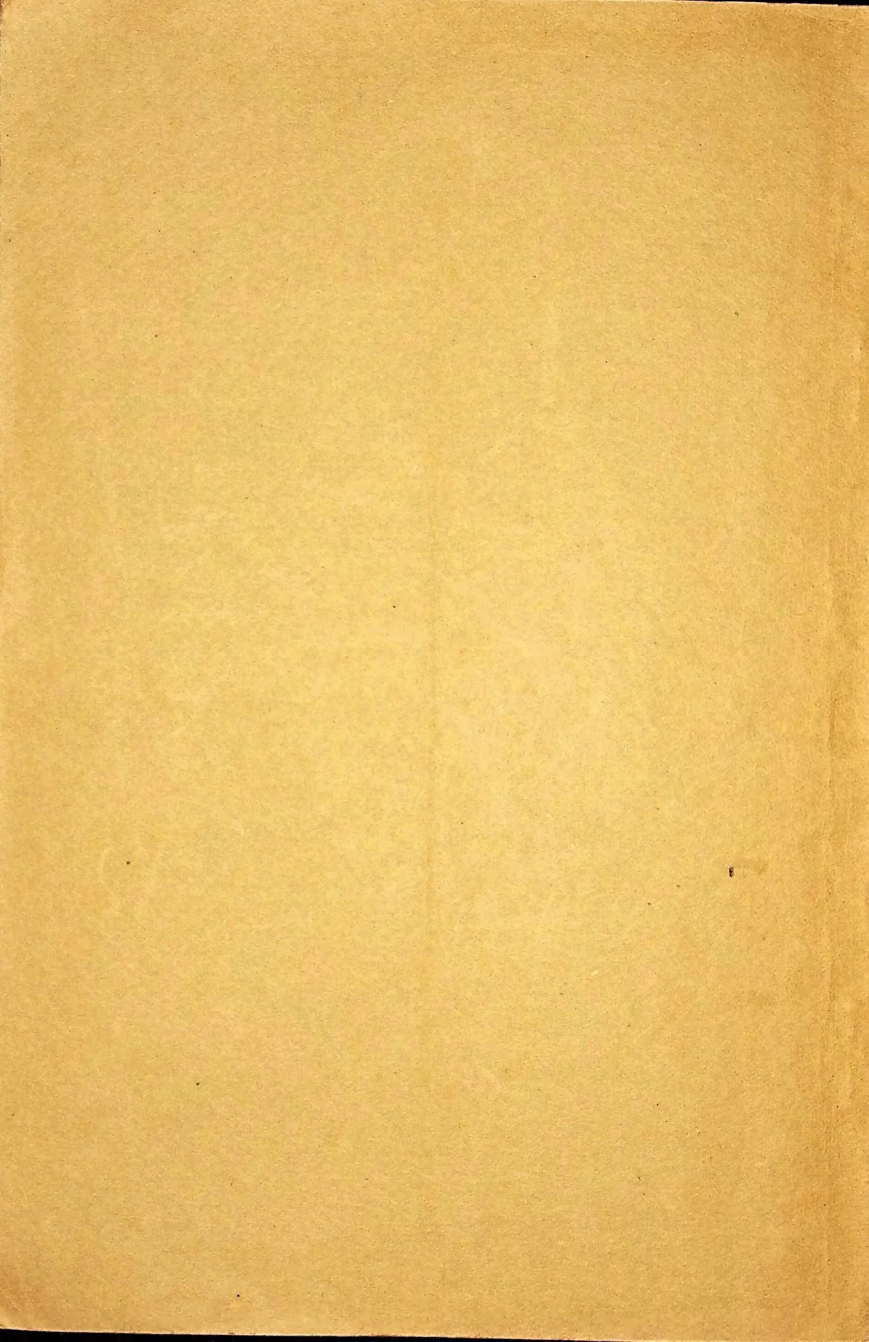

School Report for 1911

To the Citizens of Scarborough:

I take pleasure in submitting the following report of your public schools for the year ending February 10th, 1912.

It has never been my privilege to work with a better corps of teachers. In the introduction of the course of study and in grading the schools, I have had the hearty co-operation of all the teachers, who have been untiring in their efforts to carry out my plans.

Teachers and pupils have taken a lively interest in the ranking of each school and have attained commendable success.

Nearly all of the schools have made records of which we can justly be proud. Out of 504 scholars between the ages of 5 and 21, 315 attended the fall term, with the very large average of 273. There were 97 pupils who were not absent one half day. Several schools averaged over 90 per cent of the whole number for the long term of fourteen weeks. The deportment of all the schools except three was perfect; *i. e.* the Superintendent could spend a full half day in them and observe nothing of a disorderly nature.

The largest number in any school not absent one half day was 19, the smallest number 2.

Your Superintendent has tried to co-operate with the State Superintendent and other leading educators of the State in employing only trained or experienced teachers.

The time draws near when only such will be employed. The State puts large sums of money into our three Normal schools, and no teacher should expect to be employed without taking advantage of this special training for her special work. Anybody can hear lessons, but no one can *teach* without learning how.

The work in the High School building has been of an exceptionally high order. These teachers all, from the Primary grade up to the High school, deserve the highest terms of commendation for careful, efficient work.

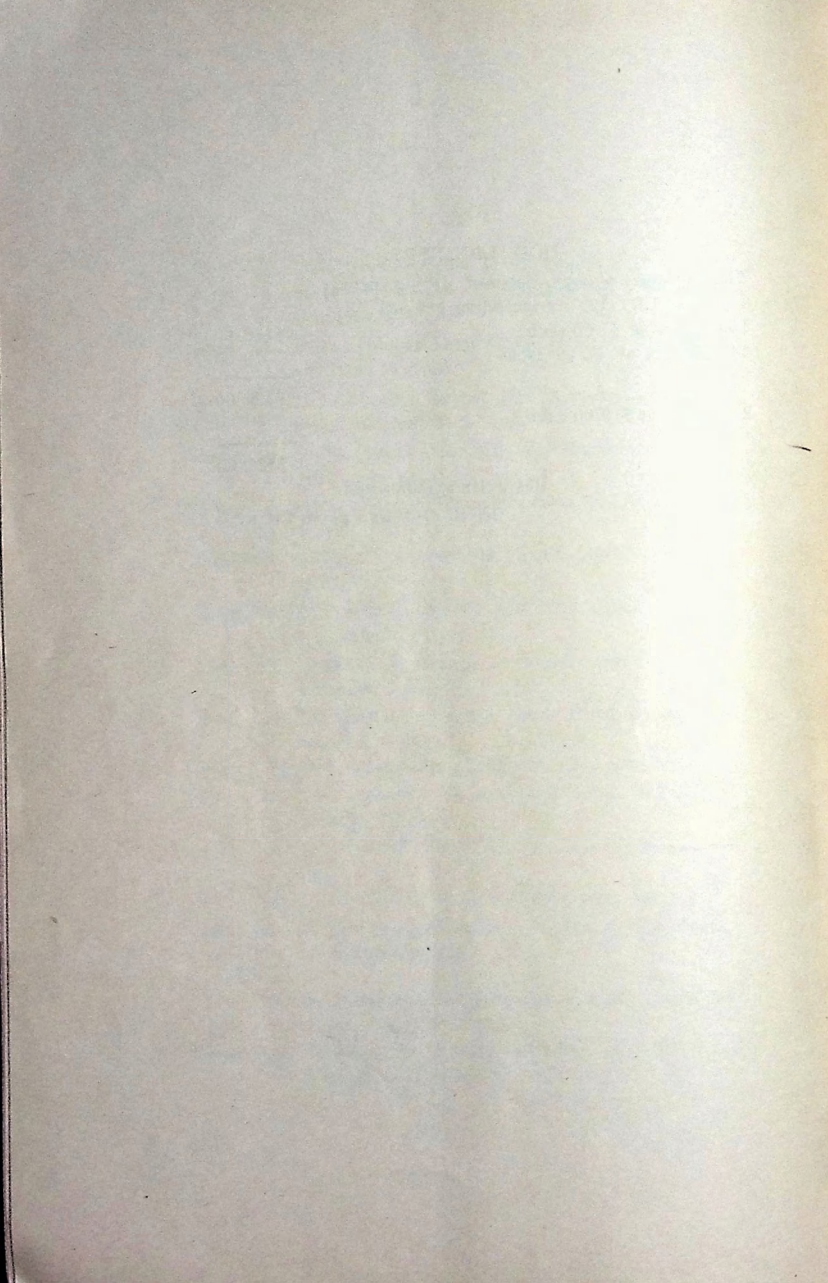

TO PERCY E. WOODMAN, A CONSTABLE IN THE TOWN
OF SCARBORO— GREETING:
