APHIDS OF CURLEW VALLEY

A preliminary survey of the terrestrial arthropods of Curlew Valley, Box Elder County, Utah, and Oneida County, Idaho, was undertaken during 1969. Information secured on insects of this area was supplemented by a large amount of field survey and many specimens in the U.S.U. Insect Collection. An intensive ecological study of the desert breeding areas of the sugar beet leafhopper, Circulifer tenellus (Baker), was conducted by the writer, much of it in Curlew Valley, particularly from 1924 through 1937. A great many aphid collections were made during those years, and since, due to my special interest in the aphid fauna of Utah and the western region. Aphid records from the Utah portion of Curlew Valley are scattered through more than twenty publications. Most important of these is M. A. Palmer's "Aphids of the Rocky Mountain Region", 1952, The Thomas Say Foundation, Vol. 5, 452 pages. Two of the species of aphids here recorded were originally described from Curlew Valley.

The writer is especially indebted to Dr. Clyde F. Smith for his helpful suggestions concerning current names of genera and species, and for his cooperation over the years with particular regard to our earlier studies of "Capitophorus" aphids of Artemisia and Chrysothamnus. Localities: Utah localities in Curlew Valley, Box Elder County portion, include Cedar Creek, Cedar Hill, Curlew Junction, Deep Creek, Hansel Mountains, Hardup, Kelton (old townsite), Kelton Pass, Kosmo (old salt plant), Locomotive Springs, Rose Ranch, Snowville, and Wildcat Hills. Idaho localities in Oneida County included Black Pine, Curlew National Grasslands, Curlew Valley Reservoir, Holbrook, Holbrook Summit, Juniper, Ireland Canyon, Rock Creek, Spring Hills, Stone, "Stone Reservoir" more properly named Curlew Valley Reservoir, and Twin Springs to Roy Summit.
