

Judge Kneeshaw of the District Bench is the oldest trial judge in United States in point of serivce. He was present on April 11th, 1942, at a meeting of the Order of the Coif held in the Rvan Hotel in Grand Forks at which Howard G. Fuller of Fargo, former commissioner of the Supreme Court of South Dakota. delivered a fine address upon the Norris LaGuardia Labor Act and matters of public relations with labor under the law of this act. Judge Kneeshaw recently returned from California where he visited with friends and relatives. Judge Kneeshaw will be eighty-eight years old on May 5th next, and he should be honored for the wonderful record he has made of service upon the trial bench in North Dakota.
