in the blog. "We get to cut most of our food ... and we get to try out a lot of cool new foods. Cooking in the kitchen is fun!"

Because the camp focused on overall health and well-being, campers also played sports, produced plays, took field trips and tried science experiments. On the last day of camp, the campers, their families and the camp staff rocked out to a performance by the Rockstar Nutritionist, Jill Jayne, who reminded everyone involved that it's cool to be healthy.

Next year, Ohlms plans to increase the capacity of the camp, add a garden that will supply the campers and the campus dining hall with fresh

vegetables, and help the campers understand the origins of the foods they eat.

"As a dietitian, it was extremely rewarding for me to see the campers prepare and taste foods that they might not otherwise have experienced at home," Ohlms said. "Better yet, they surprised themselves by enjoying the foods they prepared. What a great way to get kids to not just try new foods, but eat them too!"

Dery Personal Production by Elizabeth Hise Brennan

When Deanna Jent began writing her new play, "Falling," it started as an essay. The Fontbonne University theater professor felt uncomfortable writing her thoughts as a theatrical work, she said, because she didn't know how it would end. It is, after continuation. But it just wouldn't come together as an essay." all, based on her own life.

It turns out that the reason for her hesitation is the very same reason for the play's success. Performed by Mustard Seed Theatre, Fontbonne's in-residence theater company founded by Jent, "Falling" is a brief glimpse into the life of the Martin family, whose 17-year-old, fully-grown son has severe autism. And just like the lives of so many families of children with disabilities, the play offers no magic bullet, satisfactory resolution or even happy ending. What it does offer is honesty and an admission that life is made up of both pain and joy, often in unequal measure.



Jent and her husband, Steve, have three children: 20-yearold twins, Chris and Lindzey, and a 17-year-old son, Andy, who was diagnosed with severe autism at age 3. Like the family in "Falling," the Jents deal daily with the hurdles autism poses.

"We had a very challenging summer in 2010," Jent said, looking back at the play's beginnings. "There aren't a lot of summer programs appropriate for kids with severe autism. Andy had a lot of struggles that summer."

To relieve stress, Jent picked up a pen.

"I started writing, which is how I process and think about things," she said. "Ten years ago, I published a piece called 'Educating Andy,' and I thought this new draft would be a

After sharing a cup of coffee and receiving a little prodding from her colleague Jason Sommer, a Fontbonne English professor, Jent decided to try writing a play. In the new construct, the words with which she initially wrestled slipped easily into place, and encouragement from a playwright friend convinced her to truly commit to the project. A year after she began writing, Jent had drafted "Falling."

"Throughout the whole process, I worried that this was a story that would never mean anything to someone who didn't have a son with autism," she confessed. "But it also reflects universal truths; there are things we all struggle with. And people have responded to that."

The play initially opened Sept. 1 and was so successful during its first run that it was extended for another week. And then another. Reviews rolled in, all of them positive. After each performance, Jent and the director moderated discussions among the cast and the audience.


"Mustard Seed was founded to present plays that encourage dialogue. The discussion after every show of 'Falling' was amazing," Jent said. "All the discussions were different because of who was there — parents of kids with autism, teachers, and even people who were unfamiliar with the disorder but related through other experiences."

Although deftly acted and directed, the play itself wasn't always easy to watch. The Martin family — parents Tami and Bill, and their adolescent daughter Lisa — must deal with violent outbursts from Josh, who, at 17, is physically larger than his father. These outbursts make life at home not just unstable, but sometimes terrifying.

"I think people were grateful that I showed the truth in its humor and its despair," Jent admitted.

Since becoming a parent, she said, she has come to realize that life is messy. Parenthood can be challenging and rewarding, infuriating and exhilarating. And it can be hard, regardless of your children's abilities or disabilities. The play makes all of this evident and doesn't gloss over the ugly,

"My family is, in part, amazed that other people find their lives interesting," Jent mused. "I think their reactions to the



play mirror other families of children with autism. We're not the only people who struggle with these feelings."

Sometime next year, even more people will get a chance to experience "Falling," thanks to producer and St. Louis native Terry Schnuck, who was moved and impressed by the original production. He's in the process of taking Jent's play off-Broadway. While he rounds up financial backers and puts a business plan in place, Jent will have a seat at the table, helping to choose the director and cast, attending the occasional rehearsal and rewriting as needed. Next year,

But in Jent's mind, here in St. Louis, the play has already accomplished what she intended.

"I wanted the audience to leave the performance and not know what to do with it," she said. "Does this experience lead to more questions? Does it lead to research? Action? If enough people ask questions, action is the next step."

When you walk into [RE]FRESH on Brentwood Boulevard, it feels just like any other retail store targeting teens and young adults. The mannequins model stylish fashions, the visuals dazzle, and the professional staff greets you at the door. But [RE]FRESH isn't any other retail store. It's the latest initiative of the Foster & Adoptive Care Coalition (FACC) and it simultaneously benefits foster families, kids, teens, and the community — all in one space. It's a space that Fontbonne University students and faculty had a hand in developing, and it reflects the passion and talent of everyone involved.

The Coalition is a non-profit agency in St. Louis that recruits foster and adoptive families for children without permanent homes, then provides training, advocacy and support for those parents, families and children. Support comes in a variety of forms, including access to affordable necessities like clothing.

"Kids in foster care receive an average of just \$340 from the state of Missouri each year to purchase clothes," said Executive Director Melanie Scheetz. "One of our purposes is to support these kids and families. We've had a small resale shop (the KidStore) for a while, but it benefits only young children. [RE] FRESH is for teens and twenty-somethings."

About three years ago, Scheetz called Rogene Nelsen, director of Fontbonne's fashion merchandising program, looking for participants for a focus group related to the resale concept. A few students gladly volunteered.

A year later, Scheetz called again, looking for more input from students, so Nelsen built a focus group experience into her fashion promotion strategies class. Scheetz hosted a formal development meeting, bringing together her team with Nelsen's 15-student class. The meeting became a "designer's challenge" for the students, dividing them into three groups to brainstorm the concepts, and develop ideas about marketing, visual merchandising and store design. It was intense, Nelsen said.

"Their eyes were opened," she said. "This was the real thing. They were tasked with developing a store out of these concepts in only 15 minutes, then presenting their ideas to the group."

While it was daunting, according to Nelsen, the professionalism of the situation was not lost on the fashion merchandising majors. "They came back and told me they felt so empowered," she said.

Jessica Duco '11 (left), a Fontbonne fashion merchandising graduate, and Jen Frey MM '08, worked closely together to organize, manage and run the opening of the new Brentwood resale store.

One of the students was Jessica Duco, a fashion merchandising major from Belleville, Ill., who loved fashion, but hated to see her barely used clothes end up in just another resale bin.

"We were all part of the store's target market, and came together as a class to discuss what we liked and what worked," said the 24-year-old, who would go on to intern with the resale store. "So much of what we suggested came true."

Next, Nelsen brought in Angie Dowell, another Fontbonne fashion merchandising instructor, who used the real-life space as a basis for a semester-long project in her store planning and visual merchandising strategies class.

"Everything we did that semester dealt with the store concept," Dowell explained. "The students built the profile of the store's target market and went to the location and took measurements. It was creative, but it was also a very analytical process. They came up with a layout and floor plan, and developed signage and fixturing."

Armed with binders and blueprints, the students made formal presentations to Scheetz and her team, which included store director and Fontbonne alumna Jennifer Frey MM '08, introducing the images, pricing, measurements and research they had gathered.

"So many of the ideas permeated what we have done here," Scheetz said. "Having touchpoints with our target audience was so important."

Frey, an experienced retail professional, couldn't say enough about the collaboration — and about the quality of the

Fontbonne students involved.

"They provided ideas about store traffic, color schemes, different ways to present merchandise, and all from the perspective of our target audience," she said. "Their professionalism was extremely impressive."

[RE]FRESH celebrated its grand opening on August 20th, and although it's an attractive space, its beauty isn't found solely in its design and layout. The finished store is an allencompassing collection of community service, recycling, advocacy, fashion and support.

"I love the fact that [RE]FRESH gives back," said Duco, who graduated from Fontbonne in May 2011. "Even people with busy lives find time to volunteer here and give."

While [RE]FRESH is a place where foster teens can purchase inexpensive clothing, it also provides them with opportunities to become associates, receive job training and develop professional skills. Teens have a community space where they hang out, host birthday or sweet 16 parties, and take comfort in a supportive environment. [RE]FRESH also accepts all used clothing donations, but only sells higher quality pieces, then finds new homes for items it doesn't use. And the space was created using donated or found items — lighting, fixtures, lockers and even the cashier's table.

"It's been like a community barn-raising; everyone has come to the table with something to offer, including Fontbonne," said Scheetz. "In addition to being a gift to the agency, Fontbonne's input is a gift to the teens with whom we work. I wish I could adequately describe how thrilled they are to be here. They own it."

When Monsanto asked Bill Wester to return to college and get his degree in biology, he looked to his wife, Maggi, for guidance. She had attended Fontbonne as an adult and graduated in 1980 with a degree in business management. Seeing how happy his wife had been with her education, and after speaking with the science department about the benefits of their program, Bill happily enrolled.

Maggi's reasons for returning to school were very different from Bill's. She had a good job as an administrative assistant for A.G. Edwards, but she always regretted not getting her degree. When she received a small inheritance, she decided a college education would be the best way to use the money.

"I wanted my parents to be proud of me," she said. "I felt a void not having my college degree."

Maggi quit her job and started taking classes at Fontbonne. "I shopped around a little when I was looking," she said. "But Fontbonne was the most accommodating and genuine. I truly appreciated the spiritual background that Fontbonne offers, too." Bill agreed with Maggi's assessment.

"They gave me credit for my work experience, which was very helpful," he said. Bill also learned firsthand how valuable small classes are. "Some of my classes only had two people. The nearly one-on-one attention was very beneficial in my more difficult courses, like biochemistry."

In addition to their core classes, both Maggi and Bill took electives that allowed them to discover new passions. Bill particularly enjoyed his photography class. "Each student had a key to the dark room, so I could go any time I wanted," he recalled. He also appreciated that his professor was a recent Fontbonne graduate. This reinforced the sense of community and commitment that alumni invest in the university.

Bill graduated in 1983. The day after he received his


diploma, Monsanto promoted him to research biologist and handed him a bonus check. "It's what I'd always wanted to be," he said. "I had finally gotten there. It wouldn't have happened without Fontbonne."

Maggi also feels that her time at Fontbonne greatly affected the rest of her life. "I often tell people that going to Fontbonne is the nicest thing I ever did for myself. I improved my self-esteem and had great pride in my success when I was finished."

Today, the Westers live on the Mississippi River in Golden Eagle, Ill. Bill, now retired, keeps himself busy by restoring his 1988 Buick Reatta. They enjoy traveling the country to show the classic car when Maggi has free time from her job as an estate planner. Things have changed since each experienced Fontbonne, but they have never forgotten all they gained as students.

To commemorate these experiences and to ensure future generations will also receive the quality education they cherish to this day, the Westers have decided to give to Fontbonne in the form of a Legacy Gift. "We never had any children, and when we discussed how we'd like to divide our estate, it seemed natural to give part to the university," Bill said.

"The people we met and the university's ever-present spirituality have enriched our lives incredibly," Maggi added. "We feel this is an appropriate way to give back and to express our deep appreciation."

Distinguished Service In Education





Henderson has earned the recognition of a Founders Award.



Father Kavanaugh, a professor of philosophy at St. Louis University, founded the university's Ethics Across the Curriculum Program and is the author of numerous books, among them "Following Christ in a Consumer Society" and "Human Identity and the Ethics of Killing."

For his columns in AMERICA magazine, the Catholic Press Association in 2003 honored him as Best Regular Columnist. The judges stated: "Father Kavanaugh examines public issues through a moral lens and discusses them thoughtfully and powerfully. . . . Tough minded, articulate, on point, Father Kavanaugh asks disturbing questions that demand careful thought about the meaning of the Gospel."

In addition to writing, speaking and preaching, he composes contemporary music, performs Irish music and has reviewed movies for a major local newspaper.

He is currently collaborating with a French physician in the preparation of a paper on medical ethics. Among his off-campus activities, Father Kavanaugh worked with the disabled in L'Arche communities and with Mother Teresa at her Home for the Dying in Calcutta.

He said of himself in an interview, "The greatest achievement for my teaching would be if, because of their stay here at Saint Louis U., my students are more inclined to be people of hope. More inclined to be open to love. More inclined to faith, not only in God, but in the human person."

For all he has done, Father Kavanaugh is a worthy recipient of a Founders Award.


Distinguished Service To The Deaf Community



The Journey to Grad School— by Elizabeth Hise Brennan Not Always An Easy One

Berlanty Azzam has traveled a long way to attend graduate school. Currently working on a Master of Business Administration degree at Fontbonne University, the 23-year-old began her educational journey at Bethlehem University, a Catholic institution located in Bethlehem in the West Bank near her native Gaza, Palestine. But because of the political and military forces at work in the area, she was denied access to

Bethlehem — and her studies — two months prior to her graduation in 2009.

Here in St. Louis, Dr. Dennis Golden. president of Fontbonne University, heard of Azzam's plight through Brother Jack Curran, FSC, Ph.D., vice president of development at Bethlehem University. Golden said he respects the university for its mission and commitment to providing education for Muslim and Christian students alike. On Azzam's behalf, Golden sent a letter petitioning for her return to

Bethlehem and to her studies. His letter was joined by similar efforts of supporters around the globe, as well as human rights organizations garnering attention and support for Azzam's cause. Ultimately, however, the Israeli High Court denied her appeal, and she could not return to Bethlehem University.

Azzam has spent the past two years telling her story, speaking out about the importance of access to education and freedom of movement. She has a right, she says, to obtain an education, whether locally or abroad, as do other Palestinians. "After my case, I couldn't choose my university and my

country," she said. "I want to send the message that, as Palestinians, we are human. We have the right to choose where and what to learn."

In spite of great obstacles, Azzam remained hopeful. Bethlehem University worked with her and allowed her to complete her studies and earn her bachelor's degree remotely in the spring of 2010. In that same year, after many false

stops and starts, she received permission to travel to the United States. And it was in St. Louis, at the home of Vincent and Judy Shaw, supporters of Azzam's, where she met Golden and began the next chapter in her life.

"At the beginning, there were difficulties, because English is my second language," she said. "But I'm comfortable now. The people here are so good. The day I arrived, everyone was so friendly. I feel like it's my home."

The university has welcomed her with open arms,

said Golden, but that's the nature — and the mission — of Fontbonne and its founders, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet, who "serve the dear neighbor without distinction."

"God works in mysterious ways," Golden said. "Berlanty is a young woman who has encountered extreme circumstances, and we have the opportunity and the responsibility to help provide her graduate education. Like Bethlehem University, she's a beacon of home for students in the Holy Land and beyond as she develops into a leader to serve a world in need."






