Vision for the Study:

 Create a plan through an inclusive process that identifies current and future collection needs on campus. With creative solutions help meet these needs.

Goals:

- 1. Improve the visibility of campus special collections
 - identify stakeholders for an Ad-Hoc Master Plan Committee on Collections
 - gather information on all campus special collections
 - develop a website map that identifies campus special collections and facilitates access to information about the collections
- 2. Assist the Libraries in future planning for off-site collections management
 - develop a database of campus academic collections that identifies location, content and size of the collections
- 3. Identify the special collections that are candidates for inclusion in public spaces across campus

UMass Definitions – Collection, Curator, Curate

Definition of COLLECTION - noun

An accumulation of objects gathered by UMass faculty and/or staff and used in support of the University's mission of teaching, research, and public outreach

Definition of CURATOR - noun

A keeper or custodian of a UMass collection

Definition of CURATE – transitive verb

To select, organize and look after the items in a collection or exhibition in a manner that supports the University's mission.


Collections Survey Methodology


- Campus Planning worked with Dubois Libraries Special Collections to define the survey metadata
- Collected description and contact data for each collection
- Collections are organized by:
 - Name of the main collection
 - Name of the sub-collection (primary and secondary)
 - Categories of materials stored
 - Types of Use
 - The type of equipment used to store the collection
 - Frequency of Use
 - Volume and Area










Collections Survey: Material Categories





Challenges


- Physical and digital accessibility of objects and documents

Campus as Museum



Hubs – foci for teaching, research, accessibility to most-needed items, modest display space for public outreach

Satellite exhibitions – rotating exhibits that focus on campus-wide interdisciplinary themes

Minimum impact on facilities and opportunity to gain space in the center of campus.


Master Plan Strategies

- Identify opportunities to display our extensive collections as we build out the campus and implement planned growth
- Integrate accommodation for collections as we undertake academic and space programming for specific departments and programs
- Study the feasibility of a common storage and management facility for campus collections
- Identify leader for "Campus as Museum" effort

Campus Collections Coordinator

- Lead the development of a vision and goals for the "Campus as Museum" with the help of the Collections Advisory Committee
- Promote the "Campus as Museum" on and off campus
- Lead the development and oversee installation of historic and interdisciplinary satellite exhibitions
- Broaden campus collections reputation as liaison to government agencies, donors, alumni & general public
- Garner resources for collections as a whole
- Identify cross-disciplinary funding opportunities & help position individual collections to apply for grants & contracts
- Serve as public spokesperson for the collective efforts of campus collections
