

Demographic Differences in Coping Self-Efficacy, Social Support, and Legal Advocate Satisfaction Sexual Assault Victims

Post-sexual assault interactions with the legal system are an additional source of stress (Bolin, 1982). Legal advocates provide support to help individuals have more positive interactions with the legal system and cope with future stressors, which can decrease psychological symptoms (Benight & Bandura, 2004; Campbell, 2006; Catalano, 2009).

METHOD

Participants: 48 individuals who experienced sexual assault; primarily adult, Caucasian, and sexual majorities

Sampling Procedure:

- Complete packet of measures at three different time points
- Available in paper, by SMS text, or a link via an e-mail address (English or Spanish)

Research Design:

- Recommended Sample Size: 15 per group
- Independent t-tests using SPSS Statistics v26

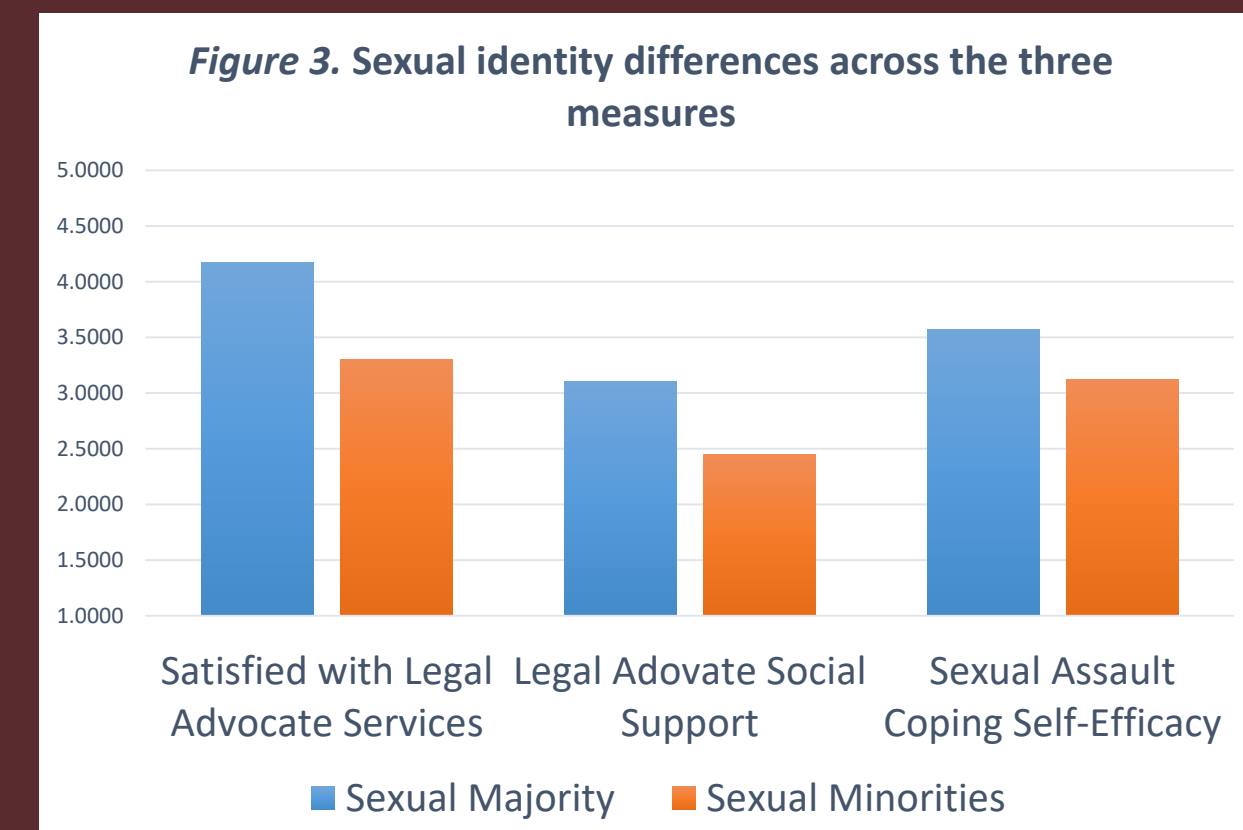
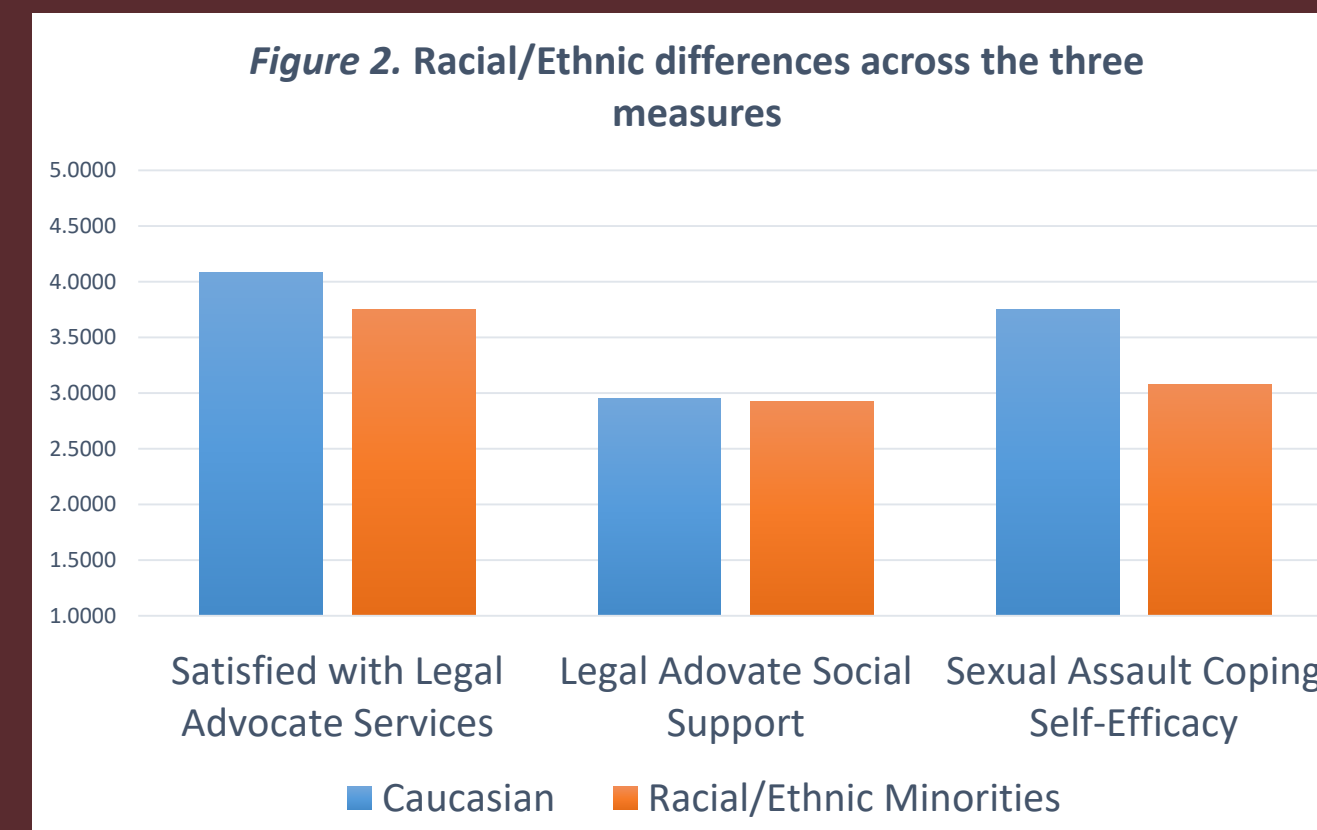
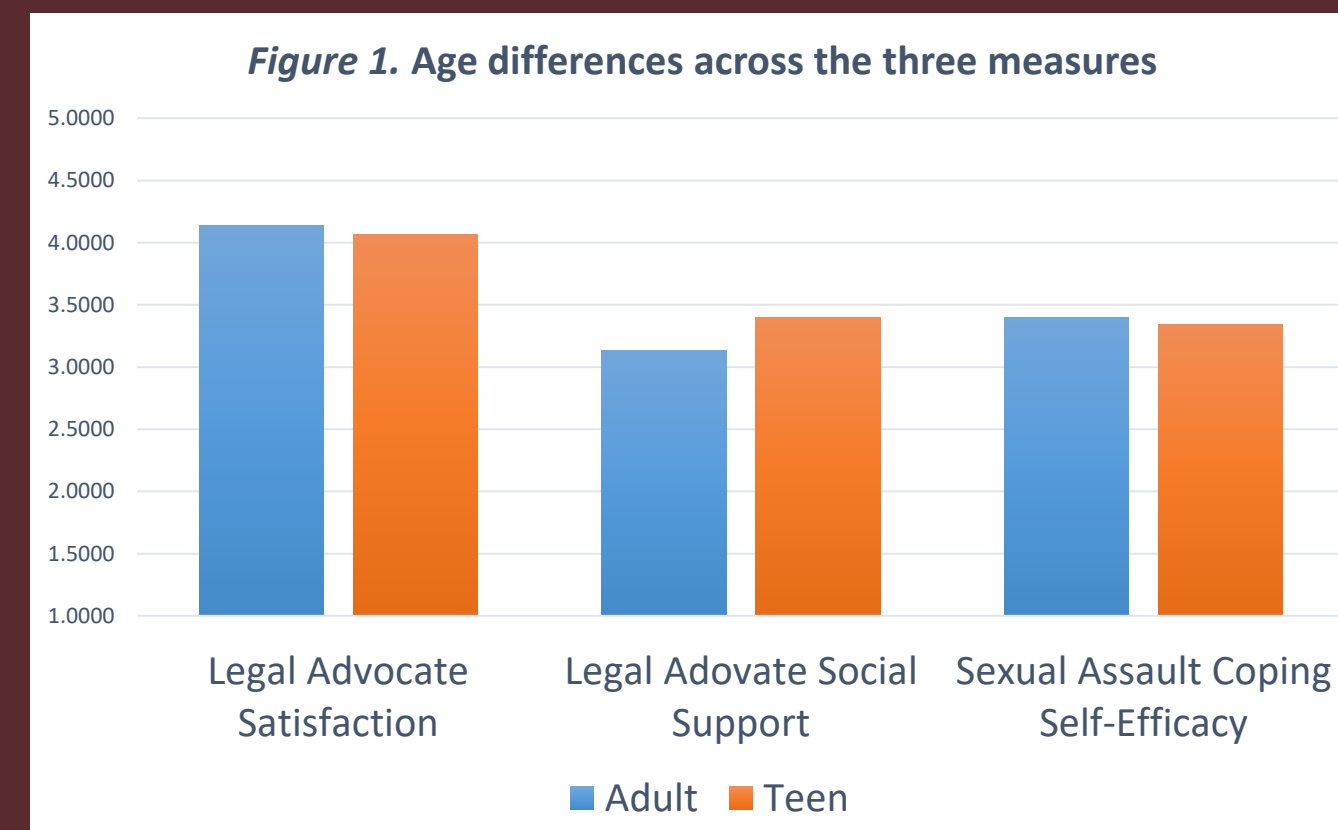
MEASURES & COVARIATES

Legal Advocacy Services Satisfaction Survey (Gibbs, Agatonovic, & Bikos, 2011): 11-item measure assessing satisfaction with legal advocacy services on a 1 (*Not at all*) to 5 (*To a very great extent*) scale. Alpha = 0.95.

Racial/ethnic minority clients had less coping self-efficacy; sexual minority clients were less satisfied with legal advocacy services.

MEASURES & COVARIATES (cont.)

Sexual Assault Coping Self-Efficacy Measure (Benight, Harding-Taylor, Midboe, & Durham, 2004): 19-item measure assessing confidence in their ability cope on a 1 (*Completely Incapable*) to 5 (*Completely Capable*) scale. Alpha = 0.98.

Modified Inventory of Socially Supported Behaviors (Barrera, Sandler, & Ramsay, 1981): 15-item measure assessing perceived legal advocate social support on a 1 (*Not at all*) to 5 (*About every day*) scale. Alpha = 0.98.

DISCUSSION

Implications: Address treatment disparities/institutional racism and provide culturally sensitive resources

- Learn about the areas of growth and identify training goals to legal advocates

Limitations: Uneven group size, small sample size/underpowered, and self-selection bias
