Miduri

Shigehisa Karimata*

In the Ryukyuan language, *miduri* is a word that expresses the transformation from a seed to a sprouting shoot, from a tight bud to the blossoming of spring. Even a great tree, with its spreading branches and leaves, beautiful flowers in bloom, and abundant fruits, begins from the small *miduri* that sprouted from a seed.

Sho Iku (1813–1847), a king of the Ryukyu Kingdom, composed a $ry\bar{u}ka$, a traditional Ryukyuan song in short poem form, about the *miduri* that sprouted in winter, which before long would spread its leaves and branches to become a great tree.

The snow covered pine
Anticipates spring
Miduri sprouting
These miduri will soon flourish for eternity
