Grant Funding Helps Launch Education & Outreach Efforts

Lalor, Cattawamteak and PVHA Funds support plans for Aroostook, Washington - and Penobscot Counties

Recent foundation support has enabled the Center's Education and Outreach Program to provide information and resources that will help women make their own choices. Offering educational services in both traditional and webbased formats creates a new twist to our longheld belief that informed decision-making is the key to good decision-making.

In February, we welcomed our first full-time Education and Outreach Coordinator, Jessica Carter. Funding for Jessica's role was originally provided by the Thomas H. Maren Foundation in 2008. More recently, the Center has secured funding for needs assessment and educational programming in Maine's most rural areas. The first grant in 2009 of \$23,000 came from the Anna Lalor Burdick Program to be used to expand reproductive and sexual health programming for young women in Aroostook and Washington Counties. The purpose of the Lalor funding is ambitious: to reverse the eight-year upward trend in unintended pregnancies, with a special focus on outreach education for women under the age of 25.

Mabel Wadsworth Center proposed similar plans for Penobscot County to the Maine Community Foundation (MCF). Two separate grants received from MCF will help launch our education and outreach efforts, including \$11,820 from the Penobscot Valley Health Association (PVHA) and \$7,190 from the Catawamteak Fund of Maine. PVHA has been especially helpful in the creation of Mabel's Back-Up Pack©, a birth control and information kit inside an attractive and fun "SafeSax" clutch. (To get your Back Up Pack©, please see related story on page 2.)

The Catawamteak Fund of Maine is a MCF donor-advised fund whose gift will help build membership of Mabel's Maine Frame. Mabel's Maine Frame is free and open to anyone interested in learning more about reproductive rights and other issues affecting women's health. The Maine Frame is based online via

Q: What does a sex toy party have to do with Mabel's mission?

A: A lot! The Center held its very first sex toy party fundraiser in June, and the event was a success on several fronts. Invitations were sent via email and posted online, through Mabel's new Facebook page and Mabel's Maine Frame. The results were more than we hoped for: we welcomed many new faces as well as familiar friends in the crowd of attendees.

Mabel's Sex Toy Party featured a lot of laughter, education and fun. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, including a number of requests for another party before the holidays. (See sidebar).

As part of celebrating 25 years of caring and advocating for Maine women, 25% of the retail sales from the event came back to Mabel Wadsworth Women's Health Center. Many thanks to our Athena's "Goddess," Jessica; the evening of fun and information garnered a \$750 donation to the Center!

The party raised a lot of interest and funds but also raised questions about why Mabel Wadsworth Center would host a sex toy party. The short answer: a sex toy party is a mission-based educational event. "Knowledge about our bodies and our sexuality" is the first line in the vision statement of Mabel Wadsworth Women's Health Center. A woman's comfort level in talking and learning about sexuality and sexual health has a huge impact on her ability to take control of her sexual and reproductive life.

So, why a sex toy party? To share accurate information about sex and sex toys and provide a safe, welcoming atmosphere to talk about our sexual lives. Not to mention, this sex toy party

was nothing near groundbreaking or new! Vibrators are now "nearly as common an appliance in American households as the drip coffee maker or toaster oven" according to an article in the *New York Times* published on June 28, 2009. A national study completed by Indiana University and recently published in the academic, peer-reviewed *Journal of Sexual Medicine* states that 46.3 percent of women ages 45-60 report having used a vibrator at some point in their lives, compared to 59.5 percent of women between the ages of 23 to 44 and 32.7 percent of women who are 18-22 years old. This same study found that women who had used a vibrator in the last month scored higher on sexual pleasure scales that measured arousal, orgasm and lubrication function than those who had never used one. Another interesting finding from this study was that the more educated a woman is, the more likely she is to use a vibrator. Lesson learned? Women are using sex toys and having better sexual experiences as a result!

Creating an open, safe and fun space for women to talk about sex was the primary goal for Mabel's first sex toy party. Education about safe sex and anatomy was also included in the Center's recipe for a proper sex toy party, along with chocolate, wine and good laughs!

In addition to the written evaluations, the verbal testimony about the impact of this event was inspiring. The fact the we hosted a sex toy party opened up a conversation in many lunchrooms, kitchens, coffee shops and bedrooms, regardless of whether women attended or not. Opening those communication lines and helping women to take charge of their sexual and reproductive lives is exactly what Mabel Wadsworth Center is all about. 

The capital campaign began with a feasibility study in late 2005, and officially got underway in 2006. In June of last year, the Center declared victory, over goal and under the deadline for purchasing its new home in Evergreen Woods. In total, the capital campaign garnered \$1,333,249 from 337 donors, making it possible for the Center to own its own facility and realize a cost savings of \$60,000 per year!
