Love Songs is David Rousseve's exploration of timeless notions of love - a theatrical portrayal of the term

"bittersweet" that juxtaposes the unabashed romanticism and triumphs of love stories with the harshness of everyday reality. Using lush, romantic music of composers such as Puccini, Chopin, and Wagner and love stories from differing eras and cultures, Love Songs follows the lives of two enslaved Africans in the United States and stories from contemporary life. Ultimately, Love Songs will be a dialogue on hope that centers on the loss of - and quest to return - love, compassion, and spirituality to contemporary urban society. Love Songs is performed by David Rousseve/Reality and a D.C.-based cast of twenty area performers and non-performers. One of the most acclaimed dance-theater director and choreographers to emerge this decade, David Rousseve founded Reality in 1988 to perform his unique blend of dance-theater which fuses African American traditional and popular culture with postmodern dance and performance art. "Part of my company's artistic agenda is to create a dialogue with as many communities as possible, both on and off stage, by using African American culture to speak on universal issues of the heart," explains Rousseve. Individual company members are distinguished by a wide range of backgrounds, from hip hop to modern, to African, to ballet. It is a company that ultimately finds humanism lies in pluralism rather than homogeneity.
