Warrant for Town Meeting, 1913

TO PERCY E. WOODMAN, A CONSTABLE OF THE TOWN OF SCARBORO IN THE COUNTY OF CUMBERLAND—
GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Scarboro, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town House in said Town, on the third (3rd) day of March, 1913, at ten (10) o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following Articles, viz:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose a Clerk, Selectmen, Assessors. Overseers of the Poor, Collector, Treasurer, one member of the School Board, Road Commissioner or Commissioners, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the town will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools, schoolhouse repairs and supplies, text books and appliances, the poor, repair of roads and bridges, expense of brown tail moths, rental of hydrants at Pine Point, and to defray all other town charges.

Article 4. To see if the town will accept and adopt the report of the several town officers.

Article 5. To see what compensation the town will 0 1 3/4 vote its Collector for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see what compensation the town will vote its Road Commissioner or Commissioners, per day, for the ensuing year.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the Free High School for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to meet the expense of breaking roads.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to furnish a police officer at Prout's Neck, and raise a sum of money for the same.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for decorating soldiers' graves, and for Memorial purposes.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909, relative to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State aid for highways for the year 1913.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for the care of roads and bridges, the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), being an amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter \$500. 112 of the Laws of Maine for the year 1907, as amended by Chapter 69, Public Laws of 1909.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to repair the road from near the house of Stephen A. Lyons to the foot of the hill near the house of P George H. Leonard.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to accept the list of jurors as prepared by the Selectmen, Treasurer and Town Clerk.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and eight dollars (\$108) for street 7 kg lights (electric) at Durstan.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to purchase and equip the hydrants at Pine Point with hose, and raise/50, money for the same. On petition of B. A. Baker and 20 others.

Article 17. To see if the town will raise a sum of money to gravel the Jones and Hunnewell roads, so called. 200, By request.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the purpose of installing flush closets in Oak Hill school house.

Article 19. To see if the town will grant the use of the Town hall to the Scarboro Athletic Club.

Article 20. To see what action the town will take in regard to letting the Scarboro Athletic Club install electric flights in the Town hall.

Article 21. To consider the question of the discontinuance of a certain town highway leading from the Spurwink road, so called, through the land of the Reuben Libby heirs, to an arm of the Spurwink river, known as Libby's Creek. On petition of H. C. Munsey and nine others.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to repair the S. Manson Libby road. By request.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make a contract with the York Light and Heat Co., to establish and maintain electric lights in that part of the town known as Pine Point. On petition of B. A. Baker and 34 others.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended in blasting ledges and general repair of Spurwink goad, from the Black Point road to the Spurwink River bridge. On petition of C. C. Mitchell and seven others.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to build sidewalks on Ocean Avenue at Higgins Beach.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars for Street Lights at Higgins Beach. By request.

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to abate the tax on the K. of P. Hall.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended in repairing and oiling the road, beginning at the land of Ira C. Foss and extending on Black Point road, so far as the money so voted will repair and oil.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars, (\$300,) to be expended in extending the gravel sidewalk at Pine Point, commencing 3 at a point where the gravel walk now ends and extending the same to the Boston and Maine R. R., Western division at Pine Point station.

Article 30. To see if the town will vote to complete the graveling of the new roal at Pine Point, formerly known as Back street, and raise a sum of money for same. On petition of P. E. Woodman and others.

Article 31. To see if the town will vote, raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the purpose of installing electric lights in the highway, between Oak Hill and Prout's Neck. Lights to begin at southerly end of said highway, provided that the Cumber- 500, land County Power and Light Co. runs a power line to Prout's Neck.

Article 32. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) to complete the payment on the Soldiers' Monument, now in process of construction.

Article 33. To see if the town will authorize the Scarboro Monument Association to erect upon the Village Green Lot, so called, at West Scarboro, a monument in memory of the soldiers and sailors from the town of Scarboro, who gave their lives for the Union.

Article 34. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to reimburse Charles F. Libby for damage to automobile, on the Spurwink road. By request.

Article 35. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to assist Ellsworth Lothrop in moving his house from the highway at Pine Point, Back street,

Article 36. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to be expended for repair of Fogg road. By request.

Article 37. To see if the town will vote a sum of money to be expended on the road between the West Scar- 400 boro station B. & M. R. R., and the house of Noah Pillsbury. By request.

Article 38. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum

of money to be expended on the road leading from North Scarboro to the Westbrook town line. By request.

Article 39. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the Buxton road from the Sorham line to the Westbrook line. By request.

Article 40. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Town Treasurer, until otherwise ordered, to include in his accounts all tax deeds (at par value) in his possession and also publish in his Annual Report, a detailed list of such deeds. Also to notify on or before May 1st, annually, all owners of property affected by such tax deeds, that such claims are so held.

Article 41. To see if the town will vote to confer authority to quit the town's claims to property upon which tax deeds have been settled.

Article 42. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to hire money if necessary.

Article 43. To see if the town will vote to accept the road as laid out by the Selectmen, upon petition of James W. Green and others, and raise a sum of money for the same.


