DATE OF ANNUAL MEETING

Every once in a while some member voices disapproval of our meeting dates, that one is too early, that another is too late, so let your choice be known with your reason, without delay to your president who will give it his due consideration, to the end that he may make a recommendation to the Executive Committee.
